

CBSE: AN OVERVIEW



The Central Board of Secondary Education CBSE) is a National Board of School Education in India under the aegis of the Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India headed by Chairperson, CBSE. The Secretary (School Education and Literacy), MoE is the Controlling Authority. The Board caters to a heterogeneous category of schools from Private (Independent) to Government, Government aided, Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs), Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas (JNVs) and Central Tibetan schools affiliated in India and in other countries.

The Board has developed and expanded significantly from the year 1929 (which was then named as the 'Board of High School and Intermediate Education, Rajputana) to reach to its present status. In the year 1952, the Board was given its present name "Central Board of Secondary Education". It was in the year 1962 that the Board was reconstituted.

The Board has grown at a rapid pace over the years and its present jurisdiction stretches beyond the national geographical boundaries. From 309 schools in 1962, CBSE being a pioneer Board of the country, has now a pan-India and International presence with more than 27,000 schools affiliated in India and in other countries located in the West and the Middle East Asia, South East Asia, North East Asia, Africa and Europe.

In order to execute its functions effectively, Regional Offices have been set up by the Board in different parts of the country. To be more responsive to the affiliated schools, the Board has 17 Regional Offices & CoEs located at Ajmer, Bengaluru, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Chandigarh, Chennai, Dehradun, Delhi (East), Delhi (West), Guwahati, Noida, Panchkula, Patna, Prayagraj, Pune, Thiruvananthapuram and Vijayawada locations.

The CBSE Headquarter constantly monitors the activities of the Regional Offices. Although, sufficient powers have been vested within Regional Offices, issues involving policy matters are, however, referred to the Headquarter. However, matters pertaining to day-to-day administration, liaison with schools, pre and post examination arrangements are all dealt with by the respective Regional Offices.

Vision & Mission

CBSE envisions a robust, vibrant and holistic school education that may engender excellence in every sphere of human endeavour. The Board is committed to provide quality education to promote intellectual, social and cultural vivacity among its learners. It works towards evolving a learning process and environment, which empowers the future citizens to become global

leaders in the emerging knowledge society. The Board advocates and pledges to provide a stressfree learning environment that may develop competent, confident, and enterprising citizens who promote harmony and peace.

The Board is given the mandate;


- To develop curriculum and syllabi for the purpose of Board Examinations.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Calendar of Student Enrichment Activities 2023

CBSE released the month-wise calendar of the student enrichment activities planned for the year 2023 for the schools. Schools have been advised to ensure the participation of each student in at least two-three activities during the year as per their interest and report participation details on CBSE ASAR App. This year, to mark 75 years of India's Independence, CBSE aligned all its Student Enrichment Activities with the theme of *Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat*, G-20 and Mission Lifestyle for Environment (LIFE) programmes of Govt. of India.

Observance of Road Safety Week under "Swachhata Pakhwada" 2023

The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways organized Road Safety Week from 11 - 17 January 2023. Schools organized Road Safety activities, training, workshops, seminars, etc. and staff during Road Safety Week.





Cyber Awareness Campaign – 'Stay Safe Online'

CBSE shared details of the Cyber Awareness campaign 'Stay Safe Online' with its affiliated schools. The objective of the campaign was to raise awareness among various user groups on the safe use of social media platforms, informed usage of digital payment, and the internet across India through quizzes, drawing competitions, slogan writing competitions, debates, etc till November 2023. Total **117 Schools** submitted the report.





Launch of CBSE's Learning Frameworks of Classes XI-XII for feedback from Principals/ Teachers

CBSE - Centre for Excellence in Assessment (CBSE-CEA), in collaboration with Educational Initiatives (EI), developed the Learning Frameworks of classes XI and XII for 12 subjects - English, Hindi, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, History, Geography, Economics, Accountancy, Business Studies, and Computer Science. CBSE aims to orient teachers to these Frameworks and also collect their valuable feedback towards improving the frameworks that will later get utilized by schools and teachers to promote competency focused education and assessment for ensuring achievement of desired level of learning outcome by students.



Secondary and Senior School Curriculum and Sample Question Papers for the session 2023-24

CBSE annually provides the curriculum for classes IX to XII containing academic content, syllabus for examinations with learning outcomes, pedagogical practices, and assessment guidelines. In the year 2023, Curriculum with detailed designs of the Annual Board Exam Sample Question Papers have been made available on CBSE's website to reflect the impact of changes made in the curriculum and Question Paper design for Board Exams – 2024.

CBSE Science Challenge 2023-24

As an initiative to generate curiosity, enquiry and higher order thinking amongst the learners, the Board organized the CBSE Science Challenge for students of Classes VIII to X in which **10,696 students from 2,160 schools** participated on CBSE platform during the months of April - May, 2023. The theme of the CBSE Science Challenge was Science, Environment and Sustainability.



Art-Integrated Projects from classes I to XII with Pairing of States/ Union Territories

As per the recommendations of NEP 2020 and NCFFS 2022, Board issued a circular to schools on guidelines and implementation of Art integrated learning which continue to be used as a pedagogical tool for Classes I to XII. Board has prepared the Art Education (AE) and Art Integrated Learning (AIL) - AE & AIL portal *Kalasetu* for reporting of the implementation of Art-Education (AE) and Art Integrated Learning (AIL) by the schools affiliated to the Board. 8,776 schools, 2,03,53,172 students in Art and 11,76,531 students in YUVA

Tourism Club have participated in the session 2022-23.



Workshop on Best practices in Test Development by ETS

The Board has undertaken multiple steps to enhance the quality of assessment. In continuation of this, a workshop for CBSE officers was organised by Educational Testing Service, USA on 22 March 2023. The session was taken by Ms. Kadriye Ercikan, Vice President of Research and Measurement Sciences, Educational Testing Service, USA and the President & CEO of ETS Canada Inc. and Professor Emeritus, Faculty of Education, University of British Columbia. This half-day session covered best practices in Test Development, fairness and equity in testing and Psychometrics in Large-scale Assessments, Queries related to the topics were also resolved by the resource persons.





Conference of Principals on the Changing Face of Education in the Light of NEP 2020

A one-day conference of CBSE Principals in West Bengal was organized by Kolkata Sahodaya on 29 April 2023. The theme was 'The Changing Face of Education in the Light of NEP 2020'. The programme was attended by **300 delegates** who were all principals/ vice principals of different CBSE schools across the

state of West Bengal. The sessions taken by Dr. Joseph Emmanuel, Director, Academics and Dr. Praggya M. Singh, Joint Secretary, Academics covered all the new initiatives of CBSE, Competency-Based Education and Assessment, SAFAL, SQAA and Holistic Progress Card. An open session on the issues of schools was also taken by Shri K.Srinivasan, Joint Secretary/ Regional Officer, CBSE, Regional Office, Bhubaneshwar.







Nominations for National Awards to Teachers 2022-23

CBSE invited applications from teachers and principals in its private independent schools, and a transparent selection procedure led to the selection of six nominations, which were subsequently sent to the Ministry of Education. The following two teachers nominated by CBSE were conferred with National Teachers Award 2022

Webinar Series on School Quality Assessment and Assurance Framework (SQAAF)

CBSE made Self-Assessment based on the School Quality Assessment and Assurance Framework (SQAAF) mandatory for the acceptance of applications for fresh affiliation, switch-over, upgradation, or extension on the SARAS Portal for the academic session 2024-25 and beyond. To facilitate schools in

implementing the framework effectively, CBSE organized a series of 13 webinars explaining all aspects of SQAAF which observed a total of 2,78,305 views.

Aryabhata Ganit Challenge – 2023

Aryabhata Ganit Challenge 2023 was conducted in two levels first at the school level in which approximately 3,50,000 students in 3,240 schools participated. The 8,591 students identified by the schools in the first level conducted at their own level participated in the second stage Computer-Based Test conducted by CBSE. The result has been prepared and certificates awarded to the winners and participants too.

Veergatha 3.0

Project *Veer Gatha* was institutionalized under Gallantry Awards Portal (GAP) in 2021. GAP aimed to disseminate the details of bravery acts and the life stories of these bravehearts among the students so as to raise the level of patriotism and instil amongst them a spirit of civic consciousness. This year, submissions were evaluated firstly at the district level and then at the State Level by District Level Nodal Officers and State Level Nodal Officers appointed by the Ministry of Education. Third edition of Veergatha is being organized in the year 2024.



Run for Unity on Rashtriya Ekta Diwas

On the occasion of the Birth Anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the architect of national integration of independent India, *Rashtriya Ekta Divas* (National Unity Day) is observed on 31 October every year. The schools were requested to administer '*Rashtriya Ekta Diwas*' Pledge, organize Run for Unity and undertake other activities like debates, speeches etc.

A total of **3878 schools and 12,95,072 students** participated in the activities observed on '*Rashtriya Ekta Diwas*'.



