3. Presentation by the Chairman:

The Chairman made an elaborate presentation on progress of various activities by the Board recently. The major and important issues covered in the presentation of the Chairman are as follows:

3.1 Affiliation: The number of schools affiliated with the Board as on 26.09.2012 was 13296 and this number has increased to 13578 as on 22.01.2013; as such 282 new schools were added to the list of affiliated schools with the Board during said period.

- 3.2 Examination: It was informed that Senior School Certificate Examination, 2013 (Class XIIth) shall be conducted from 01st March, 2013 to 17th April, 2013. There are 6,70,809 candidates registered from 6370 schools. For this, 2202 examination centers have been fixed. The Secondary School Examination-2013 (Class Xth) shall commence in the following manner:-
 - Scheme 1 SA-II: From 16.03.2013 to 31.03.2013.
 - Scheme 2 SA-II: From 01.03.2013 to 15.03.2013.

There are 4,63,891 candidates registered under Scheme 1 and 4,53,552 under Scheme 2 of SA-II. The candidates from 5641 schools of CBSE shall be appearing in this examination and 2124 centers have been fixed for Scheme 2.

The Senior School Certificate (Compartment) examination shall be conducted on 16th July, 2013 and Secondary School (Improvement of Performance) examination (under Scheme 2) shall be conducted from 16th July, 2013.

Number of chances for Class XIIth Compartment has been reduced from five to three and Class Xth Improvement of Performance chance from five to one for candidates appearing in 2013 Examination onwards.

- 3.3 Problem Solving Assessment (PSA) -2013: Problem Solving Assessment will be conducted for the first time for all the students of Class IX and XI and will carry 90 marks for 60 items of Multiple Choice Questions.. The PSA shall be held on 16th February, 2013 for the schools falling in summer bound areas and later for schools falling in winter bound areas.
- 3.4 National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET)-UG, 2013: The first National Eligibility cum Entrance Test for admission to MBBS and BDS Courses in India shall be held on 5th May, 2013 on the basis of syllabus prescribed by the Medical Council of India. There are more than 7,50,000 candidates registered for NEET-UG, 2013. The result of the Test shall be declared by the first week of June, 2013.

- 3.5 Joint Entrance Examination (JEE)-2013: The Joint Entrance Examination for entrance to under graduate programs in Engineering will be held in two parts from 2013.
 - a) JEE (Mains) All candidates.
 - b) JEE (Advanced) Top 1,50,000 candidates (category wise) of JEE (Mains) shall appear for this examination. Admission to IITs will be based on category wise All India Rank in JEE (Advanced) subject to condition that such candidates are in the top 20 percentile (category wise) in their respective Boards/qualifying examination.

Admission to NITs will be based on 40% weightage to total marks (normalized) obtained in class XIIth Board/equivalent examination and 60% weightage to performance in JEE(Main). A combined All India Rank would be decided accordingly. JEE (Main) will be conducted under overall supervision of a committee called JEE Apex Board (JAB) created by the MHRD.

- 3.6 CTET 2012: The last CTET examination of the calendar year 2012 was conducted on 18th November, 2012. There were 1176 centres in 86 cities and one center each in Dubai and Riyadh. There were nearly 9.41 lakh candidates registered and nearly 7.96 lakh candidates appeared in this examination.
- 3.7 Evidence of Assessment: The Board has in the last two years initiated random collection and verification of the Evidence of Assessments for classes IX and X conducted at school levels under Formative and Summative Assessments. The objective is to assess the practices of school based assessment. The schools in all regions have been informed regarding the evidence of assessment to be sent to the Regional Offices and city coordinators which were appointed for the first time for Term I assessments. The evidences were collected for SA I, FA I & FA II in all the five subjects and co-scholastics assessments for classes IX and X. The data from 5552 schools have been received and analyzed.

The detailed statistical analysis carried out by Board were also presented and discussed. The members appreciated the good work done by the Board for ensuring genuine spread of marks as per near normal distribution curve.

- 3.8 Sahodya Schools Conference: The 19th National Annual conference of Sahodya School complexes 2012 was hosted by Indore Sahodya School complex, Indore from 22nd 24th Dec., 2012. The theme of the Conference was "New Pedagogies and enabling technologies for teaching and learning" and 400 delegates participated.
- **3.9 Training Programmes:** For improving standards of in-service teacher education, Training Programmes in the following areas were held:
 - Training programmes on the use of the Formative Assessment manuals.
 - Mentoring & Monitoring training programmes.
 - Capacity Building programmes for the teachers in collaboration with various private agencies in PPP mode.
 - Strategic Leadership and Management Training programmes in collaboration with various management institutes like IIM, IIFT, ETMÁ, NUEPA and also by CBSE
 - Parents Advocacy programmes
- 3.10 Vigilance Awareness Week: The Board observed Vigilance Awareness Week from 29th Oct. to 3rd Nov., 2012. The theme was Transparency in Public Procurement.
- 3.11 TERI Quiz-2012: The CBSE and TERI conducted the Green Olympiad and TERRA Quiz on 25th Aug. & 29th Sep., 2012. The examination was open to students of Class VIII X.
- 3.12 Heritage India Quiz-2012: Heritage India Quiz was initiated in 2001. It is an Inter School Quiz. Conceptualized by the Board with the objective of creating awareness and appreciation in the student community towards the rich cultural heritage and diversity of our country. It is held in multiple phases i.e. city chapter,

regional chapter, national semi-finals and national finals in co-ordination with AETN 18 Media Pvt. Ltd. More than 2500 students from 750 schools participated in Heritage India Quiz-2012.

- 3.13 National Education Day: National Education Day is celebrated every year on 11th November. The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India had declared 11th Nov., as National Education Day in 2008 to commensurate the birth anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, and eminent educationist, a great freedom fighter and the first Education Minister of India.
- **3.14 Waves of Change:** Hon'ble Minister of HRD, Govt. of India, Dr. M. M. Pallam Raju launched the Waves of Change Programme and conferred the first National School Sanitation Awards to top 150 schools on 28th Nov., 2012 at Manekshaw Centre, Delhi Cantt. This award has been instituted by MHRD in collaboration with CBSE and Deutsche Gesellschaft Fur Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ).
- 3.15 Values Education: 'Values Education Kit' for schools based on the framework of "Education for values in schools" by NCERT was launched on 01st Nov., 2012 at India Islamic Centre by Dr. M.M. Pallam Raju, Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource Development, Government of India.
- 3.16 Group Mathematics Olympiad: CBSE conducts Group Mathematical Olympiad in association with Homi Bhabha Centre for Science Education. The Olympiad was held on 02nd Dec., 2012 at 28 centres located in different parts of India and abroad.
- 3.17 Japan-East Asia Network of Exchange for Students and Youth Programme (JENESYS): The JENESYS was started in the year 2007. A group of around 250 students and 16 teachers from the schools affiliated to CBSE from all over India visit Japan annually.
- 3.18 Student Global Aptitude Index (SGAI)-2013: SGAI-2013 was held on 20th January, 2013 approximately 70,000 students were registered from 1063 schools from India and abroad for SGAI-2013.

- 3.19 Science Exhibition: The 9th CBSE Science Exhibition was organised at two different levels: Regional Level and the selected/qualified exhibits from regional levels. The main theme was Science, Society and Environment. The exhibition was inaugurated by Union Minister of HRD and Minister of State, HRD. A total of 24 exhibits were selected at National Level. Each winning team was given a mérit certificate as well as a cash prize of Rs. 3000/-.
- 3.20 Public Relations: The Public Relations Unit has received 561 RTI cases during the period 15th Sept. to 31st December, 2012. The Unit has also received 87 first Appeals and 14 second Appeals during the said period.
- 3.21 Vocational Education: The Board is offering 32 vocational courses consisting of 97 subjects in 313 affiliated schools in India and 11 schools in five countries with coverage of approximately 37,095 students. The curriculum and the content have been developed by the Board in collaboration with different specialized agencies. In the light of NVEQF, the CBSE has initiated a process of reframing its existing vocational courses to ensure cross mobility of students and their absorption in the industry. The scheme of studies for vocational courses at Senior Secondary Level has been revised for all newly introduced vocational course as well as for the existing courses. The Board has also conducted three awareness programmes and two teacher training programmes to sensitize Schools regarding various vocational courses.
- 3.22 Centre for Assessment Evaluation and Research (CAER): The centre is located on the 4th floor, CBSE Building, Rouse Avenue, Delhi. It has been registered as society in December, 2012. The centre has its own website. The recent activities of the centre include the following:
 - Develop the Centre's Professional Development Programme with CBSE schools being the first target cohort and it will be launched in the first quarter of 2013.
 - Two workshops for potential Master Trainers have been held in Delhi and Chennai for the first time.

- Implementation of the Centre's first phase of research-based activity.
- The Centre has worked out a paper on normalizing (standardizing) examination results of various States and National Boards.
- Identified and made contact with Indian universities and organizations/ institutes of interest and relevant expertise.
- 3.23 CBSE-i: The CBSE-i has 24 schools in 8 countries. The CBSE-i curriculum was extended to classes II, VI and X in the academic year 2011-12 in continuation to classes I and IX in the academic year 2010-11. The Board has extended the CBSE-i curriculum for the classes III, VII and XI for the session 2012-13. It will be further extended to classes IV, VIII and XII from the next academic session 2013-14. The CBSE-i Curriculum will be offered to 70 schools in India on a Pilot basis from the academic session 2013-14.
- **4.** The Chairman concluded the presentation and invited attention of the House on the following current agenda items and also opened the House for discussions:

Discussion on Agenda items:

TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE GOVERING BODY OF THE BOARD HELD ON 26th SEPTEMBER, 2012.

The Chairman, CBSE apprised the members about the Minutes of the meeting of the Governing Body held on 26th September, 2012 and after deliberations, the House confirmed the Minutes of the Governing Body Meeting held on 26th September, 2012.

TO RECEIVE A REPORT ON THE FOLLOW UP ACTION TAKEN ON THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY HELD ON 26th SEPTEMBER, 2012.

The Chairman informed the House that action has been taken on all the items as per Resolution passed by the Governing Body at its last meeting held on 26th September, 2012 and most of the action taken reports have been displayed in the presentation. The members deliberated on the

action taken on the last meeting of Governing Body Meeting held on 26th September, 2012 in detail and noted the follow up action taken on the minutes of the last meeting.

ITEM III

TO CONSIDER INCLUSION OF ONE MEMBER IN PLACE OF DR. K. C. SATAPATHY, PRINCIPAL, D.A.V. PUBLIC SCHOOL, CHANDRA SHEKHARPUR, SAILASHREE VIHAR, BHUBANESHWAR FOR SERVING ON THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE BOARD TO BE ELECTED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOARD.

Taking into account the conventions and practices followed in the past, the Governing Body unanimously resolved and authorize the Chairman, CBSE to nominate one member in place of Dr. K. C. Satapathy, to serve on the Finance Committee of the Board.

ADD. ITEM I

TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE EXAMINATION COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 14TH JANUARY, 2013.

The Controller of Examinations, CBSE apprised the members about the recommendations of the Examination Committee held on 14th January, 2013. He particularly invited the attention of the House on the item in respect of restrictions in up-scaling grade points obtained by candidates in scholastic subjects on the basis of grade points obtained in co-scholastic areas. As per the resolution passed by the Examination Committee the number of students who can avail such upscaling has been limited to top most 5% of the total number of students appearing in the Examination from a School.

He further invited attention of the House in respect of making the students appear in both the Summative Assessments compulsorily and also to obtain minimum percentage of marks to qualify the Assessments. He stated that to convey correct meaning of both Formative & Summative Assessment and to ensure quality of teaching & learning, it is necessary that children appear in both the Summative

Assessments. He also stated that a student who has obtained at least 25% marks in the Summative Assessments taken together will only be eligible to qualify the examinations.

Dr.(Mrs.) Shyama Chona, Former Principal, Delhi Public School, R.K. Puram, New Delhi stated that if up-scaling is limited only 5% candidates in a school, it may affect result of Schools where there are large number of students who are genuinely good at co-scholastic area.

Shri Apurva Chandra, Joint Secretary, MHRD expressed his opinion that putting a limit in up-scaling is essential to ensure quality. Such steps will in any case affect some students favourably and adversely hence, the Board may use statistical analysis for taking realistic decisions regarding deciding the percentage of students of School whom the benefit be extended.

Mrs. Gunmeet Bindra, Principal, Welham Boys School, Dehradun, Uttrakhand expressed the opinion that putting a limit to up-scaling will help avoid misuse of such provisions.

The Chairman, CBSE clarified the House that the decisions taken by the Examination Committee are for ensuring quality and minimum standards of Assessments and further modifications if any required in the scheme can be considered after seeing the result of implementing the scheme at its first year. He, however, assured members that if any individual case is brought where Co-scholastic achievement is exceptional, the Board will look into it favourably.

The House, after discussions, resolved to approve the recommendations of the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 14th January, 2013.

ADD. ITEM II TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE AFFILIATION COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 14TH JANUARY, 2013.

The Chairman, CBSE apprised the House about the recommendations of the Affiliation Committee held on 14th January, 2013 and invited attention of the House on the Resolutions passed by the Affiliation Committee. He stated that the decision regarding appointment of regular Health Wellness Teacher, Coordinator for CCE and Physical Education Teacher has been made mandatory for the schools seeking fresh affiliation with immediate effect; all the existing affiliated schools including government schools will implement the decision within three years time period.

The Chairman apprised the House that there is an urgent need to give importance to Teachers involved in development of co-scholastic areas of students, hence the decision has also been taken to change the nomenclature of Physical Education Teacher as TGT's as per the minutes of the Affiliation Committee.