Release of 10 Handbooks and Textbooks

The CBSE has unveiled several initiatives aimed at modernizing education and enriching student learning experiences. Updates include Arabic textbooks for classes IX and XI infused with Indian cultural elements, aligning with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Additional resources include the Life Skills Measurement Tool for middle school students, science and mathematics practice handbooks, and guidelines for disaster risk reduction in schools. The introduction of Competency-Focused Practice Question booklets and prototypes for Holistic Progress Cards emphasizes competency-based assessments and

comprehensive student evaluation. Moreover, CBSE launched a 'Use of AI in Classrooms' Capacity Building Programme to equip educators with AI integration skills, highlighting the board's commitment to embracing modern educational technologies.

29th CBSE National Sahodaya Conference 2023 on the theme "Reimagining the Changing Landscape- Quality Transformation in School Education"



The 29th CBSE National Sahodaya Conference 2023, themed "Reimagining the Changing Landscape - Quality Transformation in School Education," was held on 8 and 9 December at the Westin Powai, Mumbai. Hosted by Mumbai Sahodaya, a consortium of CBSEaffiliated schools, the conference aimed to foster collaboration and excellence in education. More than 1,200 distinguished principals from across the nation convened to discuss the latest trends, innovations, and challenges in education, particularly focusing on the National Education Policy 2020 and the new National Curriculum Framework for School Education 2023. The conference facilitated networking, collaboration, and the sharing of best practices with principals from India and abroad.

Multilingual Education and using mother tongue as a medium of instruction

Another significant initiative was the encouragement of multilingual education and using the mother tongue as a medium of instruction in CBSE affiliated schools. Schools

were urged to consider using Indian languages listed in Schedule 8 of the Indian Constitution as the medium of instruction from the Foundational Stage to the end of the Secondary Stage, alongside existing options. Schools were directed to explore available resources, consult with experts, and collaborate with other schools to promote multilingual education. Guidelines in this regard were issued to schools vide Circular No. Acad-84/2023 dated 21.07.2023.

Commemoration of 3rd Anniversary of NEP-2020 through CBSE - One Child, One Plant Campaign

To commemorate the third anniversary of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, CBSE conducted a sensitization campaign for schools and students on environmental concerns. This campaign included topics such as energy conservation, food wastage, electronic waste hazards, petroleum product conservation, and plastic pollution. Furthermore, CBSE organized a massive tree plantation campaign called the 'CBSE - One Child, One Plant Campaign' in all schools from 29 July, 2023 to 28 August, 2023. A total of 2396 schools and 3,06,767 students participated in the activities.



CBSE: G20-State level Conferences

Educational Working Group of G-20 countries focussed on areas to ensure inclusive, equitable, relevant and quality education and lifelong learning opportunities for all, within the theme

of "One Earth, One Family, One Future". On the lines of G-20, CBSE conducted 36 G20 two-day summits across the country which centred around life skills, mental health, safety, and well-being. 36 State Level Conferences on G20 were organized. A total of 8562 Teachers and 12924 students have participated in the 36 conferences.





Swachhata Hi Seva Special Campaign 3.0

Under Special Campaign 3.0, the schools were requested to start special cleanliness drive till 12 November 2023 with active involvement of students, teachers and community to spread the message of cleanliness, sanitation and hygiene in the society. A total of *5,087 schools* and *8,56,746 students* have participated in the campaign.






Amrit Kalash Yatras (Meri Maati Mera Desh Campaign)

Meri Maati Mera Desh (MMMD) was the finale programme of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav Commemoration. It envisaged paying tributes to all those veers and viranganas who have made the supreme sacrifice for the country. In the second phase of MMMD mitti was collected as a symbolic contribution and expression of people's participation towards the creation of an Amrit Vatika in Delhi.





Chandrayaan-3 Maha Quiz

The Board Vide Circular No. Acad-123/2023 dated 11.10.2023 advised all its affiliated schools to disseminate information regarding the *Chandrayaan-3 Maha Quiz* and also to encourage maximum number of students to participate in this quiz. As per the information received from the schools, till 19 October, 2023 i. e. within a week, a total of 4,99,474 students from 876 schools across the country participated in the quiz.



Bhartiya Bhasha Utsav

Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav with the theme, 'भाषाएँ अनेक, भाव एक' was conducted for 75 days (11 Weeks) from 28 September to 11 December, 2023 to promote language learning through the use of regional languages and technology. During the programme, the activities were conducted at all levels i.e., the schools, BRCs/CRCs/Panchayats, districts (including at the DIETs), state and national level to build up the momentum for the grand finale *Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav* on 11 December, the *Jayanti* of the great nationalist Tamil poet *Subramania Bharati*, who was popularly known as "*Mahakavi Bharati*", a freedom fighter and a social reformer in Tamil Nadu.

Till 7th Week, a total of 3,137 schools, 5,50,976 students, 31,988 teachers and 98,560 community members have participated in the activities observed during the Bhartya Bhasha Utsav.

A CBSE stall was also put up at Ambedkar Bhawan, Delhi to showcase various strategies followed by affiliated schools to promote multilingualism in classrooms.



04 Regional Level Adolescent Summits

04 Regional Level Adolescent Summits were organized on the themes Life Skills, Mental Health, Safety and Wellbeing and Gender Equality at Pune, Agartala, Hyderabad and Indore.

These summits attracted student participation as follows: Pune - 500 students, Agartala - 763 students, Hyderabad - 830 students, and Indore - 640 students.

CBSE National Adolescent Summit on Life Skills, Mental Health, Safety and Well Being 2023 was held at National Bal Bhavan, Delhi from 19 - 21 December 2023. The aim of this Summit was to bring together a large number of schools to have a face-to-face dialogue through various events, envisaging sustainable models of promoting the life skills and well-being programs in schools across the country. *1,200 students from 210 schools* all over country participated in the Summit.

Conferences on NEP

An exclusive one-day conference at each venue i.e. Pune, Agartala, Hyderabad, Indore, Kolkata, Ranchi, Patna and Bhubaneshwar was organized for the Principals to discuss about the NEP 2020 initiatives undertaken by the Board in Academics, Skill Education and Trainings with emphasis on Transformational Leadership.

These summits attracted school principals participation as follows: Pune – 353, Tripura – 191, Hyderabad – 340, Ranchi – 220, Kolkata – 315, Patna (in collaboration with BSEB) – 180, and Indore - 336.



CBSE Heritage India Quiz 2024

To strengthen the efforts to create awareness and a sense of pride among students about the vibrant history and culture of our country, the Board organized OBSE Heritage India Quiz — 2023 with the theme of India: The Mother of Democracy (G20) to celebrate India's presidency of the G20 and to commemorate the democratic movement of India and the glorious history of its people, culture, and achievements. This inter school quiz competition was organized for students from classes IX to XII and the total number of participation were 6960.

Academics-Assessments

Structured Assessment for Analyzing Learning (SAFAL)- an Initiative for Competency-Focused Key Stage Assessment in a digital mode:

Launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi ji, on the first anniversary of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Structured Assessment for Analysing Learning (SAFAL) is a diagnostic key stage assessment. This has been launched as per the recommendations of para 4.40 of NEP 2020, to measure the achievement level of students of grades 3, 5 and 8 across core competencies in curricular areas of Language, Mathematics and

Environmental Science/Science. SAFAL results are to be used by stakeholders for developmental purposes and provide diagnostic data and insights to participating schools on students' key competencies and proficiency levels.

The pilot of SAFAL was conducted on a digital platform developed in collaboration with CDAC-Mumbai, in a sample of 1887 CBSE affiliated schools in India and abroad in February 2023. A total of **4,01,241 students of grades 5 and 8** of different categories of schools, viz. Govt. Independent, KVs, Rural, Urban, Defence etc. registered for this Pilot. School level reports on competency-wise strengths and areas of development were prepared and made available to schools in September 2023. **This marked the completion of the first phase of this initiative.**









Holistic Progress Card (HPC):

As part of Transforming Assessment for Student Development, the para 4.35 of the NEP 2020 recommends preparation of Holistic Progress Card. CBSE had developed a prototype of HPC for Classes I to III as a pedagogical tool for 360 degree holistic assessment, bringing out uniqueness in each child. The Pilot of Holistic Progress Card for Classes I to III was conducted in 74 CBSE schools covering a range of different management types and areas across all Regional Offices of CBSE.

The HPC Prototypes were re-designed in the light of the National Curriculum Framework Foundational Stage 2022 and the NCERT HPC document for foundational stage. An accompanying implementation guideline has also been prepared for teachers that will handhold them with technical knowledge and practical strategies for undertaking assessment and documenting the same through Holistic Progress Cards. These documents were released for all CBSE schools on 28 December 2023. Orientation webinar on HPC - FS has been conducted on 19 January 2024. Face-to-face Prospective Resource Person programmes have been initiated from 24 January 2024 onwards. Through these PRP programmes, Resource Persons will be identified for taking training sessions throughout the country.