The Chairman, CBSE also informed the House that the Board is considering to make necessary provisions in the Affiliation Byelaws on the basis of Right to Education Act, 2009 for adoption/adaptation of time table, staff norms and work in the light of school based Assessment under CCE. He has stated that RTI stipulates for 45 working hours be spent by a teacher in the school and the Kendriya Vidyalya Sangathan has already implemented the same hence, there is a need to implement it in all the affiliated schools of CBSE uniformly.

Dr. K.P. Gopalkrishna expressed the opinion that increasing the working hours of teachers will over burden the teachers and eventually, it will affect their performance in the long run.

The Chairman clarified that the objective of bringing new provisions to increase the working hours in schools is in fact to unburden the teachers. Teacher spending quality time in school will work better as they will get better facilities and resources to perform duty in the school.

Further, the Chairman, CBSE apprised the House that the Affiliation Committee has taken a decision to amend Affiliation Byelaws to the effect that in classes I-VIII in the event of selecting text-books of private publishers by a School, its Manager and Principal will publish the list of such books on the website of the school along with a written declaration that they have gone through the contents of the books selected by the school and they own the responsibility of its contents. The above decision has been taken to avoid use of text-books with objectionable contents in the affiliated schools of the Board. This will be further subject to the RTE Act 2010.

After detailed discussions the House resolved that the decisions of the Affiliation Committee held on 14th January, 2013 be approved.

ADD. ITEM III TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 14TH JANUARY, 2013.

The Chairman, CBSE apprised the House about the recommendations of the Finance Committee held on 14th January, 2013. The House was informed about the opening of 9th Regional Office of the Board at Trivandrum to cater the needs of Kerala from where more than one thousand schools are affiliated with CBSE. It was also apprised to the House that the requirement of Regional Offices at other places will be assessed by a Committee and on the basis of recommendations of the Committee further decisions will be taken.

Further the House was apprised about framing of Recruitment Rules for the posts of Controller of Examinations, Director (Edusat, Research Development & Vocational Education) and Regional Director. This was necessitated due to the decision taken by the Governing Body at its last meeting for creation of the posts of Regional Director at the level of Head of the Department as well as creation of Academic cadre in the Board.

The Chairman, CBSE also invited the attention of the House on the item for creation of Inspection Wing at Regional Offices for Academic evaluation of Schools to stop Academic malpractices, and Academic inspection has to be a continuous activity throughout the year. The newly created Regional staff of Academic Wing at the Regional Offices will also be part of this Wing.

Further the attention of the House was also invited on the proposals approved by the Finance Committee for setting up of CBSE National Institute for Continuous Professional Development and hiring of accommodation at Gurgaon, proposal for development and practice of Technology Augmented Learning and Education Environment Management (TALEEM), Proposal for development of age appropriate, gender sensitivity cards from classes I – XII and Teachers hand book on gender sensitivity, Institution of award for excellence in implementation of CCE to Schools, etc.

After detailed discussions the House resolved that the decisions of the Finance Committee held on 14th January, 2013 be approved.

ADD. ITEM IV

TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CURRICULUM COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 15TH JANUARY, 2013.

The Director (Academic & Training), CBSE apprised the members about the recommendations of the Curriculum Committee held on 15th January, 2013 and particularly invited attention of the House on the

decision taken by the Curriculum Committee for making major modification in the Curriculum document 2015. As per the Curriculum document 2015, there will be no Sample Question Paper for classes IX-XII and instead, the Board will develop Question Bank. Also there will no blue print and no individual mark allocation for chapters as it leads to teaching to test. There will be broad guidelines for the practical subjects and projects for all the subjects and assessments of speaking and listening skills in English.

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Further the Director (Academic & Training) briefed the House about the proposal regarding the open text examination in CBSE Schools from the Academic Session 2013-14. It was explained to the House that the scheme is implemented on the basis of recommendations made by a Committee headed by Fr. T.V Kunnunkal, Former Chairman, CBSE. As per the scheme the examination will be based on case study approach. The text will be uploaded on the website and School can make use of this text material for teaching and learning. But the students will not be allowed to carry this material at the examination centre. It will be part of the Question Paper in selected subjects for 20-25% from the 2014 Examination.

The attention of the House was also invited on the proposals approved by the Curriculum Committee regarding extension of the Pilot Project of Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills from 120 Schools to all the Schools affiliated to CBSE, Organisation of a Pilot on English Language Skills Test for 2000 students of classes XI and XII by the British Council on complimentary basis, Organisation of 6 months online English Language Skills and English Teaching course for 150 Teachers from the Schools affiliated to CBSE by Cengage Edu Tech-National Geographic/ Edu Tech on complimentary basis, Introduction of NCC and NSS as a compulsory component in the curriculum, Proposal for recycling of paper waste generated at CBSE including Regional Offices with the help of NGO's working in the field and use

the stationary and other items produced for office consumption and installing Paper Recycling Plant at later stage.

The Chairman, CBSE briefed the House about the changes in the Curriculum of Vocational subjects based on the recommendations of the Committee of courses. It was also apprised to the House that the Curriculum Committee has approved a proposal with regard to make agricultural based curriculum in the subject of Science and Maths for class IX and X with the help of Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR).

Detailed discussions were also held on the decision taken by the Curriculum Committee regarding the language policy followed in CBSE Schools. Though there are demands for making Hindi Language compulsory upto class X, the Curriculum Committee has decided to continue with the existing language policy as the CBSE is primarily catering to the educational needs of wards of those persons who are on transferrable jobs. Hence, making any one language compulsory may adversely affect career of children who may move from one State to another as different State Governments may insist for compulsory teaching of different languages in Schools.

Further, the Chairman, CBSE briefed the House about the proposals for recruitment of Mentors for the NVEQF Pilot phase implementation in CBSE Schools, Proposal of developing digital and multimedia content for Vocational courses, Implementation of four Vocational courses under National Vocational Education Qualification Framework in the subjects of Retail, Security, Information Technology and Automobile Technology from the session 2013-14, Proposal for empanelling skill knowledge providers for effectively offering Vocational courses, etc.

The House after detailed deliberations resolved that the recommendations of the Curriculum Committee held on 15th January, 2013 be approved.

ADD. ITEM V TO RECOMMEND THE NAME(S) OF SUITABLE PERSONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF HEAD, CENTRE FOR ASSESSMENT, EVALUATION AND RESEARCH (CAER), CBSE POSITION.

The Chairman, CBSE informed the House that the Board has established a Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research (CAER) through Public Private Partnership to develop international capabilities and resources for its Schools and Teachers. For this purpose, the Central Board of Secondary Education and Pearson Charitable Foundation has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on 27th July, 2012.

As per the MoU the Head of CAER is to be appointed by the Board through the due process of search—cum-selection method. In this regard, an open advertisement has also been issued by the Board and it was proposed by the Chairman that Board may recommend name(s) of suitable persons to be on the Search-cum-Selection Committee for the appointment of Head, Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research (CAER), CBSE position.

The House considered the item and resolved to authorize the Chairman, CBSE to nominate on the Search-cum-Selection Committee and action taken after selection of the Head of CAER be reported at the next meeting of the House for ratification.

The Chairman, CBSE further opened the floor of the House for discussions on matters of general interest.

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Dr. K.P Gopalkrishna stated that Pearson Foundation is engaged in various business activities in India in the field of Education, hence CBSE may be careful about misuse of Board's name for expansion of their business interest. He has further stated that there is

acute shortage of Mandarin language teachers in the Country, hence some measures may be taken to overcome the issue.

Replying to the issues raised by Dr. K.P Gopalkrishna, the Chairman, CBSE stated that Pearson Foundation was selected as partner of CBSE in setting up of Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research through an open process. Subsequents, the representatives of the Company at their highest level has been made to understand that they should not use CBSE name outside CAER and this will be displayed on the website of CBSE to avoid any conflict of interest. Avoiding conflict of interest has also be appropriately advised in the MoU. As far as shortage of teachers in Mandarin language he has informed that the Government of China and the Ministry of External Affairs are offering their assistance for teachers training to overcome the issue and now an MoU has been signed between CBSE and Embassy China.

Mrs. Helen Acharya, Acting Secretary, Sangeet Natak Academy, suggested that for promoting the intangible cultural heritage, curriculum to teach culture and heritage be modified at School level. It was also proposed by her that an MoU can be signed in this regard between Sangeet Natak Academy and CBSE.

The Chairman, CBSE responded that the suggestion of Mrs. Helen Acharya is a welcome step and offered all cooperation for partnering with Sangeet Natak Academy for development of curriculum of cultural heritage from classes I to X as well as XI and XII.

Dr. Shyama Chona invited the attention of the House on the following issues relating to School education:

- The state of library in Schools needs to be improved to promote reading habit among students. The qualification, salary, service condition and strength of library staff etc. also needs to be clearly defined.
- 2. As part of gender sensitization, modules may be created for children of all level and teachers teaching all the classes for sex education to enable effective handling of the topic by the teachers as in the presence scenario teachers are not aware how to handle sex education in class room.

 To utilize course and curriculum of Vocational Education for the disabled to make them financially independent.

She also invited attention of the House for introduction of Vocational courses in the emerging alternative energy resources such as solar lighting, solar heating etc. for which the CBSE may seek the assistance of other educational Institutions and Universities at higher education sector.

The Chairman, CBSE responded that the CBSE, as of now, does not offer sex education. Rather life skills education is offered extensively. He stated that the suggestions for empowering teachers to handle gender sensitive issues will be looked into.

Mrs. Gunmeet Bindra suggested that the result of evaluation of CCE conducted in different Schools may be displayed on the website of CBSE and the same may be printed in the CENBOSEC to remove the misconception against CCE and also to promote best practices in Schools.

Mrs. Avnita Bir stated that CBSE needs to create more facilitation centres in Mumbai for helping the aspirants of NEET and JEE entrance examinations. Since State Government is also using the results of these exams, State Government institutions may also be considered as facilitation centres.

The Chairman, CBSE informed that this aspect will be looked into for future examinations.

Dr. Sunita Kaushik, Add. Director of Education, Delhi requested that martial arts may be included compulsorily in the curriculum of Health and Physical Education.

The Chairman, CBSE replied that at present there are eight activities included for assessment under Health and Physical Education in Secondary School curriculum and martial arts can also be included as one of the activities under the subject. He further

suggested that the Delhi Government Schools may compulsorily select martial arts if there is such a policy of the Directorate of Education, Delhi.

Smt. Suniti Sharma stated that there should be some provision of giving another chance to those students who are not able to appear in the PSA.

The Chairman, CBSE clarified that if the students do not appear in PSA they will not get any marks and there can not be any other supplementary examination for such students. He has informed that the students should be encouraged to take part in the assessments for proper evaluation of their skills. He, however, assured to look into the matter.

Dr. K.P Gopalkrishna requested the attention of the House on the functioning of the Committee appointed by the Tamil Nadu Government for regulation of fees in unaided private Schools in the State. He has stated that the Committee is not properly hearing the problems of Private Schools in fee fixation matter especially the ratio of teachers in Public Schools, therefore he has sought the intervention of CBSE and MHRD in the matter.

Shri Apurva Chandra, Joint Secretary, MHRD responded that if the matter is referred to the Ministry by the CBSE, the issue can be taken up with the State Government of Tamil Nadu.

The Chairman, CBSE thanked all the members of the House, the Joint Secretary, MHRD and other participants for their valuable contributions.

The meeting thereafter ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

ITEM IV: TO CONSIDER THE OPINION OF THE COMMITTEE FOR MAKING IT MANDATORY FOR APPEARING IN SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENTS AND THE PERCENTAGE OF MARKS REQUIRED TO QUALIFY THE ASSESSMENTS

The Members were apprised that letter No. DE.5(31)/2005/Exam/804 dated 22.6.2012 had been received from Directorate of Education. Delhi seeking clarification whether appearance in SA I & SA II examinations should be made mandatory for class IX & X and minimum pass percentage in SA I and SA II be fixed, in addition to other clarifications. The Members were further informed that though the following criteria has been adopted while calculating class X result in 2012 as approved by the Result Committee, a Committee consisting of Shri B M Gupta, Advisor(IT). CBSE, Delhi, Dr.Sunita Kaushik, Addl. Director of Education(Exams), Dte of Education, Delhi, Ms. Gunmeet Bindra, Principal, Welham Boys School, Dehradun & Member of the Governing Body of the Board, Shri P I Sabu. Regional Officer, CBSE, Delhi, Shri M K Arora, Deputy Secretary(Coord). CBSE, Delhi, Mrs. Kavita Vazirani, Assistant Secretary(Coord), CBSE, Delhi was constituted. As Mrs. Gunmeet Bindra showed her inability to attend the meeting due to pre-occupation. Shri L V Sehgal, Principal, Bal Bharti Public School, Rajinder Nagar, New Delhi was then co-opted as Member but he too could not attend the meeting due to pre-occupation-

The Members were informed that the Committee met on 5.11.2012 and deliberated on the issues raised by the Directorate of Education, Delhi in their letter of 22.6.2012 as also letter dated 13.9.2012 received from the Principal, Hans Raj Model School, Punjabi Bagh, New Delhi requesting to consider exempting the national players from appearing in the Summative or Formative Assessments in conjunction with:

- a) the criteria being adopted by the Board for declaration of result for class 9 and 10 i.e. after combining the marks obtained by a student in all the four Formative and two Summative assessments and converting the total into grade(s),
- b) Comparative statistics relating to the number of students passed in class X in the year 2012 before upgradation of grades and after upgradation of grades & relative increase or decrease in percentage of students passing in the event of making compulsory to obtain atleast 20 – 30 percent marks in both the Summative Assessments as under:

c) the provision of DIRECTORATE OF EDUCATION, Delhifor awarding GRACE MARKS in classes IX to XI which is as under:

<u>For class IX to XI</u>: Maximum 10 marks in all subjects but not more than 5 in one subject provided a student obtains 25% marks in annual examination in each subject

The Committee Members have opined that in order to maintain the sanctity of the examinations:

i) it should be made mandatory for a student to appear in both the Summative Assessments;

- ii) a student should have to obtain atleast 25% marks in the Summative Assessments to be eligible to qualify the examination i.e. atleast 15 marks out of 60 marks;
- iii) decisions at (i) & (ii) above may be made applicable for class IX session 2013-2014 and class X 2014-2015
- iv) grace marks as per the policy of the Board for class X may also be given by the schools in class IX;
- v) in respect of students participating in sports at national level, exemption from appearing in any one Summative Assessment may be granted subject to prior approval of the Board provided the student will be participating in sports at national level organized by recognized federations/CBSE/SGFI and being held during the month of the conduct of the Summative Assessment. In such case, the marks obtained in one SA shall also be indicated for the 2nd SA by the Board. The school shall fill in the relevant field with ZERO(0) marks. In the hard copy remark be given against such student supported with necessary documents; as regards attendance requirement, school may take action as per rule 14 of the Examination Byelaws.