HPC Review workshop- Delhi

School Quality Assessment and Assurance Framework (SQAAF):

As per the recommendations in Para 8 of NEP 2020, CBSE has prepared and launched SQAAF. SQAAF is a comprehensive and implementable self-assessment tool for

accomplishing individual and institutional excellence, keeping the learner at the center of the framework. This will develop a culture of collaboration, innovation and accountability and also ensure adherence to quality standards as envisaged in NEP 2020.

CBSE has been mandated to act as Standards Setting Authority (SSA) for KVs, JNVs and other schools under various Central Ministries and frame parameters against which these schools can be assessed for quality interventions.

The CBSE SQAA Framework has been revisited and aligned with the SQAAF developed for PM SHRI Schools. Vide Circular No. 14/2023 dated 24.03.2023 issued by CBSE, SQAAF has been integrated with affiliation of schools.

In the session 2023-24, **16,613** schools have taken self-assessment.

132 schools have been randomly selected for Physical Quality Review. These reviews are currently being undertaken.

CBSE Games

CBSE organizes sports events for students of its affiliated schools. Participation in sports gives children a practical way to learn about goal-setting, importance of team work, discipline and skills required to deal with real life situations of ups and down. CBSE organizes sports events in **23 games** at Cluster/ Zonal and National Level in different age groups for boys and girls separately. The winners of Cluster and Zonal level competitions participate at National Level.

CBSE has introduced a totally online system for managing CBSE sports events. The participants are registered online with a unique UID for each participant, and the results too were uploaded on CBSE sports website after the sports events.

In session 2023-24, CBSE Sports events were organized in **303 venues** across the country. Around **6,00,000** students participated in CBSE games in 2023-24. Medals were given to the winners whereas digital participation certificates were being given to all the participants. It is also important to mention that winners of CBSE National Sports events participated in Khelo-India Program of Government of India, which shows the enthusiasm and spirit of sportsmanship being promoted by the Board.







TEACHER TRAINING



CBSE has 17 Centers of Excellence (CoEs) to impart teacher's training and 01 Advanced Centre for Continuous Professional Development (ACCPD), Rae Bareli, Uttar Pradesh for trainings of trainers and advanced teacher's training to comply with the clause 5.15 of National Education Policy (NEP), 2020 which recommends that each teacher is expected to participate in at least 50 hours of Continuous Professional Development (CPD) opportunities every year for their own

professional development, driven by their own interests. The Centers of Excellence (CoE) conducts Capacity Building Programme (CBPs) for the teachers of schools affiliated to the Board which stipulate for a compulsory annual in-service training for each teacher and principal. CBPs are arranged in two categories; generic and subject specific programmes. At present 58 CBPs (30 Generic and 28 Subject-specific) are being offered by the CBSE-CoEs for teachers and principals of CBSE affiliated schools.

This programme introduced teachers and school heads to the structure, policies and guidelines of all the constituent departments/ units of CBSE.



National teachers Conference on Guidance and Counselling

The National Teachers' Conference was organized at Guwahati (Assam) on 10th& 11th October, 2023 on "Guidance & Counselling" as its plays a significant role in addressing the developmental needs of the students. 879 participants from 32 States/UTs/Foreign Schools registered for the conference.

Smt. Nidhi Chhibber, IAS Chairperson CBSE inaugurated the conference and the inaugural session of the conference were addressed by Dr. Ram Shankar, Director (Training) CBSE, Sh. K.K Chaudhari, Ex Director, CBSE and Shri Biswaranjan Samal, IAS, Addl. Chief Secretary (Education), Assam.



25 oral presentations and 28 poster/e-paper presentations were shortlisted for the conference on various Sub Themes as follows:

Training Programme for teachers of Govt. Schools at Laddakh

In order to induct the newly affiliated Government Schools under the School Education Department of UT Laddakh into the CBSE system, different capacity building programme were organized for the subject teachers at secondary and senior secondary level by CBSE CoE, Chandigarh from 31 July, 2023 to 4 August, 2023.











The programme focused on the needs of the Science, Mathematics, Hindi, Chemistry, Physics and Biology teachers especially building their capacities in teaching methodology, question paper pattern, drafting of test items and conduct of practicals.

Total **328** teachers were trained in **12** different training programmes conducted at Leh and Kargil. The programme was well received by the participants and all their queries with regard to their subject were resolved by the subject experts.

Collaboration with the institutes/ departments for training programmes

A. School Health and Wellness Programme

CBSE in partnership with the UNESCO is supporting the implementation of the School Health and Wellness Programme, under Ayushman Bharat in schools affiliated to the Board.

CBSE has developed a CBP on "School Health and Wellness" in association with NCERT and UNESCO and till date around **400** Master

trainers were trained in 05 batches of 05 day workshops at NCERT, New Delhi. These Master trainers are conducting training for other teachers under the respective CoEs.





B. MoU with Educational Initiative (Ei)

CBSE signed has Memorandum Understanding (MoU) with Education Initiative (Ei) for development of Competency Based Capacity Building Programme (CBP) on English, Mathematics, Science and Social Science including institutionalizing the changes towards Strengthening Assessments in its CBPs for teachers. 

The introduction of a normative payment system through Integrated Payment System (IPS) for providing claim to the Resource Persons engaged through respective CoEs of the Board for the Online and Offline CBPs allows for automatic calculations. Similarly reimbursements of venue charges are also being processed through IPS.

Skill Yatra Campaign

The Skill Yatra Initiative was conceived as a transformative endeavour in response to the evolving needs of India's workforce and the imperative to bridge the skills gap in the country. Launching the initiative by Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), the initiative aimed to revolutionize the perception of vocational and skill-based education.

The campaign was launched on 19 Sept. 2023 at ICAR during 'National Summit on School to Work Transition'. At the core of this innovative endeavour is a mobile bus Skill lab, a fully-equipped multi-skill facility, ingeniously refurbished on a truck chassis and outfitted with cutting-edge amenities like Wi-Fi, audiovisual capabilities, and a generator. This versatile vehicle serves a dual purpose: not only does it function as a mobile lab, but it also acts as an advocacy tool, facilitating outreach and career counselling for students.

Manned by proficient trainers, the Skill Yatra bus imparts invaluable vocational skill training in diverse domains such as welding, plumbing, electrical wiring, food processing, basic healthcare, and mobile repairs, opening up a world of practical knowledge and possibilities for the students.

Skill Yatra Campaign was conducted from 29.09.2023 to 17.10.2023 covering around 3000+ students participated and benefited from the enriching Skill Yatra experience across Delhi NCR.

Students actively participate in hands-on experiments, working collaboratively in groups, utilizing tools and equipment under the careful supervision of trained mentors, and following stringent safety measures.



National Summit

CBSE organized a two-day National Summit on the topic, 'Facilitating School to Work Transition' on 19 & 20 September 2023 at ICAR Auditorium, Pusa, New Delhi. The event highlighted the essential role schools play in preparing students with the necessary skills and knowledge to thrive in a constantly changing professional landscape. Along with featuring talks by eminent speakers, policymakers, educationists, industry leaders, and other key stakeholders, the summit provided an opportunity to the students to showcase the work being done in their schools for promoting Skill Education through a Skill Expo. The concept was motivated from the success of National Summit titled Facilitating Schools to Work Transition held on 19th-20th September, 2023 at ICAR, New Delhi which was a huge success in terms of learning and sharing of experiences.











Youth Ideathon 2023:

YOUTH IDEATHON is the project for providing a platform for innovative ideas of students of Class 4 to Class 12. It is an annual event brought about by collaboration between CBSE and partners of MEPSC (Management & Entrepreneurship and Professional Skill Council). In this event of year 2023, many schools submitted their innovative ideas through the designated portal. Selected best entries were awarded in an event in the month of Dec 2023 held at IIT Delhi.

Project Carte Blanche

CBSE in collaboration with Microsoft, UNICEF and TAG has taken up the project of Digital Literacy program through its affiliated schools as Project Carte Blanche. In the first phase, 610 schools have been onboarded to be the part of this project, where schools are being provided necessary hardware and software infrastructure to implement the hybrid learning and this phase would be completed by July, 2024.

School Teachers' Development Programme In Entrepreneurship Mentoring

Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India in association with CBSE conducted successfully School Teachers' Development programme in Entrepreneurship as follow Batch:

Batch $1:27^{th}$ April -1^{st} May 2023

Batch $2:2^{nd}$ May- 6^{th} May 2023

Schools play a vital role in preparing young minds to build successful lives. In the fast-changing world, there is a need to prepare students with varying possibilities that they could encounter in the future, including working for others, establishing their own enterprise, contributing to the community,

etc. These require skills like creative problemsolving, critical thinking, innovation, risktaking ability, leadership, communication, decision-making, etc., and in-depth knowledge of their chosen discipline to succeed.

In the above context, schools have realized and felt the need for specialized and trained teachers to teach entrepreneurship and imbibe an entrepreneurial mindset. This has generated the need for appropriate and structured training of school teachers to get specialized knowledge & understanding of the subject along with contemporary teaching methods.

To cater to this need, EDII has successfully implemented Training Programmes for School teachers and school Principals across the country with support from CBSE. In the past, EDII Conducted three online training programmes on Entrepreneurship Teaching for the CBSE affiliated schools and developed a pool of 1500 School Teachers to carry their learnings to the schools and students. Also, EDII hosted CBSE-affiliated School Principals' exposure visit with the intention of spreading the entrepreneurial spirit and mindset among students.

To strengthen its mission and to contribute further, EDII conducted this School Teachers' Development Programme, entitled "School Teachers' Development Programme in Entrepreneurship Mentoring, "with an objective to motivate & empower school teachers involved or interested in entrepreneurship and entrepreneurial mindset and train multiple students in the above areas.



Implementation of Skill Hub Initiative (SHI) under PMKVY 3.0/4.0 in CBSE affiliated Schools

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 of India has emphasized the need for promoting skill development in schools to ensure that students are prepared for the challenges of the 21st century knowledge economy.

The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) has implementing PMKVY since 2015 to create an industry ready workforce and enhance the employability skills. The scheme targets schools/ college dropouts, out-of-school children and unemployed youths in the age group of 15-45 years. Under the scheme the targeted groups are offered demand driven and industry-linked skill courses that will enable them to choose a career path aligned with their abilities and aspirations. It has been envisaged to leverage the existing infrastructure of schools after the school hours or on non-working days as 'Skill Hub' for imparting Skill Education and Training.

Government of India announced the launching of PMKVY 4.0 in the Union Budget 2023. It aims to leverage the learnings from the implementation of SHI under PMKVY 3.0.

All schools affiliated with CBSE (Private or Government), especially those which offered Skill subjects in their schools were encouraged to start Skill Hub in their premises as per given guidelines and norms.

Skill Hub Initiative Implementation Status:

- Skill Hub Initiative (PMKVY 3.0) Implementation
 - o Assessment and certification completed for all 38 batches (earlier batch).
 - o 29 School registered on SAKSH portal for next phase of implementation of SHI.

- Skill Hub Initiative (PMKVY 4.0) Implementation
 - o Circular No. Skill-122/2023 dated 11.10.2023 issued along with 44 shortlisted job roles for implementation of PMKVY 4.0 which included SOP for onboarding of schools on SIP, suggestive sector and job role list, implementation model for PMKVY 4.0, financial implications.
 - o Regular orientation cum onboarding webinar conducted with CBSE schools for PMKVY 4.0 Skill Hub Initiative in coordination with NSDC.

Teachers' training/awareness workshop/discussions

CBSE regularly conducts Awareness Programmes & Capacity Building Programmes/ Workshops for teachers teaching Skill subjects in collaboration with Sector Skills Councils and respective Industry partners.

- 1. The Awareness cum Capacity Building Programme on Hospitality Based Skill Courses (Food Production 409, 809) was conducted in Indian Culinary Institute, Noida on 28 February 2023. More than 75 participants were part of the programme.
- 2. A series of online capacity-building program for **53,445 school teachers** in collaboration with the Media and Entertainment Skills Council in April 2023. These programs aimed to empower teachers with relevant knowledge.

After the session was completed, the participants were required to take assessments for the sessions to evaluate the learning. Post assessment, the participants were certified.

- Orientation Programs for School Principals on new trends in Media and Entertainment Sector
- a) Eduspark Summit held in Mumbai on 24 June, 2023 saw participation from CBSE school principals in multiple activities including Academia Round table, Panel discussion on Education and skill development for the future of work.
- b) Awareness Workshop at Ranchi on 16 July, 2023 The workshop aimed to enlighten school principals about the significance and the implementation of skill education. The event was supported by the Media and Entertainment Skills Council, which provided valuable insights into the benefits of incorporating media and entertainment-related skills into the curriculum.

Introducing/developing new skill modules for Middle School students

In compliance of the recommendations of NEP 2020, CBSE had introduced Skill Modules from Class 6 onwards. These Skill Modules have been targeted towards creating awareness among the students about various skills/vocations. And also, to help the students to make informed choices when choosing skill subjects in Secondary classes. Currently the Board offers 40+ skill modules which are available to students of classes 6 onwards.

- 1. Photography: The curricula and content for Photography module was shared by MESC and after the review from experts, finalized and uploaded on CBSE website.
- 2. The following 39 Skill Manuals for Middle School Classes reviewed and uploaded on the CBSE website. The Subject Category is:

In May 2023, a series of Skill Module sessions were conducted on various topics in schools. The sessions were held on weekdays and covered a range of subjects. Here are some key highlights:

- 1. On 1 May 2023, an orientation about introducing Skill Modules in schools attracted a substantial audience with **25,670** participants.
- 2. Throughout the month, various topics like Pottery, Bakery, Khadi, Graphic Novel Making, Block Printing, and more were covered.
- 3. The highest attendance was recorded during the Food session on 18 May 2023, with **2,677** participants, while the Mask Making session on 10 May 2023 had the highest YouTube participants at **2,053**.
- 4. In total, there were **83,956** YouTube participants throughout the month, with **19,587** participants attending the sessions in person.

Collaboration with Media & Entertainment Sector Skill Council (MESC)

As MoU partners MESC has been providing support and assistance to CBSE for its activities and initiatives of promoting Skill Education in schools like framing of curriculum, content development and training of faculty/teachers for the Media & Entertainment Skill courses in various sub-sectors (like Animation & VFX, Art & Culture, Gaming, Digital Media, Advertising, Films, Television, Sound & Music, Radio, Print, Live Performances, Event Management, Theme/ Amusement Park - Texturing Artist, Animation and Mass Media Studies).

As part of these activities MESC updated/ revised the course contents of the following skill subjects:

- Multi-Media (Texture Artist) 9 & 10
 - o Texturing artist 9+10 Text book redesign
 - o Texturing artist 9+10 e Content PPT
- Multi-Media (Animator) Class 11 & 12
 - o Animator 11+12 Text book redesign
 - o Animator 11+12 - PPT

Special Opportunity to CBSE students to participate in the NCHMCT counselling for admission to Hospitality Based subjects

The integration of hospitality-based subjects into the education system under the NEP 2020 not only equips students with industry-relevant skills but also provides them with a wide range of career opportunities. Students with a background in hospitality management can explore career in hotels, restaurants, tourism, event management companies, and various other sectors related to hospitality and tourism contributing effectively to the growth of the hospitality sector in India.

CBSE in collaboration with National Council for Hotel Management and Catering Technology (NCHMCT) offers hospitality-based Skill subjects (viz. Food Production & Front Office Operations) in classes IX to XII in its schools. NCHMCT is a government body established in 1982 to regulate and run hospitality education programs in India. It has established 21 premier institutes all over India. NCHMCT acts as technical knowledge partner in the field of hospitality education for Ministry of Tourism, Government of India.

This partnership between CBSE and NCHMCT ensures that students receive industry-relevant education and training, aligning them with the demands and trends of the hospitality sector. The curriculum of these subjects has been designed in consultation with industry experts, incorporating their insights and expertise to provide students with practical knowledge and skills.

To be eligible for admission to Bachelor's programmes offered by NCHMCT, students must have successfully passed class XII or its equivalent. Thereafter, they need to qualify the NCHMCT Joint Entrance Examination (NCHM-JEE) conducted by NTA, followed by the centralized online counselling process.

In 2023, NCHMCT offered a special opportunity to the CBSE students who have passed class XII with Hospitality Based subjects to register and participate directly in the counselling process for admission to the Bachelor's programmes.

In continuation to Circular No. Skill-70/2023 dated 08.06.2023 and the virtual orientation meeting held on 14.06.2023 regarding the "Special Opportunity for CBSE students to participate in the NCHMCT Counselling for admission to Hospitality-Based Courses." NCHMCT, with the approval of its Governing Body, decided to open a registration window for CBSE students who missed the NCHM

JEE 2023. This allowed them to directly register and participate in the counselling process.

Successful completion of the Bachelor programmes from IHMs under NCHMCT opens up numerous opportunities for students in the hospitality industry.

Exposure Visits for the Principals of CBSE affiliated schools

National Education Policy 2020 comprehensive policy document that emphasizes revamping vocational skill education. The emphasizes vocational bringing policy education into mainstream education, ensuring universal access to quality education - including vocational education - from preschool to Grade XII. In this context, Board has planned to institutionalize a mechanism through which School leaders will be given exposure to various skill sectors by visiting the institutions of eminence across India so that they can collaborate with such institutes in the future to integrate skill (vocational) education into mainstream education and utilize their infrastructure in time shift manner (or during vacations).