The Members were also informed that after implementation of the recommendations of the Committee, the candidates would be eligible to appear for Improvement of Performance as per the existing policy.

After deliberating in detail on the recommendations of the Committee constituted by the Board, the Examination Committee resolved to accept the recommendations except recommendation at sl. No. (iv) i.e. "grace marks as per the policy of the Board for class X may also be given by the schools in class IX" which may remain the prerogative of the Board;

ITEM V: TO CONSIDER RESTRICTING UPSCALING IN SCHOLASTIC SUBJECTS BY VIRTUE OF GRADE POINTS OBTAINED IN CO-SCHOLASTIC AREAS/ACTIVITIES BY ABOUT 5% OF CANDIDATES SPONSORED BY A SCHOOL FOR CLASS X EXMINATION

The Members were apprised that according to the revised manual for teachers on CCE for classes IX and X effective from session 2011-12 for class IX and subsequent session 2012-13 for class-X, assessment in all coscholastic areas/activities has to be done on 5 point scale. Besides, the total domains of assessment in co-scholastic areas/ activities has also been slightly modified. Consequently, the maximum grade points which a student can obtain in co-scholastic areas/activities is 65 as compared to 42 in the earlier scheme. The table given below compares the earlier scheme and the revised scheme of assessment in co-scholastic areas/activities.

This change in total maximum grade points obtained by any student in co-scholastic areas/ activities demanded revision in policy for upscaling of grades in scholastic areas on the basis of total grade points obtained in co-scholastic areas/activities. Schools have been requested to follow the below scheme for upscaling the grades in scholastic areas vide Circular No. 09/2012 CBSE/CE/CCE/2012 January 19th, 2012:

- those Students who get total grade points in co-scholastic areas/ activities in the range 53-65 may benefit by getting upgraded to the next higher grade in two subjects in scholastic areas,
- b) those students who get total grade points in the range 40-52, may benefit by getting upgraded to the next higher grade in one subject in scholastic area.
- c) the upscaling of Grade in Scholastic Areas is applicable in Main Subject only (i.e. excluding Additional 6th Subject).
- d) no Grade should be upscaled twice.
- e) no upscaling be done if the Grade obtained in the subject is E2 or A1.
- f) upscaling be done from lowest grade to next higher grade and so on. (Example: E1 be upscaled to D, D to C2, C2 to C1, C1 to B2, B2 to B1, B1 to A2 and A2 to A1)
- g) in case of tie in Grades in two or more subjects (i.e. if Grades obtained are same), the upscaling be done in following order:
- Higher marks obtained in the subject be preferred

- In case of tie in marks, higher marks obtained in Summative Assessments (SA1+SA2)
- In case of tie in Summative Assessments marks, higher marks obtained in Formative Assessments (FA1+FA2+FA3+FA4)
- h) benefit be given to the students who win I/II positions/prizes in competitions held at state level and/or participation in competitions held at national/international level organised by a body recognized by the state/central Government/CBSE. Any competition organised by such agencies related to the co-scholastic areas/activities included in the Board's CCE card may be considered for giving this benefit. Those students who qualify under this provision will benefit by getting their grade up-scaled to the next higher grade in two subjects provided this benefit has not been given to the student under the aforesaid grade point scheme.

The Members were also apprised of the report of an inhouse study conducted by the Board on the basis of the Class X result based on the statistics from 2008 - 2012 examinations wherein it was observed that 15% or more candidates had secured 10 CGPA spread over 1399 schools out of 10970 schools affiliated to it after the introduction of Grading/CCE systems in 2010. From the statistics, following had also been observed-

- a) after upgradation the percentage of candidates securing 9.8 CGPA had decreased and those securing 10 CGPA had increased,
- b) there had been constant increase in the percentage of candidates securing 95 & above marks irrespective of the introduction of the Grading and CCE schemes.

It had also been observed that in large number of cases subjects in Scholastic Area had been upscaled by virtue of Grade Points obtained in Co-Scholastic Areas/Activities as per the policy of upscaling resulting in increase in the number of candidates getting CGPA 10.

In order to improve the quality of assessment in Co-scholastic areas/activities, Members resolved that the number of candidates to be upscaled be restricted to about 5% of the total number of candidates sponsored by a school for Class X examination as per the following criteria:

- Method of calculating Grade Points in Co-scholastic areas/activities would remain the same
- ➢ Board would consider up-scaling the Grades in Scholastic areas of the top 5% candidates. For example if there are 100 candidates in the range of 53 65 only the first 5 candidates getting 65 or 64 or 63, as the case may be, would be given the benefit of upscaling in two subjects
- > In case of a tie, all candidates getting that mark will be considered for upscaling

ITEM VI: TO CONSIDER ISSUING ONE DUPLICATE DOCUMENT TO VISUALLY HANDICAPPED CANDIDATES WITHOUT CHARGING FEES

The Members were informed that Visually handicapped candidates appearing for the Board's examinations are exempted from paying the examination and verification of marks/grades fees as on date.

After considering the above, the Committee appreciated the proposal of the Board stating that it will be a step forward towards facilitating the visually handicapped candidates of Classes XII & X and resolved that they be issued the duplicate documents one time without charging the requisite fee.

ITEM VII:

TO CONSIDER THE REQUEST RECEIVED FROM SPRINGDALES SCHOOL, DHAULA KUAN, NEW DELHI FOR CHANGE OF SUBJECT FROM MATHEMATICS TO FOUNDATION OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY IN RESPECT OF MASTER KEYSHAAV RASTOGI, SAURAV JEENA & KUMARI SANYA KATARIA, STUDENTS OF CLASS X, 2013 EXAMINATION

The Committee was apprised that as per the Curriculum for Secondary School Examination the learning areas include:

(1) and (2) Two Languages out of :

Hindi, English, Assamese, Bengali, Gujrati, Kannada, Kashmiri, Marathi, Malayalam Manipuri, Oriya, Punjabi, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu, Urdu, Lepcha, Limbu, Bhutia, Sanskrit, Arabic, Persian, French, German, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Nepali, Tibetan, Mizo, Tangkhul and Bodo

- (3) Mathematics
- (4) Science
- (5) Social Science
- (6) Work Education or Pre-Vocational Education
- (7) Art Education
- (8) Physical and Health Education

ADDITIONAL SUBJECTS

Students may offer any one of the following as an additional subject:

Language other than the two compulsory languages (offered as subjects of study)

OR

Commerce, Painting, Music, Home Science or Foundation of Information Technology.

As per Rule 24(iii) of the Examination Byelaws Candidates with visual and hearing impairment, Spastic, Dyslexic, Autistic and candidates with disabilities as defined in the Persons with Disabilities Act, 1995have the option of studying one compulsorylanguage as against two. This language should be in consonance with the overall spirit of the three Language Formula prescribed by the Board. Beside one language any four of the following subjects can be offered:

Mathematics, Science, Social Science, another language, Music, Painting, Home Science, Foundation of Information Technology, Commerce (Elements of Business) & Commerce (Elements of Book Keeping and Accountancy)

The Members were apprised of the request received from Springdales School, DhaulaKuan, New Delhi requesting to consider the change of subject from Mathematics to Foundation of Information Technology in respect of Master KeyshaavRastogi, SauravJeena&SanyaKataria as they are unable to cope up with the pressure of the subject and to avoid undue hardship to the students.

The Committee examined the request in relation to the Curriculum and relaxations being extended by the Board. The Members also deliberated on the need of learning Mathematics upto Secondary level. They were of the opinionthat a student should have basic knowledge of Mathematics hence it is essential for him to continue this subject upto Secondary level. The Committee resolved as under:

- the Board may ask for the reasons from the parents in writing through the school and then the candidates be permitted change of subject from Mathematics to Foundation of Information Technology; and
- 2) the Board may consider having the curriculum in the subject of Mathematics at two levels i.e. higher and lower levels which will facilitate students either not desirous of taking up Mathematics at higher levels or who are not able to do well in Mathematics to overcome this block. This be referred to the Curriculum Committee for consideration.

ITEM VIII: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN REVISING RULE 42(i)(b) OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS RELATING TO IMPROVEMENT OF PERFORMANCE FOR CLASS X

The Members were informed that Rule 42(i)(b) of the Examination Byelaws relating to Improvement of Performance for class X had been amended in the Examination Committee's meeting held on 22.6.2010 and again on 26.4.2011. While proposing further amendment in the said rule in the Examination Committee's meeting held on 30.5.2012 the rule amended on 22.6.2010 had been taken as existing rule instead of the rule amended on 26.4.2011 which had resulted in getting the wrong rule

amended on 30.5.2012 and subsequently included in the Notification dated 28.6.2012. The correct rule as under has been circulated as Corrigendum to Notification dated 28.6.2012:

ITEM IX:

TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN GRANTING ONE TIME EXCEPTION FOR 2011 PASS OUTS OF CLASS XII ASPIRING TO APPEAR FOR JEE(MAIN) TO APPEAR FOR IMPROVEMENT OF PERFORMANCE IN 2013 IN VIEW OF THE REVISED SCHEME OF JEE(MAIN)

The Members were informed that as per the revised scheme of JEE(Main), 2013 for admission to National Institutes of Technology(NITs), Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CFTIs) like IIITs etc. and participating Institutions, the merit/rank list will be prepared based on 40 per cent weightage to Board marks and 60 percent weightage to JEE(Main). The number of attempts which a candidate can avail at JEE(Main), is limited to three uniformly for all the candidates in consecutive years. The candidates passed +2 exam in 2011 or 2012 or appearing in +2 in 2013 are only eligible to appear in JEE(Main) – 2013.

Candidates passed +2 in 2010 or before or appearing in 2014 are not eligible to appear in JEE(Main) – 2013.

The Members were also apprised of Rule 44.1(i) of the Examination Byelaws whereby the candidates desirous of improving their performance can do so only in the succeeding year.

The Members were informed that in view of the revised scheme for Admission to Undergraduate Engineering Programmes in IITs, NITs and other Centrally Funded Technical Institutions, etc. and the number of attempts for JEE(Main), in order to facilitate the candidates who have passed Class XII examination in 2011 and desirous of appearing for the JEE(Main) – 2013, one time exception has been given for Improving their Performance in 2013 in all subjects irrespective whether the candidate had already taken a chance for Improvement of Performance in 2012 in relaxation of the above rule of Examination Byelaws. The schedule for sending the application by such candidates had been as that of other candidates for 2013 examination, which is as under:

TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN REVISING THE SCHEDULE FOR RECEIPT OF LIST OF CANDIDATES AND APPLICATION FORMS FOR 2013 EXAMINATION IN VIEW OF THE REVISED SCHEME FOR JEE(MAIN)

The Members were informed that as per the revised scheme of JEE(Main) for admission to National Institutes of Technology(NITs), Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CFTIs) like IIITs etc. and participating Institutions, the merit/rank list will be prepared based on 40 per cent weightage to Board marks and 60 percent weightage to JEE(Main). The number of attempts which a candidate can avail at JEE(Main) is limited to three uniformly for all the candidates in consecutive years. The candidates passed +2 exam in 2011 or 2012 or appearing in +2 in 2013 are only eligible to appear in JEE(Main) – 2013. Candidates passed +2 in 2010 or before or appearing in 2014 are not eligible to appear in JEE(Main) – 2013. Admission to IITs will be based

only on category wise All India Rank in JEE(Advanced) subject to condition that such candidates are in the top percentile in class XII conducted by their Boards in applicable categories.

The Members were also apprised that in view of the revised scheme for Admission to Undergraduate Engineering Programmes in IITs, NITs and other Centrally Funded Technical Institutions, etc. many of the candidates, who have passed the Class XII Board examination in 2012 and wished to improve upon their performances, were required to improve in all subjects as per Scheme of Studies so as to come under the bracket of 20 percentile. The cut off marks of students from CBSE affiliated schools for 2012 examination(categorywise) is as under:

The Members were also informed that those candidates who had already submitted their application form to the Board for Improvement of Performance in subjects less than five subjects and were desirous of also appearing for the JEE in 2013 had been requested to send their application for remaining subjects for Improvement of Performance alongwith the balance fee to the Regional Office concerned, as for the purposes of JEE(Main) or JEE(Advanced) a candidate, if appearing for improvement of

performance, is required to appear in all subjects as per the scheme of studies of CBSE.

The Committee ratified the decision taken by the Board.

ITEM XI: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN COMPUTING THE MARKS ON PRO-RATA BASIS IN THE SUBJECT OF BUSINESS STUDIES W.E.F. 2013 EXAMINATION IN RESPECT OF FAILURE/COMPARTMENTAL/IMPROVEMENT CANDIDATES & FRESH PRIVATE CANDIDATES UNDER DELHI REGION

The Members were informed that vide Circular No. Acad-9(ACAD/CBSE/EO(C)/2012) dated 2.5.2012 the schools have been apprised of the Guidelines for the Project Work which has been introduced in the subject of Business Studies w.e.f. 2013 examination of Classes XI & XII. The Project Work will be for 10 marks and evaluated by an External as well as an Internal Examiner.