Objectives

The Exposure Visits of Principals to organizations/institutions help to leverage the synergies between schools and Higher Education Institutions that provide facilities for promoting skill education. The main aim

of the exposure visit was to give orientation to principals on various skill subjects. Exposure Visit emphasized creating interactive learning spaces, access to different environments, and knowledge about the latest trends and practices in the field of vocational education. The main objectives of these visits are:

- The Exposure Visit aims to acquaint school leaders with various sectoral skills subjects.
- Gathering information on various skill subjects, their scope, and collaboration with HEIs for the future.
- Mapping the landscape for knowledge and resource sharing between schools and Higher Education Institutions.
- Adopting best practices and innovative pedagogies for implementing skill-based courses in schools.
- Analyzing the linkage of vocational/ skill courses and the industry exposure required for students in each field

Outcomes

- Till December **28** visits have been completed.
- Total of 1,076 School Leaders participated in these visits.
- Principals/ School Leaders from KVS, JNV, EMRS, UT of Chandigarh, and CBSE-affiliated schools participated in the Exposure Visits.


The following Exposure Visits were conducted in the month of January to December 2023 (Phase – I to IV).

EXAMINATION 2023



The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) is the premier National Board under the aegis of Ministry of Education. The main mandate of CBSE is to affiliate schools for conducting Secondary and Senior Secondary Level Examinations. CBSE is a Pacesetter Board in India that has a pan-India and International presence with more than 27,000 schools affiliated with the Board in India and 27 countries. The CBSE is tasked with overseeing public board examinations which are pivotal for students' academic progression.

In this examination cycle 2022-2023, the board managed a record-breaking number of candidates approximately 39 lakh (3.9 million), demonstrating its capacity to handle large-scale assessments efficiently. The Board examination was conducted across the nation and in 27 foreign countries for candidates of Class X and XII simultaneously. This report outlines the detailed execution of the examinations, highlighting the meticulous planning, resource allocation, and implementation strategies that led to the successful administration of one of the largest public examinations.

2. Pre-Examination Planning

2.1. Examination Schedule and Curriculum

• **Examination Dates:** The examination was scheduled over a 7-week period, from 15 February 2023 till 5 April 2023.

Class-X 15th February 2023 to 21th March, 2023

Class-XII 15th February 2023 to 05th April, 2023

• Curriculum Alignment: The board ensured that all examination content was aligned with the national curriculum standards, with input from subject matter experts to maintain fairness and relevance. The Curriculum was uploaded on the Board's website in the beginning of the Academic year for Classes IX to XII. Sample Papers were also uploaded for the candidates which helped schools, teachers and candidates in their preparation for the final Board examination.

2.2. Resource Allocation

- Human Resources: Over 18 lakh staff members, including Centre Supdt., Deputy Centre Supdt., invigilators, examiners, and administrative staff, were oriented and trained through a webinar by the Controller of Examinations himself. A comprehensive Booklet with all procedures well laid out for all examination functionaries in the form of Centre Supt's guidelines was provided to all functionaries.
- Infrastructure: Over 7000 examination centres were made across various regions, equipped with necessary facilities and security measures to successfully conduct the Class X and XII board examinations.

• The Compartment Examination for Class XII was conducted on a single day i.e. 17th July, 2023 and for Class X examinations was conducted from 17th July, 2023 to 22nd July, 2023. Thereafter the Result was declared within the stipulated time.

2.3. Technology and Security

• Digital Platforms:

A dedicated online portal *PARIKSHA SANGAM* was developed for registration of candidates, submission of List of candidates scheduling of pre-examination and post examination activities. This platform helped all stakeholders -schools regional offices and the examination department for easy

synchronization of activities and dissemination of all information related to conduct of examinations.

ECL-Exam Centre Locater App: A mobile app was created to facilitate CBSE Examinees, through which they could easily locate their examination centers by just entering their examination roll number.

OECMS (Online Exam Centre Management System): A Comprehensive Decision Support System comprising of a portal and backend system to get real time information about centres and conduct of exams including feedback about the question paper(s), packing of answer books & dispatch information about observers was developed through this portal.

CMTM (Confidential Material Tracking & Monitoring System) is an app for Board Exams developed for electronic surveillance, tracking and monitoring.

 Security Measures: Advanced security protocols, including frisking by a male and female invigilator, CCTV surveillance, were implemented to prevent cheating and ensure the integrity of the examination process.

3. Examination Execution

3.1. Candidate Registration

- Process: Candidates registered through the PARIKSHA SANGAM, with a total of about 39 lakh registrations for regular and private candidates were processed.
- **Support:** Help desks and online support were established to assist stakeholders with any registration issues like change of subjects, change of examination centres, registration of candidates for special examination due to representing the Nation in International Sports and International Olympiad events.

3.2. Examination Centres

- Setup: Each examination centre was equipped with necessary centre materials, including blank answer books and other examination related material.
- **Staffing:** Trained invigilators were assigned to ensure smooth conduct of examination and to address any immediate issues.

3.3. Examination Administration

- Conduct: The exams were conducted in a manner to manage the large number of candidates efficiently. Each session adhered to strict timing and procedural guidelines.
- Monitoring: Continuous monitoring was performed to ensure adherence to

examination protocols and to handle any emergencies.

4. Post-Examination Process

4.1. Answer Sheet Collection and Processing

• **Collection:** Answer sheets were collected from all centres and transported securely to centralized locations through a well-defined procedure.

Processing:

E-Theory: An online system for answer sheets bag allocation to Chief Nodal Supervisor, answer sheets allocation to evaluators, evaluation monitoring, question wise theory marks uploading and online generation of award lists was developed & implemented. During evaluation all the marks were uploaded directly to the website leaving no scope for any sort of manual intervention.

• TETRA (Theory Evaluation Trend Analysis): A unique portal and Decision Support System based on Real Time Evaluation Monitoring was developed. In this system evaluation trend could be seen, analysed and monitored. This also generated statistical data and provided graphical visualization of evaluation related information on real time.

4.2. Result Compilation and Verification

- **Compilation:** Results were compiled using robust software systems to handle large volumes of data.
- **Verification:** A multi-tier verification process was employed to ensure accuracy and fairness in result declaration.

4.3. Results Declaration

• Online Access: Results were made available through the board's official website, with SMS and email notifications sent to candidates.

- Physical Copies: Hard copies of results were dispatched to schools and examination centres for distribution to candidates.
- **Digilocker Access:** In order to further strengthen security & privacy of student's data, a 6 digit Security PIN based activation for students' Digi Locker accounts was done. After activation of Digi Locker accounts, students could access their Digital Academic Documents under the "Issued Documents" section.

5. Challenges and Solutions

5.1. Logistical Challenges

- **Issue:** Managing the sheer volume of candidates and materials was a significant logistical challenge that CBSE has faced given the geographical diversity of India and countries abroad in which CBSE schools exist.
- **Solution:** The board implemented a phased approach for material distribution and utilized regional offices to streamline the process.

5.2. Technical Issues

- Issue: Occasional technical glitches with the online portal were immediately resolved so that all online portals could seamlessly provide data for examination and result processing.
- Solution: A dedicated IT support team was available 24/7 to resolve issues promptly and minimize disruptions.

5.3. Security Concerns

 Issue: Potential for examination malpractices were catered through constant dissemination of information and quick disposal of any queries received. • **Solution:** Rigorous security protocols and random checks were conducted to deter and address any instances of cheating.

6. Post result processes

• **Process-** A three tier process of Verification of Marks, Obtaining Photocopy of evaluated Answer book and Re-evaluation of selected Questions was made available for candidates who wish to apply for the same. Any grievance of any candidate/parent/ school was resolved in a time bound manner so that admission to higher class of candidates is facilitated.

7. Conclusion

The successful conduct of the public board examinations for 39 lakh candidates by the CBSE is a testament to the board's meticulous planning, effective resource management, and commitment to maintaining examination integrity. The challenges faced were effectively managed through strategic solutions, and the overall feedback from candidates and staff has been overwhelmingly positive.

8. Recommendations

- **Ongoing Improvement:** The Board with its commitment of excellence will continue to enhance its digital platforms to further streamline processes.
- **Regular Training:** It will implement ongoing training programs for staff to adapt to evolving examination needs.
- **Feedback Integration:** CBSE has always incorporated and will continue to incorporate feedback from candidates and staff to address any areas for improvement in future examinations.

This comprehensive approach ensured that the examination process was conducted smoothly, providing a fair and efficient assessment for all candidates involved.

IT INITIATIVES

1) VIDYA SAMIKSHA SOFTWARE "सागर से सारांश" (Bird's eye view of CBSE Ecosystem)

Introduction

In its vision for building a future-oriented education landscape, the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 prioritizes data-driven decision making, data analytics, and datadriven governance. This policy recognizes data as the cornerstone for tracking and monitoring educational activities, enabling continuous improvement. To bridge the gap between data and actionable insights, Dr Antriksh Johri, Director IT & Projects of CBSE conceptualized and developed the ambitious Sagar se Saransh (Sqube) initiative, which aligns with the National Digital Education Architecture (NDEAR) – a government initiative to establish a unified digital infrastructure for education. NDEAR emphasizes the importance of data interoperability and accessibility, creating the foundation for Sagar se Saransh. Prior to Sagar se Saransh, challenges like presence of data in silos and inaccessible information, manual data analysis and inefficiencies, limited visibility and lack of actionable insights, inconsistent reporting and difficulty in monitoring progress, hindered CBSE's ability to leverage data for informed decision-making and optimize educational experiences.

Objective

To address these challenges and empower CBSE with a robust data analysis system, Sqube was developed with the following objectives:

- 1. Assimilation of data from various departments in silos at one platform for removal of redundancy
- 2. Single source of truth for all kinds of data related to various programs, initiatives, schools, teachers, students etc.
- 3. Identify KPIs which are directly linked with student performance in Board examination
- 4. Detailed analysis and visualizations to generate actionable insights and reports for recommendation
- 5. Interactive visualizations for actionable insights to trigger responses across all the levels/departments
- 6. Provide personalized recommendation to schools for performance enhancement e.g., Student-Teacher ratio

7. Technological Features

The CBSE VSK facility was inaugurated and VSK Software "सागर से सारांश" was launched on 21st Sept, 2023 by Hon'ble Secretary (SE & L), Ministry of Education, Govt of India in the August presence of Chairperson CBSE, Additional Secretary, Joint Secretaries, other senior officers of MoE and Heads of various autonomous bodies.

Thereafter many teams of senior officers from MoE, State & Sister organizations have visited VSK Facility of CBSE and seen demo of Sqube.



2) Cyber Crisis Management Plan (CCMP)

With the increasing penetration of Information Technology, various domains of CBSE are now increasingly dependent on network of critical infrastructure. As such any disruptions of IT operations of CBSE is likely to have a devastating effect on stakeholders and essential services being offered by the Board. In view of the potential impact, protection of data & systems, a Comprehensive Cyber Crisis Management Plan (CCMP) was prepared in consultation with MoE & CERT-In and implemented in

CBSE to ensure that disruptions are prevented and possible damage averted.

3) Examination- Modules/Systems

Following modules/systems were developed & implemented in 2023 by IT Department CBSE

i. α CASE (Automatic Centre Allocation System for Examination)

This System has been designed and developed, incorporating multiple criteria via. Distance, avoidance of mutual schools as centres& triangle of schools/centres and validations to ensure the most efficient and optimized creations of centres in automated manner.

A key aspect of CASE is its ability to manage outliers by considering the remaining abilities of already selected centers and, if necessary, slightly increasing the distance criteria to distribute the maximum number of schools effectively. More features of CASE include removal of bi-directional links between schools, regional restrictions, and the prioritizing of nearest distances.

ii. Online workflow based 'Centralized Admission Master Correction (CAMC)' System

A Portal for uploading pre-examination data corrections of class X and XII. These corrections are done by the schools and approved by ROs through work flow-based system and same are updated in central database.

iii. Online Practical/Theory marks & Internal grades Corrections (OPTICS) System

A Portal for uploading of Internal Assessment/ Internal Grades & Practical Marks missing and corrections of Class-X and XII for ROs for Examination.

iv. Online Manual/Comparison Marks Correction System

A Portal for uploading of Manual marks/ Theory marks Comparison mistakes &theory missing marks of Class-X and XII for ROs for Examination.

v. Online workflow-based post-result 'Demographic Data Correction (OPRDC)' System

APortalforcorrection in post-result demographic data of class X and XII. These corrections are done by the schools and approved by ROs/Controller of examination through work flow-based system. Once it is approved, it is directly updated in the result repository i.e. 'ParinamManjusha'.

vi. TETrA: Theory Evaluation Trend Analysis R-4.0 for Examination 2023

A unique portal for Real Time Evaluation Monitoring: In this system evaluation trend can be visualized, analyzed and monitored. This also generates various statistical data and gives graphical representation in real time. It is a Decision Support System based on real-time statistical data.

SCHOLARSHIP SCHEMES

In order to promote meritorious students from socially and economically weaker sections, the Board has following scholarship schemes:

CENTRAL SECTOR SCHEME OF SCHOLARSHIP FOR COLLEGE & UNIVERSITY STUDENTS (CSSS), SPONSERED BY MoE

Objective: - To provide financial assistance to meritorious students from poor families to meet a part of their day-to-day expenses while pursuing higher studies.

Scope: - The scholarships are awarded by Ministry of Education, Government of India on the basis of results of Higher Secondary / Class XII Board Examination. A maximum of 82,000 fresh scholarships per annum are provided for pursuing graduate / postgraduate degree in colleges and universities and for professional courses, such as Medical, Engineering etc.

Eligibility for Scholarship:

- i. Students who have passed Class XII of 10+2 pattern or equivalent above 80th percentile of successful candidates in the relevant stream from the respective Board of Examination and pursuing **regular** degree course from Colleges/Institutions recognized by AICTE and respective Regulatory Bodies concerned;
- ii. Students with gross parental/family income up to Rs. 4.5 lakh per annum are eligible for scholarship under the scheme. Income certificate will be required only for the fresh applicants;
- iii. For renewal of scholarship in each year of study, besides getting at least 50% marks in the Annual Examination, maintenance of adequate attendance of at least 75%, is also the criteria.

The Beneficiaries/Applicants visited National Scholarships Portal (www.scholarships gov.in) for applying the fresh/renewal scholarships.

Rate and Duration of Scholarship (from financial year 2022-23): - The rate of scholarship is Rs.12,000/-per annum at Graduation level for first three years of College and University courses and Rs.20,000/-per annum at Post Graduation level. (The detailed information about the scheme was available at National Scholarships Portal www.scholarships.gov.in).

Role of CBSE in CSSS:

CBSE verified the genuineness of the CSSS scholarship application of students who have passed class-XII from the CBSE affiliated schools, being a State Nodal Officer (S.N.O) for this scheme. This scheme is fully sponsored by Ministry of Education, Government of India.

SINGLE GIRL CHILD MERIT SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME (SGC)

Objective: In order to promote meritorious students from socially and economically weaker sections of girls who are the only child of their parents.

Eligibility:

- i. Single Girl Child pursuing her education at class XI and XII in CBSE affiliated schools who have passed class X from the school affiliated with CBSE.
- ii. The girl students who are the only child of their parents and scored 60% or more marks are eligible for the award of scholarship. Family annual income should be up to Rs. 8 lakh per annum.
- iii. Monthly tuition fee does not exceed Rs. 2,500/- for class-X and Rs. 3000 for

class-XII.In the next two years, the total enhancement in tuition fee in such school shall not be more than 10% of the tuition fee charged.

iv. The scholarship shall be awarded to Indian Nationals only.

Amount of Scholarship: Rs. 6,000/- (per annum) for Class X to XII.

Limit of Scholarship: There is no limit for numbers of scholarships for Single Girl Child SGC. This scheme is fully sponsored by CBSE.

BOARD MERIT SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR SC/ST STUDENTS (BMS)

Objective: In order to promote meritorious students from socially and economically weaker sections of SC/ST category.

Eligibility: The Board prepares 0.1% combined merit list common for all Schemes on the basis of merit certificate(s) achieved by the candidates in different subjects (not on the basis of aggregate of marks). The Candidates has secured at least 60% marks at the examination of the Board.

Amount of Scholarship: The Board offers scholarship of Rs. 250/-per month to 23 students of Class X and Rs. 500/- per month to 25 students of Class XII (meritorious students of SC/STcategory). This scheme is fully sponsored by CBSE.

SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR WARD OF THE EMPLOYEES OF BOARD i.e. C.B.S.E (SWBE)

To promote meritorious ward of the employees of the Board, the Board provides scholarship to all eligible students, who secured 60% and above marks in each class on the following rates:-

- Class VI–VIII @Rs. 700/-per month
- Class IX–XII @Rs. 900/-per month.

ISSUE OF 0.1% MERIT CERTIFICATE OF CLASS X & XII

The subject-wise Merit Certificate for class X / XII is awarded to a candidate/s for outstanding academic performance for being among the top 0.1% of successful candidates in a particular subject.

(LATE) SH. LAKSHMAN SINGH KOTHARI MEMORIAL AWARD

Sanjay Kothari Family Charitable Trust, New Delhi has instituted a running trophy in the name of Late Sh. Lakshman Singh Kothari. The award of Rs. 10,000/- is in association with CBSE from the corpus fund provided by the trust. It is given to the student, who secures the maximum marks in five subjects taken together in Class XII Examination conducted by the CBSE.