The Members were informed that as the failure/compartmental/Improvement candidates & fresh private candidates under Delhi Region who will appear in 2013 examination would not have done the Project Work of 10 marks, it has been decided that such candidates will be permitted to appear for the theory examination consisting of 90 marks as per the Senior School Curriculum prescribed for 2013 examination and the theory marks obtained by these candidates out of 90 will be computed to be out of 100 through Computer Programme at the time of finalization of result. Also as is being done in the subject of Accountancy, the result of regular candidates in the subject of Business Studies will also be declared combining the marks obtained in theory as well as project out of maximum 100 marks.

The Committee ratified the decision taken by the Board.

ITEM XII: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN CORRECTING THE DATE OF BIRTH FROM 21.8.1992 TO 21.10.1992 IN RESPECT OF MASTER RISHABH GARG ROLL NO. 6166306 OF 2009.

The Members were informed that representation had been received from Shri Sanjay Kumar vide his letter dated 15.5.2012 for correction of date of birth in respect of his son Master RishabhGarg bearing Roll No. 6166306 of 2009. The date of birth as recorded in the Birth Certificate No. 4526 issued by Local Registrar Births & Deaths, Bhatinda on 30.10.1992 and as per the school record is 21.10.1992 whereas the Date of Birth recorded in the documents issued by the Board is 21.8.1992. The birth certificate had also been got verified from the issuing authority who vide letter dated 31.10.2012 had confirmed its authenticity.

The Members were apprised that as resolved by the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 10.9.2012 and approved by the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 26.9.2012, the case was placed before a Committee consisting of Assistant Secretary(Coord), Assistant Secretary(Legal) and Prof. A K Bhatnagar, Member of the Examination Committee to examine the case. The Committee met on 16.11.2012 and observed that though the correction in date of birth is in order there is variation in the father's/mother's name. The father's name is recorded as "Sanjoy" in the Birth Certificate instead of "Sanjay" and the mother's name as "Anchal" instead of "Bindu" as recorded in the school and documents issued by the Board. The clarifications received from the applicant were again placed before the said Committee on 29.11.2012 which examined the clarifications received from the applicant in the form of the affidavit, copy of passport/election card/result cum detailed Marks Card of MA Part I of Punjabi University where the candidate's mother's name has been recorded as "Bindu" and as regards the father's spelling "Sanjay". After perusal of the documents and the clarifications, the Committee observed that the clarifications were in order and recommended for correction in date of birth in respect of Master Rishabh Garg Roll No. 6166306 OF 2009 from 21.8.1992 to 21.10.1992.

The Committee ratified the action taken by the Board.

ITEM XIII: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN CORRECTING THE CANDIDATE'S/FATHER'S/MOTHER'S NAME IN RESPECT OF EIGHT CANDIDATES OF REGIONAL OFFICE, AJMER IN RELAXATION OF RULE 69.1(ii) OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Members were informed that requests from the following had been received for correction in candidate's/father's/mother's name after 10 years of passing the examination. As per Rule 69.1(ii) of the Examination Byelaws correction is allowed within ten years of passing the examination. Being minor corrections, the same have been permitted by the Competent Authority of the Board in relaxation of Rule 69.1(ii) of the Examination Byelaws. Details are as under:

ITEM XIV: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN CORRECTING THE DATE OF BIRTH IN RESPECT OF MASTER MANPREET SINGH ROLL NO. 6143145/2005 OF REGIONAL OFFICE, DELHI IN RELAXATION OF RULE 69.1(iv) OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Members were informed that as per Rule 69.1(iv) of the Examination Byelaws correction in date of birth is allowed within five years of passing the examination. They were also informed that request had been received from Master Manpreet Singh for correction in date of birth from 30.4.1987 to 30.4.1988,an inhouse Committee was constituted by Regional Office, Delhi to verify the records which verified the records and found them in order and recommended for correction in date of birth in relaxation of Rule 69.1(iv) of the Examination Byelaws. Accordingly the correction has been carried out by the Board.

The Committee ratified the decision taken by the Board.

ITEM XV: TO CONSIDER THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE CONSITUTED BY THE BOARD IN LOOKING INTO TWO CASES RELATING TO CORRECTION IN DATE OF BIRTH IN RESPECT OF KUMARI SARANYA R NAIR ROLL NO. 4135266 OF 2006 AND KUMARI NEHARIKA JAIN ROLL NO. 8207377 OF 2011

The Members were informed that the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 10.9.2012 vide ITEM III - TO CONSIDER THE OPINION RECEIVED FROM THE LEGAL ADVISOR FOR CORRECTION IN DATE OF BIRTH ON THE BASIS OF CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY REGISTRAR, BIRTH & DEATH, A STATUTORY BODY has resolved that cases relating to change in date of birth may be referred to a Committee, preferably consisting of one member of the Examination Committee. The Board would verify the genuineness of the date of birth certificate issued by a statutory body and submit the case to the Committee for consideration. The recommendation so received from the Committee shall be placed before the Competent Authority for approval and the approval shall be placed before the Examination Committee for ratification. Accordingly the Committee consisting of Prof. A K Bhatnagar, Member Exam Committee, Assistant Secretary(Legal) and Assistant Secretary(Coordn) had been constituted.

As per the Minutes of the Committee, the Committee has observed and recommended the following:

1. Kumari Saranya R Nair Class X Roll No. 4135266 of 2006

Correction in date of birth from 28.5.1991 to 28.5.1990 on the basis of the Birth certificate issued by Government of Kerala, Department of Urban Affairs, Thiruvananthapuram Corporation on 18.2.2011. The case has been received through Dr. ShashiTharoor, in his capacity as Member of Parliament(LokSabha) vide letter No. 1612/GI/2012/Ptn. dated 24.9.2012. As stated by the parent in his representation the case has been rejected by Regional Office(Chennai) stating that five years have elapsed hence the correction cannot be carried out.

As stated by Arya Central School, Thiruvananthapuram the date of birth in the Admission Register is 28.5.1991 which is also recorded on the documents issued by the Board.

Based on the resolution of the Examination Committee, the issuing authority of the Birth Certificate had been requested to verify the birth certificate bearing Registration No. 759/1990 with date of registration 02.06.1990. As per letter No. H-1/19093/2008(Vol.IV) dated 19.11. 2012 of the Sub Registrar of Births & Deaths, it has been stated that "a search has been conducted in the birth registers kept in this office as per the referred requests and found that the copy of birth certificate of

SARANYA R NAIR attached with your letter is a copy of the extract issued from this office vide birth registration No 759/1990. The copy has been verified with the original register and the entries are found correct."

2. Kumari Neharika Jain Class X Roll No. 8207377 of 2011

Correction in date of birth from 26.8.1995 to 26.10.1995. As two date of birth certificates have been received – one issued by Meerut authority and the other by Delhi authority mentioning different date of birth, instead of getting the date of birth verified from the issuing authorities, as the mother is working in Law Ministry, Govt. of India, the Ministry had been requested to confirm the date of birth of Km. Neharika Jain as recorded in the office record and it was approved that the date of birth as recorded in the Govt. of India record be treated as correct and action taken accordingly.

The Deputy Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Law & Justice, Legislative Department, ShastriBhavan vide his letter No. 2444/2012-Admn.I(LD) dated 21.11.2012 has stated that "as per records available in this Department, the date of birth of Km. Neharika Jain D/o Mrs. Sharda Jain, Joint secretary & Legislative Counsel is 26.10.1995."

It was also observed from the Birth Certificates that the one issued by Meerut authority mentions the place of birth as "Baraut" and that issued by Delhi authority mentions the place of birth as "RMLH".

Based on the above observations, the Committee has recommended as under:

- a) Correction in date of birth from 28.5.1991 to 28.5.1990 in respect of Kumari Saranya R Nair Class X Roll No. 4135266 of 2006 may be effected based on the verification report of the issuing authority of the Birth Certificate in relaxation of Rule 69.2(iv) of the Examination Byelaws i.e. beyond the period of five years of the examination, and
- b) Correction in date of birth from 26.8.1995 to 26.10.1995 in respect of Kumari Neharika Jain Class X Roll No. 8207377 of 2011 may not be considered as it is evident that two date of birth certificates have been got issued for the same child mentioning two different date of births. The date of birth as recorded in the school and as contained in the documents issued by the Board may only continue as far as the Board is concerned.

The Members after going through the report of the Committee resolved to accept its recommendations.

ITEM XVI: TO CONSIDER AMENDMENT IN RULE 7.4 OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS RELATING TO ADMISSION TO CLASS XI IN VIEW OF THE CHANGE IN THE SCHEME OF CONTINUOUS AND COMPREHENSIVE EVALUATION

The Members were informed that Rule 7.4 of the Examination Byelaws relating to Admission to Clas"s XI states as under:

- a) obtained minimum Grade D in at least five subjects(excluding the 6th additional 'subject) under Scholastic Area A as per the Scheme of Studies and a Qualifying Certificate/Grade Sheet cum Certificate of Performance at the Secondary School(Class X) Examination conducted by this Board/School affiliated to this Board;
- b) has passed an equivalent examination conducted by any other recognised Board of Secondary Education/Indian University and recognised by this Board as equivalent to its secondary school examination; and

Notwithstanding anything contained in the rules above, Chairman shall have the powers to permit admission in Class XI in respect of such students who have opted for not appearing for the Secondary School examination conducted by the Board but changing school after passing the Secondary School examination conducted by a school affiliated to the Board on grounds of shifting of family from one place to another, transfer of parent(s), for better academic performance or on medical grounds etc. to avoid undue hardship to the candidate(s)."

The Members were further informed that the para "Notwithstanding anything contained in the rules above, Chairman shall have the powers to permit admission in Class XI in respect of such students who have opted for not appearing for the Secondary School examination conducted by the Board but changing school after passing the Secondary School examination conducted by a school affiliated to the Board on grounds of shifting of family from one place to another, transfer of parent(s), for better academic performance or on medical grounds etc. to avoid undue hardship to the candidate(s)." had been included in view of the fact that only schools affiliated to the Board upto Senior level were conducting SA 2 examination under School based scheme. The Members were also apprised that the scheme of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation has been changed w.e.f. 2013 examination as under:

- i) Scheme 1 there shall be no Board Examination at Secondary(Class X) level for students studying in the schools affiliated to the Board who do not wish to move out of the CBSE system after Class X;
- ii) Scheme 2 students of Schools affiliated to the Board who wish to move out of the CBSE system after Class X(Pre-University,

Vocational course, Change of Board etc.) are required to take the Board's External Examination at Secondary(Class X) level

The Committee after considering the revised scheme of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation, resolved to amend the Rule to read as under:

ITEM XVII: TO CONSIDER INCREASE IN THE AMOUNT OF EXISTING PENALTIES FOR ERRORS PRESCRIBED FOR HEAD EXAMINERS, ADDL. HEAD EXAMINERS, EXAMINERS & COORDINATORSAND INCLUSION OF NEW CLAUSES FOR LEVYING PENALTIES AGAINST EXAMINERS IN THE GUIDELINES FOR SPOT EVALUATION

The Members were informed that the remuneration for evaluation work had been revised from time to time and had increased considerably in the past 2-3 years but the penalties imposed and contained in the Guidelines for Spot Evaluation had not been revised since long. Also with the introduction of providing photocopy of evaluated answer books to the candidates, representations had been received from the candidates stating the following discrepancies:

- > answer book not evaluated with the correct set of question paper and marking scheme
- Wrongly marked the Question no./answer as "Repeated" whereas the question has been attempted only once

The Members deliberated on the above issues and in order to discourage committing of errors at the Spot Evaluation centres, resolved as under:

- To double the penalties as indicated in the Guidelines for Spot Evaluation(annexed as Annexure I) to be implemented w.e.f. 2013 examination; and
- ii) To include the following new clauses for penalties against Examiners in the Guidelines for Spot Evaluation, 2013 examination—

ITEM XVIII:

TO CONSIDER THE REQUEST RECEIVED FROM THE AIR FORCE SCHOOL, SUBROTO PARK, NEW DELHI FOR CHANGE OF SUBJECTS UNDER HUMANITIES STREAM TO SUBJECTS UNDER SCIENCE STREAM IN RESPECT OF MASTER SURAJ SINGH RATHORE, A STUDENT OF CLASS XII, 2013 EXAMINATION

The Members were informed that representation had been received from The Air Force School, Subroto Park, New Delhi vide their letter of 20.12.2012 requesting to permit change of subjects under Humanities stream to subjects under Science stream in respect of Master Suraj Singh Rathore, a student of Class XII registered for 2013 examination due to medical condition (including depression and attempt to suicide) as also recommended by Doctors.

The Members were further informed that in the certificate issued by Asian Institute of Medical Sciences, Faridabad, Haryana on 26.12.20212, it has been stated that the boy is very keen to follow the medical stream in his XII standard however, due to some administrative reasons he has been deprived of following the same. His performance in Arts stream is poor whereas he performs very well in the science stream. The depression had, at one stage veered towards the patient resorting to "Attempt to suicide" by hanging on 21.12.2012 when he realized that all his attempts of changing the stream are proving futile. The frustration of having failed to get the science stream appears to have demoralized the boy leading to his attempted suicide. It has also been certified that he is otherwise normal with fairly good intelligence and strong desire to become a doctor.

The Members were apprised that as per Rule 26(iv) of the Examination Byelaws change of subjects in class X/XII can be permitted by the Chairman upto 31st August

The Members, after considering the case on merit resolved to permit change of subjects from Geography, History, Informatics Practices and Physical Education to Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics in relaxation of Rule 26(iv) in respect of Master Suraj Singh Rathore to safeguard his interests and future. The Committee further resolved that this should not be quoted as a precedent for any future cases.

ADD. ITEM I: TO CONSIDER THE REQUEST RECEIVED FROM DR. A K
AGARWAL F/O MASTER DEVANG AGARWAL, A STUDENT OF
DELHI PUBLIC SCHOOL, AZAD NAGAR, KANPUR, UTTAR
PRADESH SUFERING FROM DUCHENNE MUSCULAR
DYSTROPHY TO APPEAR FROM HIS OWN SCHOOL AS AN
EXAMINATION CENTER FOR CLASS XII, 2013 EXAMINATION AND
PERMISSION OF ONE UNEDUCATED HELPER FOR HIS PHYSICAL
HELP

The Members were apprised that request from Dr. A K Agarwal, flo Master Devang Agarwal has been received from Shri V. Umashankar, PS to HRM vide letter No. 5737/MHRD/201 of 15.5.2012 forwarded by the Hon'ble Minister of Coal Shri Sriprakash Jaiswal wherein Dr. Agarwal requested for self-centre and extra time in Class 12 in respect of his son Devang Agrawal, student of Delhi Public School, Azad Nagar, Kanpur who is suffering from DMD (Duchenne's Muscular Dystrophy). Dr. Agrawal has requested for the following concessions:

- i) Examination centre be the school itself so that he can continue his studies in future; and
- ii) Extra time

iii) Permitting one uneducated helper for his physical help

The Members were further informed that as per the information downloaded from the Internet Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy is a recessive X-linked form of muscular dystrophy which results in muscle degeneration, difficulty in walking, breathing and death. Due to progressive deterioration of muscle, loss of movement occurs eventually leading to paralysis. The average life expectancy is around 25, but this varies from individual to individual. As defined at Point No. 2(o) of THE PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES ACT, 1995 "locomotor disability' means disability of the bones, joints or muscles leading to substantial restriction of the movement of the limbs or any form of cerebral palsy".

The Members were informed that as stated in Rule 24 of the Examination Byelaws he has been allowed extra time which is as under:

for paper of 3 hours duration	60 minutes
for paper of 2½ hours duration	50 minutes
for paper of 2 hours duration	40 minutes
for paper of 1½ hours duration	30 minutes

The Members were further informed that the examination centre for 2013 examination for students of Delhi Public School, Azad Nagar, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh is at Sir Padampat Singhania Education Center, Kanpur.In the past, no candidate has been permitted to appear from his own school as examination center, even under special circumstances.

The Members after going into the facts of the case were of the opinion that all possible help should be extended to such students and resolved as under:

- to permit him to appear from his own school as an examination center as it is having the necessary physical facilities for the child; and
- 2) to permit one helper for his physical help. Such helper shall be arranged by the parents.

ADD. ITEM II: TO CONSIDER PERMITTING THE PASS OUTS OF CBSE TO APPEAR FOR THE SUBJECTS UNDER VOCATIONAL STREAM AS REGULAR CANDIDATES

The Members were apprised with the direction received from Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, Indian Nursing Council has changed the eligibility criteria of admission to the course on Auxiliary Nursing and Midwifery(ANM). In this context Hon'ble High

Court of Punjab and Haryana in Civil Writ Petitions No. 13421 of 2012 &13446 of 2012 has also given judgementsdated.9.2012 stating that -

"the petitioner has approached this Court with the grievance that because of enhanced qualification the petitioner institution will not be permitted to admit the candidates who are 10+2 pass.

Counsel appearing for respondent No. 1(CBSE) states that this apprehension is misconceived. The petioner - School would be permitted to admit the students with enhanced qualification.

The writ petition is disposed of."

The Members were informed that though the ANM course had been introduced by the Board but due to the change in criteria the same had to be discontinued and later reintroduced. The Members were also apprised of thefollowing provision of the Examination Byelaws relating to Criteria for admission to the examinations:

Rule 12(ii) "All India/Delhi Senior School Certificate Examination and Secondary School Examination will be open to such regular candidates who have not passed equivalent Examination from this Board or equivalent or higher examination of any other Board of University."

The Members deliberated upon the above and opined that though presently the Board does not have provision of permitting the pass outs to take readmission in another course/subjects, but to promote vocational education, especially in respect of those candidates who after passing the Class XII examination decide to take readmission in senior classes with vocational subjects and keeping in view the judgements of the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana, the Committee resolved as under:

- the passouts of CBSE's Class XII and desirous of readmission in Class XI and then to appear in Class XII by offering the revised course of Auxiliary Nursing and Midwifery(ANM) be permitted to do so;
- the schools be permitted to admit the pass outs of CBSE's Class XII students to reappear as regular students with subjects under vocational subjects, provided the subjects are being taught in the particular school;

- such students be permitted to appear only as regular students after fulfilling the requirements as stipulated in the Examination Byelaws;
- 4) Rule 12(ii) of the Examination Byelaws be amended to read as under –

"All India/Delhi Senior School Certificate Examination and Secondary School Examination will be open to such regular candidates who have not passed equivalent Examination from this Board or equivalent or higher examination of any other Board of University. However, All India/Delhi Senior School Certificate Examination will be open to such regular candidates who have passed equivalent Examination from this Board and will reappear with the vocational subjects as defined in the Scheme of Studies of the Board from time to time."

5) Statement of Marks and Certificate issued to such students shall also have the mention of the earlier document issued.

The Meeting then ended with a Vote of Thanks to the Chair.

ITEM III To consider the Medical reimbursement of admissible amount in r/o Sh. Ashish Mudgal S/O Sh. ChamanLal Sharma, Dy. Secretary (Admn. II & III) for the outdoor treatment (consultation, physiotherapy &rehabilitation) in approved hospital in OPD.

Committee deliberated the issue of OPD treatment taken by Sh. AshishMudgal S/O Sh. ChamanLal, Dy. Secy. and approved the reimbursement of OPD charges (consultation, physiotherapy and rehabilitation) tentative cost of which is Rs. 295000/- subject to its quarterly review by the Board.

ITEM IV Considering appointment of 01 consultant on consolidated salary of Rs.30000/- per month purely on contract basis in the NEET-UG & Secret Unit of the Board initially for a period of six months.

Committee deliberated the issue in detail and approved the appointment of Sh. Ashok Sharma, Retd. Asstt.Secy., on honorarium of Rs. 30,000 (with no other allowance) per month for a period of six month.

ITEM V To report action taken with regard to enhancement of tariff for rent for temporary allotment of residential accommodation.

Committee ratified the proposal of enhancing the tariff from Rs.250 to Rs.500 per day along with Rs.100/-(one time fixed) charged for cleaning etc. on account of temporary allotment of staff quarter to its employees.

ITEM VI To consider revision of rates of remuneration of examination/conveyance charges in respect of persons to be engaged at the examination centres in JEE(MAIN) 2013.

Committee deliberated the issue to consider revision of rates of remuneration of examination/conveyance charges in respect of persons to be engaged at the examination centres in JEE(MAIN) 2013 and approved the rates at parwith AIPMT, but where the existing rates of AIEEE are already on higher side, such rates need not be reduced (as per Annexure 'A').

ITEM VII Allotment of Staff Quarters to contractual staff.

Committee discussed and approved the proposal of allotment of staff quarters to contractual staff at the rent of 15% of the consolidated salary on which contractual staff is employed.

Committee discussed and approved the proposal of weeding out of 7-8 years old and obsolete books/old textbooks/ curriculums etc. in publication store amounting of Rs.75,48,032.

Committee approved the extension for further period of one year i.e. from 01.01.2013 to 31.12.2013 in r/o Sh. B.M Gupta, Former HOD (IT) as an advisor in the computer unit of the Board on the existing terms.

ITEM XIII Grant of grade pay of Rs.4800/- in place of GP of Rs.4600 in r/o Section Officer & equivalent officers of the Board.

Committee deliberated the issued in detail for grant of grade pay of Rs.4800/- in place of GP of Rs.4600 in r/o Section Officer & equivalent officers of the Board and recommended that case may be sent to the Ministry for consideration.

ITEM XIV Renovation of toilets, kitchen and campus in staff quarters, BrijVihar (GZB).

Committee approved the proposal of renovation of toilets, kitchen and campus in staff quarter, BrijVihar (GZB). The piping and tile work should be taken in 1st phase and campus flooring should be taken in IInd phase. Tentative cost being Rs.42.00 lakhs.

Committee deliberated the issue and approved that the employees/officers against whom disciplinary/court cases are pending and which fall under minor penalties, may not be debarred from examination related remunerative work during the pendency of disciplinary/court case. However, if proved guilty, no examination related remunerative work shall be allowed during the period of serving the penalty. Persons with charges of financial irregularity may not be allowed for such duty.

ITEM XVII Report action hiring of separate building for JEE (MAINS) Examination Unit.

Committee ratified the proposal of hiring of separate building for JEE (Mains) Examination Unit at plot No. 482, FIE, Patparganj, Delhi measuring 11370sq.ft. @ 65.96 sq.ft (excluding service tax) for a period of one year.

ITEM XVIII Report action concerning construction of Regional Office Building, Guwahati.

Committee perused the matter of construction of Regional Office Building, Guwahati and appreciated the saving of Rs.64 lacs due to close monitoring.

ITEM XIX Providing Air-conditioning in the HQ Bldg.

Committee approved the proposal of centred Air-Conditioning through procurement 300 HP VRV AC system in its Hq. bldg, the tentative cost being approx. Rs.2.90 crores. Committee also approved that the Board may approach NBCC for the work, failing which option of "open tenders" for execution of the work may be exercised.

Project Proposal for the Development and Practice of 'Technology Augmented Learning and Education Environment Management' (TALEEM)

A two phase approach to execute the deployment and practice of 'Technology Augmented Learning and Education Environment Management', or, TALEEM is proposed for the CBSE Schools (as was presented by Prof. K.R. Srivathsan, Director, Chinmaya Institute of Technology in the 19th CBSE National Conference of Sahodaya Schools, held 22-24 Dec. 2012 at Indore).

This proposal is for the modernization of CBSE and all its member schools to initiate the right beginning of a transformation of the school education system through emerging contours of connectivity, content and collaboration as enabled and augmented by the fast evolving ICT scenario. As such it implies and impacts a deeper cultural transformation in ways we conduct education. Hence this project requires the empowered committees as suggested, a push to encourage teachers to come forward and participate, launching continuing teachers education programs to understand the new TALEEM modes of quality assurance and conduct of education. TALEEM when imaginatively applied to vocational education will connect the students with employment in various development projects.

TALEEM is a comprehensive framework and methodology of enhancing quality and inclusion in school education by using a cloud anchored collaborative system of augmentation based on emerging ICT scenario of the teachers in engaging the students in their classes in learning and assessment activities.

TALEEM provides a systematic ICT enabling of education through disciplined collaboration among communities of teachers and subject matter experts in different subject areas and at different levels across networked schools in each geographic region. Its core focus is on empowering such web-communities to collaboratively develop Lesson Plans in the topics of subjects concerned, publicit the same in the open for all the schools to share and use the same in their respective classes. TALEEM will also help sharing best practices in school management and societal engagements.

Prof. K.R. Srivathsan, Director, Chinmaya Institute of Technology, has proposed a two tier implementation of TALEEM services. At the lower tier we shall equip each regional cluster or chapter of Sahodaya CBSE Schools for the deployment and practice of TALEEM systems, services and processes by setting up a 'CBSE TALEEM Regional Sahodaya Centre' (CTRSC). At the higher all India CBSE level we shall have a referral CBSE TALEEM National Sahodaya Centre' (CTNSC) that will connect with all


the regional centres, set up reference Open TALEEM systems for all Courses the CBSE. CTNSC will manage and run the TALEEM Portal and associated ICT systems. CTNSC will be the central anchor for all ICT related development, deployment and capacity building in the application and practice of TALEEM. These include areas like ICT enabling of school management, parents engagement and building of societal awareness related to schools and children's education.

CTRSC will be run as a cooperative of the regional Sahodaya Schools of CBSE. They will support communities of **Subject Matter Experts** (**SME**s - from experienced teachers and those from academia in the region) and teachers across the member schools in each subject areas at the different levels (like primary, elementary, secondary, higher secondary, etc.). These communities will localize the TALEEM course methodology and publish them in the local TALEEM. This in turn will be used by the teachers in the concerned subject in their classes to augment their courses. CTRSC will also run capacity building certification program for the school teachers to become proficient in the use of TALEEM supported educational processes in their subjects. The objective of this proposal is to start the TALEEM related developments without delay by starting a pilot project in the first phase.

This will be built on the TALEEM initiative led by the author at the Chinmaya Institute of Technology. In this first phase we shall use the Chinmaya Centre for Knowledge Enterprises under the Chinmaya Institute of Technology in Kannur to act as the pilot CTNSC. The pilot phase will identify a few local regional Sahodaya Chapters and initiate the launch of the CTRSCs there. The first phase will include the development of a national TALEEM implementation proposal. Based upon this first phase and the approved national TALEEM proposal a comprehensive national action program to implement TALEEM across the country would be made.

PROPOSED TALEEM IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

TALEEM is implemented in each region for the cluster of networked Sahodaya Schools in the region. Appreciation of the ICT scenario in relation to the pedagogic and behavioural senses of educational communities of teachers and students is essential for imparting quality education in the coming times. Fig. 1 below the typical hybrid network scenario of emerging times:




Significant characteristics of the ICT scenario:

- (i) The network is strongly converged with interdependent integration of Internet, Mass Media, Mobile, diverse user access devices – desktops, mobiles, smart phones, tablets, IP-TV, cloud hosted servers and applications and any time anywhere access.
- (ii) Teachers and students across regional networks of Sahodaya Schools will interact in diverse ways synchronously in the school class hours; over remote classrooms and net meetings and asynchronously over blogs, Discussion Forums, Learning Management Systems and such others.
- (iii) We have different ways for assessment and feedback to learners. It is also possible to assessing and guiding large number of online learners in some categories of learning situations (like the Massively Online Open Courses, or, MOOC).
- (iv) Learning resources will be much richer than printed books only like recorded video lectures, spoken tutorials, virtual labs, interactive content, 3D, video illustrations, simulations, etc.
- (v) The need for educating students in ICT enabled tools in subjects like sciences, applied statistics, vocational courses will also be supported.
- (vi) The very process of implementing TALEEM will greatly enhance the ICT capabilities and ICT enabled services management in the Sahodaya Schools.