AFFILIATION


The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) is the country's largest and internationally acclaimed premier School Board under the aegis of Ministry of Education. The Board has a mandate from Govt. of India to affiliate schools for conducting Secondary and Senior Secondary Level Examinations. CBSE is a pioneer Board of the country that has a pan-India and international presence with more than 27000 schools affiliated in India and 26 countries located in the West and the Middle East Asia, South East Asia, North East Asia, Africa and Europe.

During the year 2023, CBSE has reorganized its affiliation application system- SARAS School Affiliation Re-Engineered Automation System 4.0. The plan to restructure the affiliation system is in line with the reforms that have been introduced under the New Education Policy

(NEP) 2020 which recommends a 'light but tight' regulatory framework to ensure integrity, transparency, and resource efficiency of the educational system.

With the new approach, CBSE has completely digitized based on data analytics the affiliation application and processing system. The process flow conducted is entirely online with little human intervention, making the entire process transparent and time bound.

The reengineered system aims at minimum government interference and maximum governance and will have a swift and time-bound disposal of applications, provided the basic mandatory conditions and necessary infrastructure are met. The number of New Schools affiliated with CBSE in the year from 01.01.2023 to 31.12.2023 is 1022 as per illustration below:

This restructure assisted in achieving the goals of minimal government and maximum governance, mechanized and data-driven assessments and enhanced accountability in all systemic processes, as well as speedy and time-bound disposal of all applications.

CBSE has taken proactive measures to ensure that the new affiliation process is transparent, completely online, more accountable, and reduces compliance burden facilitating ease-of doing-business, thereby drastically reducing paperwork and other procedural formalities.

A new version of the SARAS CBSE Manual 4.0 was launched outlining the process for CBSE affiliation, the process flow charts, depicting various stages of affiliation process, documents necessary for affiliation, modalities, and SOPs for inspection, formats to be used for this process, an experiential video and FAQs making the affiliation process, time bound, transparent and hassle free for the schools.

A step-by-step process is specified for the affiliation of a school to CBSE. With the implementation of the National Curriculum Framework for Foundation Stage (NCFFS) from the 2023-24 academic session, CBSE has amalgamated pre-primary sections as per NEP also known as *Balvatikaas* part of its composite affiliation, to lay stress on a strong foundation of a student from the age of three.

- 6. Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for review of affiliation cases Circular 15/2023 dt. 24.04.2023
- 7. Upgradation of Schools affiliated for Middle Class Syllabus Circular 18/2023 dt. 18.05.2023
- 8. Guidelines for Residential Schools Circular 24/2023 dt. 01.09.2023

During the year 2023, fresh affiliation was granted to 1022 schools, upgradation to Secondary/Senior Secondary level granted to 555 schools and 5530 schools were granted extension of affiliation for further period of five years.

PROFESSIONAL EXAMS

1. Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya Selection Test - 2023 for Class VI.

Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas are centrally funded schools run and managed by the Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti (NVS) of the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India. Admission in JNV is made on the basis of a national level test called JNVST. CBSE provides confidential support services

for this high-volume test which is OMR based MCQ type. The Test comprises of Mental Ability, Arithmetic and Language. JNVST-2023 was held on **29th April 2023 (9632 centres,** 650 Districts, 1037 custodians, 35 States/UTs), **2467349** candidates were registered (1159180 **Girls** + 1308169 Boys + **146** Transgender) and 47253 candidates selected.



2. JNV Lateral Entry Test - Class IX

In order to ensure maximum utilization of infrastructure and facilities available in JNV, each year, a Lateral Entry Test for Class IX is conducted for the vacant seats. Test is MCQ type based on Class 8 Syllabus. It comprises of English, Hindi,

Mathematics and General Science. Lateral Entry Test-2023 was held on **11th Feb. 2023 (644 exam centres,** 482 Districts, 483 custodians, 35 States & UTs). **181006** Candidates were registered (75840 Girls + 105154 Boys + 12 Transgenders) and 2572 candidates were selected



3. JNV Lateral Entry Test – 2023 for Class XI

In order to ensure maximum utilization of infrastructure and facilities available in JNV, each year, a Lateral Entry Test for Class XI is conducted for the vacant seats. Test is MCQ type based on Class 10 Syllabus. It comprises of Mental Ability, English, Science, Social Science and Mathematics. Lateral Entry Test was conducted on 22nd July 2023 (640 exam centres, 631 Districts, 629 custodians, 34 States & UTs). 57716 candidates were registered (28455 Girls + 29261 Boys + 02 Transgender) and 5584 candidates were selected.



4. Special Arrangements for the State of Manipur

Considering the larger convenience of the candidates of the State of Manipur, the JNV Lateral Test for Class XI was conducted separately on 25th August 2023 in 11 districts (10 exam centres, 1 custodian) 718 candidates were registered (412 Girls + 306 Boys) and 108 candidates were selected.

5. SHRESTA Scheme Facilitation: Scheme for Residential Education for students in High Schools in Targeted Areas (SHRESTA)

Board is extending support to Department. of Social Justice Empowerment (DoSJE), Govt. of India for its (SHRESTA) Scheme which is aimed for providing opportunities to the meritorious SC students in the best schools in the country. Under the Scheme, a specified number of SC students are selected through a national entrance test conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). They are granted admission in the private residential schools identified by the DoSJE based on the data provided by the CBSE. Admission is done in Class IX & XI for completion of education till 12th standard and DoSJE provided scholarship for admitted students. Based on OASIS data (updated by the schools), Board provide list of residential private affiliated schools meeting the criteria of 75% pass percentage (in Class X & XII for the last three years). School should have been in existence for at least 5 years and should have infrastructure for admitting at least 10 students in Class IX & XI together. DoSJE finalizes the list of schools for the seat allocation. In the year 2023, Board provided a database of 850 schools for the scheme.



CENTRAL TEACHER ELIGIBILITY TEST (CTET)



The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009 requires the recruitment of a large number of teachers across the country in a time bound manner.

In spite of the enormity of the task, it is desirable to ensure that quality for recruitment of teachers is not diluted at any cost. It is, therefore, necessary to ensure that persons recruited as teachers possess the essential aptitude and ability to meet the challenges of teaching at the Primary and Upper Primary level.

In accordance with the provision of Sub-Section (1) of Section 23 of the RTE Act, the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) vide Notification dated August 23, 2010 and subsequent amendment dated July 29, 2011 laid down the minimum qualifications/ eligibility criteria for a person to be appointed as a Teacher to teach Classes I to VIII.

It had been inter – alia provided that one of the essential qualifications for making a person eligible to be appointed as a teacher in any of the schools referred to in clause (n) of section 2 of the RTE Act is that he/she should pass the Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) which will be conducted by the appropriate government in accordance with the guidelines framed by the NCTE.

The Ministry of Education, Government of India has entrusted the responsibility of conducting the Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET) to the Central Board of Secondary Education.

The CTET Unit has conducted following examinations in recent past:




MEDIA & PUBLIC RELATIONS

Media & Public Relations

Media and Public Relations Unit of the Board strives to build trust and credibility with students, public and stakeholders by disseminating correct, clear and timely information using various platforms like media, social media, emails etc.

It plays a pro-active role and maintains a positive environment by imparting information, replying promptly with regard to various policies and programs of the Board along with various other notifications related to Examinations, Academic, Affiliation, Trainings and other activities of the Board.



Monitoring of RTI and Public Grievances Redressal

RTI - With effective monitoring and regular follow ups, the average response time to settle RTI has been shortened. It is ensured to best possible extent that stipulations under Proactive and voluntary disclosure are implemented.

- 6580 applications & 624 Appeals were received and disposed of during the year.
- CBSE became the recipient of 95% marks in the online Third Party Audit of Proactive disclosure under RTI Act

2005 which was conducted by National Institute of Technical Teachers Training & Research (NITTTR), Chandigarh on 20.10.2023 for the Appraisal Report for the year 2022-23.

• To sensitize, familiarize and educate the concerned officials about the relevant provision of RTI Act, 2005 for effective discharge of duties and responsibilities, 02 workshops were conducted in the month of January, 2023. Further, one workshop in hybrid mode for all CPIOs/AAs was conducted by the Media & P R Unit on 24.05.2023 at CBSE Headquarters. More than 80 officers and staff of CBSE from various departments and 17 regional offices across the country participated.

Public Grievances Redressal - Online and offline Grievances as registered on CPGRAMS portal related to CBSE are monitored on daily basis and forwarded/ replied within prescribed time limits.

2493 Grievances were disposed of out of 2538 received in the calendar year 2023. With effective monitoring and regular follows ups, the average response time to settle Public Grievances has been shortened to less than 30 days.