There are many functions of TALEEM that schools in isolation will not be able to carry out. These are in the nature of collaborations among teachers across the member-

schools and also at the interfaces between schools and society. The following figure illustrates the different functions that will need the support of the CTRSC:



We may note that schools and their teachers are fully engaged in the conduct of their day-to-day school operations, classrooms and students management, CCE related activities and so on. Hence they have very little time and in certain areas inadequate expertise for designing, deployment and capacity building in TALEEM processes. TALEEM processes involve services assurance in technology related support to students. For example ensuring applications and e-content are working in the students, and teachers tablets and mass media awareness programs are managed will fall squarely as the responsibilities of the CTRSC.

Hence As a strategy for effective implementation and management of TALEEM related activities and services, CTRSC will have a functional profile as illustrated in the following figure:



CTRSC as illustrated above is both an IT services industry as well as educational technology development and design entity. We propose that CTRSC is established as 'Community Knowledge Enterprise' owned collectively as a cooperative by the regional Sahodaya Member-Schools. CTRSC will manage the TALEEM Processes and the related technology systems and services.

At the national level we shall establish the CTNSC directly under the purview of the CBSE. It will be an autonomous IT enabling services wing of CBSE. It will have functional profile similar to the CTSC but with different facets of authority. Its TALEEM will be to develop the reference lesson plans, CBSE schools management related IT enabling like assessment systems design, data related analytics to provide better monitoring capabilities and policies related IT enabling of schools, etc.

CTRSC will need about 5,000 Sq. ft. of site conditioned and well equipped space for its functioning. This space may be provided by a suitably located school in the regional cluster of Sahodaya Schools. This will be managed by the CTRSC management as an autonomous body.

TALEEM SYSTEMS AND PROCESSES

Focusing on school courses, we shall outline the TALEEM processes. A critical function is to have quality assured lesson plans for each topic in every subject. In TALEEM, we do this as follows:

- (i) Establish and manage closed group collaboration area for 'Subject Matter Experts', or SME Groups duly appointed by an academic body under the CTNSC. This group will guide the development and deployment of lesson plans.
- (ii) Both Lesson Plans Curriculum in any course evolve over time. So we establish a 'Version Control System' (VCS) accessed over the TALEEM portal. VCS is managed by trained IT professionals who assist the SME groups to manage the version definition and control for the Lesson Plans in each module or its topics.
- (iii) The SME Groups approve the Lesson Plans for deployment. These are then published over a TALEEM Courses Wiki managed by the CTNSC/CTRSC. This chain may be stated as the Lesson Plans design, development and deployment phase of the course.
- (iv) TALEEM maintains an Open Community Wiki area for each course. This area allows teachers in the schools, the students and knowledgeable citizens to publish supplementary content of value to the formal Lesson Plans.
- (v) Blogs and Social Networking areas are maintained for free discussions and comment. These are moderated by the SME groups.
- (vi) CTRSC conducts motivational and social awareness building programs using Internet and mass media.
- (vii) CTRSC develops competencies in assessment and evaluations management.
- (viii) CTRSC is used by member schools for sharing of best practices in teaching, learning, schools management and societal engagements like managing parents online meeting and such other events of value.
- (ix) TALEEM provides a powerful platform for developing and managing accredited vocational courses. This overcomes the weakness in the present accreditation management of such academic programs.
- (x) TALEEM, through its version controlled Lesson Plans enhances quality assurance in instruction and education management.
- (xi) CTRSC will also serve as regional R&D centre of value to teachers and their career advancements, managing online continuing education programs for teachers and such activities of value.
- (xii) At least 6 workshops/training programs will be held in the three locations during the 12 month period.

STRATEGY, BUDGET AND DELIVERABLES

To launch the TALEEM initiative without delay, we propose that the Chinmaya Centre for Knowledge Enterprises (CCKE) established in the Chinmaya Institute of Technology, Kannur, Kerala will coordinate this pilot under the guidance of the author Prof. K.R. Srivathsan. CCKE will serve the seed CBSE TALEEM functions as a proto CTNSC.

CBSE will approve and establish two essential technology and academic bodies that will moderate and approve actions taken or approvals for decisions required as well as guidelines to be developed for the programs to be established and managed under the TALEEM initiatives. The two bodies will be as stated below.

- (i) TALEEM Systems, Technology and Processes Committee (TSTPC): This will be a national forum of the CBSE to arrive at recommended technologies, methodologies and capacity building related to technology development, deployment and management.
- (ii) TALEEM Academic Programs Coordination Committee (TAPCC): This committee will have the authority to approve the SME Experts Groups under the different CTRSCs and their recommendations for approved Lesson Plans. It will guide the coordination mechanisms and approve such ICT enabled solutions as may impact the conduct of educational management. It will also be the body to approve necessary TALEEM methods of quality assurance. It may pass recommendations to the CBSE on such issues that require larger policy interventions at Board or CABE levels.
- (iii) TALEEM Monitoring and Supervisory Committee: This will be the apex committee with governing with CBSE Chairperson also chairing this. Prof. K. R. Srivathsan will be its Co- Chairman during TALEEM launch Phase. CBSE Chairperson in consultation with Prof. K. R. Srivathsan will constitute this committee.

It is important to ensure while constituting the that the member-schools of the Sahodaya schools are made the stakeholders (or de facto 'shareholders') of the CTRSC.

The Chinmaya Mission through its Education Trusts which run more than 80 CBSE schools will work alongside through the CCKE and this pilot TALEEM program to reinforce the execution of this program.

Several of the recommendations (and more) arrived at the CBSE 19th National Conference of Sahodaya schools will be addressed and served directly by the two-tier CTNSC – CTRSC combination in several ways.

DELIVERABLES

The whole pilot phase will be executed in 12 months from the date of project grant release. By the 9th month the project will be reviewed against deliverables stated and mid-term course correction be made or decision taken on scaling up the activities, including setting up of the CTNSC and the CTRSCs in various regional Sahodaya Schools clusters through guidelines driven participatory approach. We state below the deliverables against a program deadline.

The pilot phase is not only for proof of concept, but will provide the e-trained expert

- (i) Necessary suite of Software Applications required to establish and manage TALEEM for the courses through collaborative communities of teachers will be mounted over cloud server, integrated and commissioned. The suite of applications include Closed Group Collaboration system, Version Control System, Community Portal area, Wikis supporting community publishing, Lesson Plans posting, Moodle, necessary database systems, streaming and IP-TV channel and alerts mass management.
- (ii) A suite of TALEEM supported courses for capacity building through certificate courses for ICT professionals required to establish and manage the technology base of TALEEM. We propose
 - a. A Certificate course in Linux;
 - b. Management of Virtualisation and Applications Mounting over Cloud Servers:
 - Systems Network and Gateway Management for staff who have to maintain schools networking, related WiFi and their security.

At least 50 such professionals are required to run the pilot CTLC and the initial CTRSCs.

- (iii) An ICT Course for training of teachers in online collaboration, Internet use, Wiki and spoken tutorials skills and Leson Plans development skills.
- (iv) Assistance to launch at least 3 CTRSCs (we proppose at Kannur, Indore and Amritsar initially). If other Sahodaya complexes are willing to invest we shall take them up on cost covered basis.
- (v) Detailed project proposal for continuation of the pilot phase on to a TALEEM adoption across all Sahodaya Schools, involving the setting up CTNSC at national level and the CTRSCs for every Sahodaya Complex of CBSE schools in the different regions.

- (vi) Conducting training of teachers in the initial CTRSCs Sahodaya Schools upto 100 teachers in each of the three regions.
- (vii) Constitution of the empowered committees as given earlier.
- (viii) Handing over the CTRSC operations to the respective Sahodaya groups of Schools in the proposed three regions.
- (ix) Development of content packaging into tablets and their use in the classroom.
- (x) Establishing the services team in the three CTRSCs.
- (xi) Holding of at least two meetings of the three committees to guide the execution plan at (a) the technology adoption level; (ii) at programs design level and (iii) overall project strategy levels.

Development of a strategy for TALEEM in vocational education that links with employment by integration with major national Plan Programs in areas like Health, Education, Agriculture, Rural Development and Tourism & Culture (the HEART areas).

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

Recruitment Rules for various posts in the newly formed 'Accounts Cadre' in the Central Board of Secondary Education.

- Short title and commencement
 - a) These rules may be called the CBSE Accounts Service Recruitment Rules 2012.
 - b) They shall come into force on the date of approval.
- 2. Number of posts, classification and scales of Pay-

The number of the said posts, their classification and the scales of pay attached thereto shall be as specified in annexure-1.

- 3. Method of recruitment, age limit, qualification etc.- The method of recruitment, age limit, qualifications and other matters relating to the said posts in the cadre shall be as specified in Recruitment Rules enclosed.
- 4. Cadre Controlling Authority Chairman, CBSE.
- 5. Liability for transfer- All the officials/officers upto the rank of Accounts Officer shall be liable to transfer anywhere in India in Accounts Division of the Board.
- 6. Disqualifications- No person
 - a) Who has entered into or contracted a marriage with a person having a spouse living; or
 - b) Who having a spouse living, has entered into or contracted a marriage with any person, shall be eligible for appointment to any of the said posts:

Provided that the Board may, if satisfied, that such marriage is permissible under the personal law applicable to such person and the other party to the marriage and that there are other grounds for so doing, exempt any person from the operation of this rule.

- Power to relax- Where the Board is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do, it may, by order, for reason to be recorded in writing, relax any of the provisions of these rules with respect of any class or category of persons.
- 8. Saving- Nothing in these rules shall affect reservation, relaxation of age limit and other concessions required to be provided for the Scheduled Tribes, Ex-servicemen and other special categories of persons in accordance with the orders issued by the Govt. Of India from time to time in this regard.

The minutes of the meeting of the Curriculum Committee which was held on **June 1**, **2012** were circulated among all the members of the Curriculum Committee. No comments were received. The minutes of the above meeting may be confirmed. The house unanimously confirmed the minutes

Section II

Action Taken Report on the agenda items discussed in the previous meeting held on June 1, 2012

Agenda Item: 2 - Action Taken Report

The Director (Academic) elaborated on the action taken with respect to the agenda items of the last Curriculum Committee meeting as follows:

2.1 To report on the conduct of the CCE/Formative Assessment workshops.

Director (Academic) informed the house that the Board has empanelled many more agencies to support trainings on CCE by floating an RFP for training of teachers. A Training calendar detailing the training venues and dates up to January 2013 has been uploaded on CBSE Academic website for CCE and FA Training workshops. Total Teachers trained during the above CCE/Formative Assessment workshops after June 1, 2012 is 7350. These programmes do not include the NUEPA programmes.

2.2 To report on the implementation of CCE by agencies approved by CBSE:

In the light of the Right of the Children to Free and Compulsory Education and various educational reforms initiated by the Board over the years, an ardent need has been felt for upgrading training of teachers. To address this issue the Board floated an RFP for training and after due procedure, many agencies were empanelled to conduct the following Training Programmes for the teachers of the schools affiliated to it on the various aspects of CCE and Effective School Management & Leadership.

2.3 To report on the conduct of the Mentoring Workshops for Principals of CBSE Schools.

Director (Academic) reported to the house the conduct of various orientation programmes for training the volunteer Principals as Mentors throughout the country and abroad. She shared with the house that a micro-site within the academic website (<u>www.cbseacademic.in</u>) of the Board has been started to make the Mentoring process a transparent, user friendly and more effective one.

2.4 To report on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee on Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation

Director (Academic) apprised the house that the Board has constituted an Advisory Committee on CCE with Dr. Shyama Chona in Chair. The committee has held two meetings and the last meeting was held on **August 30, 2012** at Shiksha Sadan. The committee recommended for a substantial increase in the number of training programmes for teachers to optimize the benefits of educational reforms including CCE. The Board has come out with a training calendar for 2013 with more training programmes than the previous year. The other major recommendations of the committee have also been taken into account by the Board.

2.5 To report on Launch of a new Academic website (www.cbseacademic.in)

The Director (Academic) told the house that the board had launched Academic website in view of increased demand for online services especially with regard to mentoring, accreditation and training programmes. The important sections in the website are circulars, publications, Health and wellness, Training, Innovation and Research, CTET, Mentoring and Accreditation. Academic tenders and recruitments are also being taken up through the new academic website. The Director (Academic) added that the Board is also in the process of extension of its regional presence by establishing more regional offices and recruiting officers in its academic unit. The new officers for the academic unit will be from tertiary education sector as the eligibility has been modified to rope in experts from the higher education sector.

2.6 To approve preparation of Teachers Handbook for Inclusive Education.

The Director (Acate (a)) briefed the house that there is a need for very concrete policy regarding inclusive education. The Board is planning to come out with a tangible policy in this regard to control malpractices in schools. It has been reported time and again that some schools do not admit students on various pretexts. In the meanwhile, a committee has been constituted under Mr. Veera Raghvan, Chairman, K. M. Munshi. Institute of Educational Leadership and Management to develop Teachers Handbook and the first draft is expected soon.

Professor Prem Sharma from University of Delhi expressed her desire to be a part of committee for developing this Handbook. Director (Academic) welcomed her to this committee.

2.7 To report on discontinuation of Sample Question Papers, general weightage of different units instead of chapter specific weightage and blue prints to students of classes IX and X for SA-I and SA-II examination of 2012-2013

The Director (Academic) informed the house about discontinuation of Blue Prints, Sample Question Papers and Marking Schemes in all major subjects in classes IX and X w.e.f. Summative Assessment-II of 2012-13 published by the Board as it precludes much advocated open ended approach and diversity in expression, style and content. This information was circulated to all the schools affiliated to the board vide Circular No: Acad-27/2012 dated June 27, 2012.

The weightings are assigned to entire units instead of chapter wise weighting given earlier. There are more flexible designs or structures of assessment in place of detailed blueprints. The structures of examination along with unit wise weighting for English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Mathematics, Science and Social Science together with pools of exemplar items are available on the academic websites of CBSE (<u>www.cbseacademic.in</u>) and have been circulated to all the schools affiliated to the board.

2.8 To report on Problem Solving Assessment (PSA) for Classes IX & XI.

The Director (Academic) told the house that this as matter was not resolved in the last meeting of the curriculum committee; the Governing Body of the Board considered this issue and discussed it at great length in its meeting held on 4th of June, 2012. It was resolved that the Problem Solving Test shall be made compulsory for students who shall be appearing for classes IX & XI from the academic year 2012-2013 onwards in view of its relevance in the development of important skills in students.

This assessment will take place on February 16, 2013 in all the affiliated schools except Winter Closing Schools. The sample question papers have been uploaded at the academic website. The logistics for smooth conduct of the said assessment are being coordinated jointly by the Board and Pearson Private Company which has been selected on the basis of RFP floated.

2.9 To report on the development of the Book of "Knowledge Traditions and Practices of India" introduced in class XI from 2012

The Director (Academic) reported that the Board has introduced "Knowledge Tradition and Practices of India" a new elective subject in class XI on pilot basis in 16 schools. All the 10 modules of class XI consisting of 12 units have been composed and sent for printing and have been uploaded on CBSE Academic website.

The process for preparing class XII book has been initiated. The themes for class XII book have been finalized in the Advisory Committee meeting on 13 & 14 December, 2012. The following themes have been finalized to be included in the book:

Ms. Lata Valdyanathan, Principal Modern School inquired about the options available in the higher education after pursuing this elective. As most of the universities consider best of four subjects she wanted to know the courses to which admission can be sought.

Director (Academic), CBSE responded by stating that the Board has been requesting many universities in India including University of Delhi for considering the new courses/ electives started out by the Board. She informed the house that the University of Delhi has recognized all the courses offered by CBSE till 2012 and they have been reflected in the admission brochure released by the University.

Dr. Biswajit Saha, Programme Officer, CBSE shared with the house that University of Delhi has recognized all the vocational courses offered by Board and Ministry of Human Resource Development has directed UGC to issue guidelines to various universities to accept vocational courses started by various school boards under NVEQFP.

Prof. B.K.Tripathi, Joint Director, NCERT reflected that there should be in-depth thinking about the professional nature of the elective and the way in which it would benefit students before launching it out. Professor added that the transfer between VE and general education is among the key elements of vocational qualification framework and under its pilot phase four areas i.e. IT, Banking, Retail and Automobile sectors are being focused on. However, we must keep in mind the utility of a subject and its connectivity to higher education before starting it formally.

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan, Principal, Modern School appreciated the beautiful course structure of the Knowledge Traditions and Practices of India which is multidisciplinary in nature covering art, culture, printing, martial art etc. She however, emphasized that the schools need concrete information regarding its vertical mobility options in higher education to convince parents. If some guidelines are there in this regard that would be wonderful because schools can use them to communicate with parents. Schools also need to know the requirement for initiating this course in terms of teacher qualifications.

Director (Academic), CBSE stated that the curriculum for the KTPI was approved by the same house and it is perhaps a unique course which interlinks various disciplines. The Board will approach universities as the first batch of the pilot being carried out will pass out in 2014.

Prof. J. M. Khurana, University of Delhi informed the house that the University is under the process of redesigning its courses and therefore, also reconsidering the eligibility criteria for the same. This is perhaps the most opportune time to approach Delhi University for all the electives started out by the Board for getting considered at the time of granting admission.

Prof. Hukum Singh, NCERT emphasized the need of including knowledge of science and mathematics in this elective.

Ms. Neelima Sharma, Consultant, CBSE briefed the house that this elective does not eulogize Indian history or traditions rather it is an attempt to develop respect for the country and enhance the self-esteem of students. The elective is based on factual information and the house is invited to view the modules and units available on the academic website of CBSE.

Director (Academic), CBSE assured the house that the matter regarding vertical mobility will be taken up promptly with the UGC and other universities.

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan, Principal Modern School once again appreciated the cross-curricular nature of the elective and forwarded her support in whatever way required in evolving this elective. She also brought in light the case of the elective Bio-technology started out by CBSE. She highlighted that universities initially did not recognize this elective, however, after sustained efforts the recognition was granted. Similarly in case of this elective also it must be dovetailed with some courses in higher education.

Prof. Ashok Dubey, Netaji Subhash Institute of Technology informed the house that there is no direct course that relates with Bio-technology at the graduation level. All the universities offer bio-technology at the post-graduate level; however, it can be related to micro biology and general biology at the graduate level.

Director (Academic), CBSE again responded that in tune with the current demand the Board proposes to initiate practically relevant skill based subjects. She informed the house that after the Board introduced Financial Market Management, the University of Mumbai introduced similar course at the graduate level. The Board will reinforce the demand for recognition of all the new courses started.

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan, Principal Modern School proposed to post the information about the acceptability of various courses/ electives on the academic website

Prof. J.M.Khurana, University of Delhi highlighted that students seek admission in such courses which are not relevant to subjects studied by them at the school level. Students with vocational courses seek admission to specialized courses which is not permissible. He also informed the house that the University has not yet reviewed the admission policy; however, there is major reshuffling taking place in designing new integrated four year courses at the graduation level.

Professor K.P.Chinda, said that CBSE needs to decide whether a particular subject is under vocational or academic stream. CBSE is not flexible in inter-transfer of academic and vocational subjects whereas Universities are allowing such transfers.

Director (Academic), CBSE responded by saying that the Board does not believe in streaming subjects. Any four electives can be offered with a language as per the convenience of a school.

Dr. Dinesh Kumar, Addl. Commissioner, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangthan, commented by saying that although the CBSE does not do streaming of subjects, however, the same is done by schools and universities for the sake of administration and students need to be advised regarding the same.

The house advised on having one member each from UGC, NCERT, AICTE and CBSE as a part of committee developing a new course/ elective at CBSE.

2.10 To report revision of Functional English Course for Senior Secondary Classes

As there is a demand for an "Occupational Functional Course" in English for the Vocational stream the proposal was to make the course useful for students of Vocational stream as well as for students of other streams. A Concept paper in this reference has been prepared and a proup of six experts have been notified for the revision work. The Occupational Functional English will consist of:

- A literature Reader consisting of 6 prose lessons in a range of themes and genres, 6 poems and 2 plays
- The work book, which will be separate, will contain a section that will be specific to students needing inputs and skills development that are linked to occupational contexts. Questions in Section A will be devoted to Reading Unseen Comprehension and Section B will be devoted to Writing will reflect this.
- 3. 20% will be allotted to Speaking and Listening Skills [ASL]

Care will be taken not to dilute the depth and content of the Materials.

The group is working on the curriculum and learning material and is expected to finalise the detailed content by the end of January, 2013.

2.11 To report testing of Listening and Speaking skills in English at the end of term in classes IX and XI 2013

The Director (Academic) informed that the Trinity College London has approached Board to do a pilot on complementary basis in which Master Trainers will be trained in listening and speaking skills in English. These Master Trainers will in turn train teachers in a cascading mode. There was an RFP for the conduct of this project however no agency was found suitable as the rates quoted were very high. Trinity College London offered to do this pilot for CBSE without any financial implications. The MoU was signed between the CBSE and the Trinity College, London in September, 2012 for implementing the pilot project in 120 schools affiliated to CBSE.

The second round of extensive training of Master Trainers (seven days) is in progress.

Ms: Lata Vaidyanathan, Principal Modern School said that as far as class XI and XII are concerned, the project seems to be absolutely right as it will be covered under practical part of the curriculum. However, for classes IX and X, it has to be integrated into CCE as the assessment is school based in these classes. 100% teacher training must be done in order to ensure proper assessment of speaking and listening skills. She also stated that it would be of immense utility if questions like those asked in PISA can be integrated with ASL.

Director (Academic), CBSE informed the house that the Board has collaborated with multiple agencies in this regard. The British Council shall run a pilot called Aptis on Speaking and Listening Skills in which 2,000 students spread across the schools affiliated to CBSE be jointly identified by the British Council and CBSE. Cengage EduTeach-National Geographic/ Edu Teach has also approached CBSE to conduct a 6 months online English language skills and English teaching course for 150 teachers.

2.12 To report Celebrating 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda on 12th January 2013.

The country has celebrated the 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda on 12th January 2013. There was a national telecast of the All India National CBSE Heritage Quiz on History Channel. This was in continuation of the MoU signed between CBSE and AETN18 who were collaborative partners for regional and national level quiz. The repeat telecast will be on January 17th, 2013 at 11:00 am and also on January 19, 2013 at 10:30 am.

The house congratulated CBSE on efforts made in this regard.

2.13 To report on the Waves of Change Programme under the National School Sanitation Initiative

The 'Waves of Change' programme aims at facilitating the holistic development of the mind, body and soul, learning by doing and encourages the multiple intelligences and capabilities of students. It was launched under the 'National School Sanitation initiative' on 28/11/2012 by Hon'ble HRM Dr. M. M. Pallam Raju. He also gave National School Sanitation Awards to the schools under the Green, Blue and Yellow schools. Dr. Pallam Raju also conferred the First National School Sanitation Awards to the top 156 schools that had come forward to get their online school sanitation rating. The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) in collaboration with CBSE and Deutsche Gesellschaft Fur Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) has instituted the awards. On this occasion, the children who had assembled took a 'Sanitation Pledge'. The logo of 'Waves of Change' was also unveiled along with the release of books and posters on the theme.

Shri R. Bhattacharya, Secretary, School Education and Literacy; MHRD, former cricketer Mr. K. Srikanth-the brand ambassador of the event, Shri Vineet Joshi, Chairman CBSE, Dr. Sadhana Parashar, Director (Academic), CBSE and other dignitaries were present on the occasion.

2.14 I To report the revision of scheme of studies for vocational courses at Senior Secondary level.

As per decision of the curriculum committee meeting held on 1st June 2012, the scheme of studies for vocational courses at Senior Secondary level has been revised for all newly introduced vocational course as well as for the revised course.

Introduction of new Vocational courses from class IX onwards under NVEQF

Vocational courses on, Retail, IT, Security and Automobile under NVEQF have been introduced in approximately 25 schools from class IX onwards from the session 2012-13 as additional subject. Provision has been kept to take these courses as compulsory papers wherein existing academic content would be reduced by 200 hrs. Curriculum and content in these four subjects have been prepared by CIT and are under the process of customization. These courses will be offered in approx. 40 CBSE affiliated school on pilot basis from the coming academic session. CIT will train 10 Master Trainers from the schools for three weeks.

Ill The revision of curriculum and renaming of existing vocational courses

As per the decision of Curriculum Committee a circular has been issued to opt the revised curriculum either from 2012-13 or from 2013-14.

Prof. B.K.Tripathi emphasized the need of rationalization of new courses introduced.

2.15 To report the Verification of Evidences of Assessments for Classes IX and X for the Academic Term April-September, 2012 and analysis of Evidence of Assessments 2012-2013 of Classes IX & X for Summative Assessment-I, Formative Assessment-I and II and co-scholastic skills

The Director (Academic) informed the house that Chairman, CBSE has developed a Dash-Board in which performance of all the schools from 2007-2012 can be traced. The Board has selected 400 students out of 14,000 who scored grade A. The Board has done a centralized Evidence of Assessment exercise in which expert teachers reassessed the records sent by different schools. The schools are satisfied with the feedback provided to them and the CBSE is also learning from this project of mutual importance.

With the purpose to streamline the process, the Board started decentralizing it by entrusting the task to the Coordinators appointed in different Cities under the jurisdiction of different regional offices. These coordinators are the principals of reputed schools who are willing to lend their wholesome support in this challenging endeavor.

Analysis of Evidence of Assessments 2012-2013 of Classes IX & X for Summative Assessment-I, Formative Assessment-I and II and co-scholastic skills

The CBSE through circular no. 61/2012 dated 7th September, 2012 informed schools in all regions regarding the Evidence of Assessment to be sent to the Regional Offices and City Coordinators who were appointed for the first time. In addition there was also a centralised list of schools generated which had schools in which more than 25% students had A Grade in all subjects. The evidences in all subjects and co-scholastic areas were collected for these schools at Rouse Avenue, Shiksha Sadan. These were analysed by Moderators who are exceptional teachers oriented towards using the tools of assessment. Some of the highlights of the analysis were:

1. Formative Assessment Tasks:

- 1. Most of the schools have about 3-4 tasks in FA-1 (41.86%) and FA-2(44.06%). Around 25% of the schools have 1-2 tasks in FAs. But about 5.4% of the schools give more than 10 tasks to the students. The level of these tasks is challenging in only 14.28% schools but average in 72.57% schools.
- 2. In relation to the variety of tasks, 28.55% schools offer wide variety of tasks, 54.27% offer an average variety while 15% schools give only written assignments to their students.
- 3. 75.49% schools follow the practice of individual assessments. Only 8.44% use the method of Group Assessments.
- 4. The schools mainly adopt 'All the tasks' (49.78%) as methodology in selecting the final grade and 16.39% schools adopt 'Best of all' for selecting the final grade in FAs.