CBSE Psychological Well-Being

The CBSE Counselling Program completes 26 years in year 2023. The Board has always been sensitive and proactive regarding mental health and wellness of students. Psychological telecounselling was introduced by the board for the first time in the year 1998 for class 10 and 12 examinees to help the children deal with the exam pressure. The Board has been continuously

providing this free of cost voluntary service through principals and trained counsellors for the last 26 years for the students and parents of affiliated schools located all over the world.

Facilities of Tele-Counseling in 2023

Tele-Counseling: Tele-counseling is a voluntary and free of cost service. In 2023, **87** Principals and Counselors from India and other countries such as Nepal, Japan, United Arab Emirates, Kuwait, Qatar, Oman and Singapore were available for Tele-counseling.



Pariksha Pe Charcha (PPC)



PROPAGATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF OFFICIAL LANGUAGE

ANGUAGE

Iindi workshops were organized on 13.03.20

Official Language Policy is being implemented effectively in the Central Board of Secondary Education. The Hindi Cell is responsible for the implementation of the Official Language Policy of the Government of India and provides necessary inputs/assistance to promote the use of Hindi in day-to-day official work. The Hindi Cell is making efforts to ensure compliance with all the guidelines and policies related to the implementation of the Official Language issued by the Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs. Apart from this, it translates documents issued under Section 3(3) of the Official Language Act, 1963 such as office orders/memorandum/ circulars/press releases/documents etc.

Meeting of Official Language Implementation Committee

Official Language Implementation Committee has been constituted in the Board to implement the instructions effectively issued from time to time to promote the use of Hindi for official purposes of the Union. The meetings of the Official Language Implementation Committee are organized every quarter. In the year, the meeting of the Official Language Implementation Committee was organized in the Board on 24.03.2023, 23.06.2023, 29.09.2023 and 28.12.2023 under the chairmanship of Chairman, CBSE. In the said meetings, the official language work done by the Board was reviewed. (List of members is attached in Annexure)

Organization of Hindi Workshops

As per the Official Language Policy, Hindi workshops are organized every quarter at the Board Headquarters to increase the inclination towards Hindi. The officers/employees participating in the same are encouraged to work in Hindi and the personnels are given working knowledge of Hindi and are guided to use Hindi as much as possible in official work. This year,

Hindi workshops were organized on 13.03.2023, 26.05.2023, 29.08.2023 and 21.11.2023.

Cash Incentive Scheme

As per the directions of Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, Department of Official Language, an incentive scheme is applicable for doing official work in Hindi at the Board Headquarters. Under this scheme, there is a provision to give cash awards (award amount Rs. 5000/-, 3000/- and 2000/-) to officers/employees on the basis of official work done by them in Hindi. This year, these awards were given to 08 personnels of the Board Headquarters.

Official Language Inspection

As per the guidelines given in the annual programme issued by the Department of Official Language and in compliance with the instructions issued by the Hon'ble Committee of Parliament on Official Language, the Board Headquarters conducted official language inspection of at least 25% sections/units/branches and subordinate regional offices. In this inspection programme, the implementation of the Official Language Policy in the concerned sections/units/branches and subordinate regional offices was reviewed and the Branch Head/Regional Officer was informed about the deficiencies found during the inspection.

Hindi Typing Training

In collaboration with Central Hindi Training Institute, New Delhi, the Board nominated and trained the personnels of the Board Headquarters and subordinate regional offices in the long term/ short term intensive/correspondence training program of Hindi typing being run by Central Hindi Training Institute, New Delhi.

Translation Training

In the year 2023, a total of 04 Junior/Senior Translation Officers from the Board Headquarters

and Regional Offices were nominated and trained in the translation related training being run by the Central Translation Bureau.

Hindi Day and Hindi Fortnight

Hindi Day and 3rd All India Official Language Conference were jointly organized on 14th and 15th September 2023 at Shri Chhatrapati Sports Complex Balewadi, Pune, Maharashtra. For this conference, the All India Logo Competition was organized by the Department of Official Language. Various employees from the Board registered their participation in this competition. The logo created by Ms. Renu Kainth, Superintendent was unanimously selected for the first prize by the Selection Committee. On 15th September 2023, Hon'ble Governor Shri Arif Mohammad Khan and Hon'ble Minister of State for Home Affairs Shri Ajay Kumar Mishra honoured Ms. Renu Kainth, Superintendent of the Board. The logo designed by Ms. Renu Kainth was prominently displayed in the conference souvenir and stalls/ exhibitions etc.

In pursuance of the guidelines issued by the Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India and Ministry of Education, Hindi Fortnight was organized from 14.09.2023 to 29.09.2023 to commemorate Hindi Diwas (14 September) at the Board Headquarters. During this period, 06 different competitions such as Hindi Noting & Drafting, Hindi Calligraphy/Dictation, Hindi Poem Recitation, Hindi Essay Writing, Hindi Slogan Writing and Hindi Typing Competition were organized. These competitions had enthusiastic participation from CBSE personnel. 30 winners of these competitions were given prize money and certificates which were distributed during the closing ceremony.

Organization of Hindi Activity

In order to accelerate the promotion of Hindi, many special programs are organized in the modern context of Official Language Hindi by linking it with social responsibility. Under this, Hindi activities are organized every quarter by

various sections in the Board Headquarters on the death anniversary or birthday of famous Hindi litterateurs, writers, poets. Apart from the personnels of the Board Headquarters, Hindi activities are also organized in subordinate regional offices etc. In the year 2023, Hindi activities were organized and during this time, the personnels of the Board Headquarters as well as of the regional offices participated enthusiastically. The personnels discussed the biographies of Hindi litterateurs, poets, their writing style, various compositions / works written by them, the report of which has been uploaded on the CBSE website. This year, Presenting the ideas on the importance of Premchand's works in the current perspective, Hindi activities based on the compositions works of Jaishankar Prasad, Suryakant Tripathi Nirala, Harivanshrai Bachchan etc. were organized.

Notification under Rule 10(4) of Official Language Rules, 1976

Under Rule 10(4) of Official Language Rules, 1976, 04 subordinate regional offices (Regional Offices Pune, Dehradun, Bhopal and Bhubaneswar) of the Board Headquarters have been notified in the Gazette of India.

Thus, the Central Board of Secondary Education is continuously making efforts for the implementation of the Official Language Policy and the promotion of the Official Language Hindi.

EVENTS & PROGRAMMES

New CBSE Regional Office in UAE announced by the Union Minister of Education, Govt. of India

On 02 November 2023 at the Consulate of India, Dubai, Sh. Dharmendra Pradhan, Hon'ble Union Minister of Education, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Govt. of India, addressed a long-standing demand of the overseas CBSE schools and announced the opening of a new CBSE Regional Office in UAE to help in streamlining operations and enhancing the teaching learning experience for students and teachers in the CBSE schools in GCC countries. He congratulated CBSE and the Indian schools in UAE for their achievements in the field of education and creating a good name for the homeland India. The Minister also motivated the principals to come up with the expectations of the leadership of UAE for further strengthening the Indian educational ecosystem at UAE. Sh. Pradhan urged the school leaders to dedicate themselves to the future of the upcoming generation from the Bal Vatika Level, as envisaged in the National Education Policy 2020.



CBSE National Science Exhibition – Winning Teams Felicitated

CBSE organizes Science Exhibition at Regional and National Levels every year. This provides a forum for students to showcase creativity, innovation and inventiveness. This exhibition also provides a medium for popularizing Science and increasing awareness among stakeholders about the close relationship between Science, Technology and Society. The exhibition resumed after a break of 02 years post COVID. In 2023, the theme for the Exhibition was Technology and Toys. 3169 student teams across the country registered to participate. 436 winning teams from the regional rounds at 35 venues across the country and overseas (01 from Doha) participated at the CBSE National Science Exhibition scheduled from 7 - 9 February, 2023 at Lotus Valley School, Gurugram. An expert panel of 12 judges from institutes of eminence reviewed each exhibit.

A total of 30 exhibits were finally selected as winners and the teams were awarded a cash prize of Rupees 5,000/- each and a certificate. 14 teams have been awarded in the Junior (6-8) and Senior (9-11) categories.

Sh. Sanjay Kumar, IAS, Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy along with Smt. Nidhi Chhibber, IAS, Chairperson CBSE interacted with the Principals of CBSE affiliated schools. Principals from across India and abroad joined live interaction through CBSE YouTube channel while more than 250 Principals from Delhi and NCR region were physically present. Setting the context of the interaction, Smt Nidhi Chhibber chairperson CBSE said "As NEP 2020 was launched almost three years ago; it was desirable to know the school experiences to create a wholesome learning environment." The Chairperson said the schools play an important role in maintaining the educational ecosystem by transforming and keeping abreast with changes and strengthening the objectives of NEP 2020 by adapting and adopting the objectives underlined in the policy.