2. Listening and Speaking Skills:

Listening and Speaking Skills are being tested in 45.77% of the schools through various tasks and activities and the testing is average in most of the schools (33.18%).

3. Project Work:

Students do the project work individually in 57.02% of the schools. Only 8.50% of schools do group projects. The quality of these projects is average in most of the cases.

4. Lab Activities/Practicals:

Most of the schools (30%) have insufficient lab activities/ practicals for their students.

5. Summative Assessment-1:

1. 75.23% schools use SA-1 paper sent by the Board.

2. Numbers of application based questions are balanced for 83.61% schools.

3. The overall rating of SA evaluation ranges from excellent to good in 76% schools and below average in only 1% schools.

6. Co-Scholastic Assessments:

Regarding Co-Scholastic Assessments, 34.2% schools provided sufficient reports and evidences, 37% provided evidences which were insufficient and around 19% schools did not provide any evidence.

The Moderators feedback reports received from Regional Offices have been sent to the schools asking them to take up remediation measures in their student assessment during second term. The schools while expressing their satisfaction from the feedback received have enthusiastically taken up steps to further improve the assessment practices.

Ms. Sharda Taneja, Directorate of Education requested that a copy of the feedback should be provided to Directorate.

Ms. Lata Vaidayanathan, Principal, Modern School proposed that the CBSE's sports programme should be integrated with the achievement in the co-scholastic area.

Ms. Isabel Sutcliffe CAER informed the house that the Centre is going to develop modules for teachers and principals to support CCE. The reflection of Lab activities, co-scholastic activities and projects in the assessments record need more clarity as these are equally important part of curriculum.

Director (Academic) informed the house that the Board is planning to sign an agreement with Amrita University on virtual online lab. The project is funded by DIT.

The House appreciated the efforts made by CBSE and Members expressed satisfaction.

2.16 To report on signing of MoU between CBSE and Hanban (under the Ministry of Education, Govt. of PR of China) for collaboration to promote teaching of Chinese.

As the collaboration between the two countries to promote teaching of Mandarin was declared at the highest level, the CBSE was following up in this regard with the Hanban through proper channel. Eventually, the MoU to support the teaching of Mandarin as an optional foreign language in class VI in the schools affiliated to CBSE was signed by Indian Ambassador S Jaishankar and Xu Lin, Director General of Hanban, the official Chinese organisation that oversees teaching Mandarin abroad. The Board is looking forward to meeting of Joint Working Group on Chinese as agreed in the MoU in the February, 2013.

Professor Hukum Singh, NCERT proposed that there should be a clause in the MoU signed with other countries for promotion of Hindi in those countries by Indian teachers.

2.17 हिंदी (द्वितीय भाषा) पाठ्यचर्या की प्रतिपुष्टि के उपरांत किये गये कार्य की आख्या

द्वितीय भाषा बहुभाषिकता तथा अर्त्तसांस्कृतिक सम्प्रेषण, जो भारतवर्ष की विविधता से परिपूर्ण भाषीय पृष्टभूमि के संदर्भ में अत्यंत ही महत्वपूर्ण है, को बढ़ाने का एक सशक्त माध्यम है। द्वितीय भाषा हेतु पाठ्यचर्या का स्वरूप ऐसा होना चाहिए कि जिससे भाषा में निपुणता प्राप्त करने-कराने के लिए उचित भाषिक परिवेश तथा उस भाषा में लगातार रोचक अध्यास के अवसर उपलब्ध हो सकें। इस संदर्भ में बोर्ड द्वारा हिंदी पाठ्यक्रम- ब की पाठ्यचर्या का पुर्नावलोकन करवाने हेतु इस विषय में एक प्रतिपुष्टि प्रपत्र मुख्यत: अहिंदी भाषी क्षेत्रों में स्थित स्कूलों को भेजा गया था।

उपर्युक्त संदर्भ में बोर्ड को 500 से अधिक प्रतिपुष्टियाँ प्राप्त हुई हैं। अधिकतर प्रतिपुष्टियों में केन्द्रीय माध्यमिक शिक्षा बोर्ड द्वारा प्रस्तावित पाठ्यचर्या के विषय में विस्तृत प्रतिपुष्टियाँ प्राप्त हुई है। इसके अतिरिक्त राष्ट्रीय शैक्षिक अनुसंधान व प्रशिक्षण परिषद् द्वारा प्रकाशित पुस्तकों में दिये कुछ पाठों जैसे- धूल, कीचड़ का काव्य, रैदास के पद, गिल्लू पतझड़ में दूटी पत्तियाँ, डायरी का एक पन्ना, सपनों के से दिन, आदि के विषय में नकारात्मक टिप्पणियाँ प्राप्त हुई हैं।

प्राप्त प्रतिपुष्टियों के आधार पर पाठ्यचर्या में पाठ्यक्रम समिति द्वारा निम्नलिखित परिवर्तन किये गये

हिंदी पाठ्यक्रम- ब (कक्षा नवीं तथा दसवीं)

- 1. अपठित काव्यांश का भार 10 अंकों से घटाकर 8 अंक करने की देने की अनुशंसा की गयी। इस परिवर्तन के कारण अपठित काव्यांश का भार 10 अंकों के स्थान 12 अंक कर दिये जाने के प्रस्ताव का भी अनुमोदन किया गया।
- 2. व्याकरण भाग का भार 20 अंकों को घटाकर 15 अंक कर देने की अनुशंसा की गयी।
- 3. पाठ्यपुस्तकों का भार 40 अंकों को घटाकर 30 अंक कर देने की अनुशंसा की गयी।
- 4. लेखन भाग का भार 10 अंकों से बढ़ाकर 25 अंक कर देने की अनुशंसा की गयी। इस भाग में तीन नये विषयों को सम्मिलित किया गया (चित्रवर्णन, संवाद लेखन, विज्ञापन लेखन)
- प्रश्न पत्र में दिये जा रहे विकल्पों को समाप्त करने की अनुशंसा की गयी।
- 6. पाठ्यचर्या में दिये जाने वाले परीक्षा विनिर्देशों में सूक्ष्म अंकों का वितरण समाप्त किये जाने की अनुशंशसा की गयी।
- 7. शिक्षकों हेतु प्रश्न पत्र तैयार करने के संबंध में आदर्श प्रारूप बनाया गया।

2.18 To report the Reading material development in Work Education, ICT, Home Science, Agriculture, Visual and Performing Arts subjects.

The textual material in Work education, ICT, Home Science, Agriculture, Visual and Performing Arts for Secondary and Senior Secondary is being developed. A fleed for Guidelines for Practical classes in Painting was felt as there was no printed material available for the students and the teachers.45 templates along with the text will be uploaded on CBSE website so that students can download them and can use them for study. The same will also be put in the form of a handbook with guidelines for practical classes in painting. The first draft of the book is ready.

2.19 To report on IT Activities of academic unit

The IT unit has become the backbone of the Academic and CBSE-i departments. The following activities have been completed by the IT unit during the July to December period:

For CBSE National

- Conduct of SA II through online question paper generation on a pilot basis for Gurgaon schools: CBSE has created an Integrated Test Management System (ITMS) for online generation of SA I and SA II question papers, based on a question bank. This system was piloted in 50 schools in Gurgaon.
- Creation of Heritage Microsite: The concept of cultural heritage in a broad sense is perceived as
 comprising of movable and immovable assets of artistic, literary, architectural, historical,
 archaeological, ethnological and scientific values that embody the essence of a nation. The Heritage
 microsite is an online asset to engage with Heritage Education. We invite teachers and students to
 be part of this journey, contribute content in this space, share experiences, knowledge and the joy of
 learning together.
- Plagiarism check on various documents: Anti plagiarism software are being used extensively to check plagiarism in the large number of documents received by Academic unit.
- New Server installation for cbseacademic.in: With the increase in popularity of the
 cbseacademic.in website the current server needed to be upgraded. Therefore a new high capacity
 server has been leased and installed. We are in the process of shifting cbseacademic.in to the new
 server
- Maintenance of 3 servers for <u>cbseacademic.in</u>, CBSE-i Registration and CCE data collection system, <u>cbse-international.com</u> and <u>cbsevocational.in</u> and various other domains
- Technology support for conduct of online recruitment for CBSE Academic and Vocational units: Online forms for registration of candidates for recruitment in Academic and Vocational units: have been created.
- Rewiring of LAN of CBSE Academic building: The LAN of the Academic building was at the end
 of its life. Therefore a new LAN system had to be implemented in the CBSE Academic building.

For CBSE International

- Question Paper Statement and automated date sheet generation software was developed for CBSE-i. This software has been used to generate the QPS and date sheet for CBSE-i.
- Registration system for CBSE-i students was created and Operationalized: A registration
 system was created to register CBSE-I students who join classes IX and XI. The registration system
 is an extension of CBSE-i CCE data entry system. Thus the integrated system is used to do
 registration and later CCE Assessment Data entry.
- CBSE-i CCE data entry system has been updated and modified as per the updated requirements.
 The user interface has been simplified and standardized descriptive indicators have been implemented.
- CBSE-i PAT conduction system software is near completion: The Performance Assessment
 Test is conducted by CBSE-i every year in April. An online exam system has been created to
 conduct this MCQ test.

2.20 To report on Bio Technology Practical Manual for class XII.

Bio technology manual for class XII was prepared and is already available at CBSE stores. The manual was prepared as per latest syllabus and is available for distribution. The content page is attached for ready reference.

2.21 To report initiation of CBSE-i Curriculum pilot project in Indian Schools.

The CBSE has received application from around 200 schools in India. The applications and all supporting documents sent by these schools were scrutinized by a committee in the month of August. The shortlisted schools have been informed accordingly and inspection of these schools is in process.

Inspection process and finalization of the list will be over by 15th February. CBSE-i will commence in India from 1st April 2013.

Director (Academic) informed the house that the CBSE-i is being run through electronic online portal which provides downloadable copies of teachers' manual, work books and student modules. The Director sought advice of the house regarding publication of students modules by CBSE as different schools are approaching different publishers to get these printed. This will facilitate availability of printed material for the satisfaction of parents. The house left the decision at the discretion of CBSE

2.22 To report revision of CBSE-i materials for grades I, II, VI, IX and X.

The units of CBSE-i English classes VI, IX & X have been revised and composed. The process has been initiated and first draft in revised format has been submitted for approval.

2.23 To report development of manual for core areas of CBSE-i Curriculum i.e. Research, SEWA, Perspectives and Life Skills.

The process of Development of manual for core areas of CBSE-i Curriculum i.e. Research, SEWA, Perspectives and Life Skills is in process. The manuals in the above mentioned areas for classes VI, VII and VIII will be uploaded on Portal by the end of March 2013. Approximately 300 videos are available on the CBSE-i portal. An RFP is being floated for acquiring more resources.

2.24 To report the Examination Byelaws and Affiliation Byelaws of CBSE-i Curriculum

The Affiliation and Examination Byelaws for CBSE-i are prepared keeping in mind the curriculum: the CBSE-i is enquiry and skill focused, catering to individual learning styles in terms of pedagogy and assessment. It carries forward the basic strength of the Indian system of education. It aims to promote critical and creative thinking skills, effective communication skills, interpersonal and collaborative skills and information and media skills. There is an inbuilt flexibility as it provides a foundation and an extension curriculum in all subject areas to cater to the different pace of learners. Through the CBSE-i, the Board hopes to provide quality with a reasonable fee. Affiliation and Examination Byelaws have been finalized and matter is given for composing.

2.25 To report modification of parents hand book and parents portal

The process of modification and finalization of Parents Handbook/FAQ is already over and the process of modification of parent's portal will be taken up.

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2.26 To report for collection of Evidence of Assessment for Formative Assessment, Summative Assessment and Co-scholastic Areas for CBSE-i Curriculum.

All the schools offering CBSE-i have been informed to provide Evidence of Assessment for Formative Assessment, Summative Assessment and Co-scholastic Areas for CBSE-i Curriculum. Schools have sent Evidences in the above mentioned areas. The process of verification of Evidences is going on and feedback will be provided to all schools that have sent evidences by 21st January 2013.

2.27 To report on coordination with 41 State Boards for acceptance of class X pass outs of CBSE-i Curriculum at par with CBSE (Main) examination.

Letters were sent to all 41 state Boards in the first week of November for acceptance of class X pass outs of CBSE-i Curriculum which is at par with CBSE (Main) examination.

2.28 To report on coordination with other Universities in India and abroad for facilitating admission of class XII CBSE-i Curriculum pass outs.

The work of CBSE coordination with other Universities in India and abroad for facilitating admission of class XII CBSE-i Curriculum pass outs is in progress.

2.29 To report on Dual Certification for grade XII students for CSBE -i.

Dual certification was proposed and approved in the last general body meeting. However in a meeting chaired by Honorable Chairman which was convened in the month of December, 2012 it was decided that Dual certificate should not be awarded to CSBE- i students. Hence no dual certificate will be awarded to any student.

2.30 To report on Question Bank for the CSBE - / students.

Question Bank for CSBE-i students was provided to all schools having classes IX and X under CBSE – i. The question bank was provided to all schools in the subjects of Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics.

2.31 To report on Hindi Curriculum and availability of units for the schools affiliated to CSBE -i.

Hindi curriculum is on the CBSE-*i* portal. Resource persons were requested to develop units as per the curriculum and the units were uploaded on the portal for classes I, II, III, VI, VII, IX and X.

2.32 To report on Hubs of Excellence for CSBE i

CBSE has taken an initiative to appoint Internal and External Hubs coordinator with the following purpose.

- 1. For quality enhancement/excellence in various subjects.
- 2. To create the teaching interest group initiative.

On CBSE *i* portal different groups have been created for different subjects and a link called "Discussion Groups" has been provided. Each subject has an external and internal coordinator.

Sh. S. S. Minhas, Principal, Guruharkishan Public School expressed concerns over a large number of students failing CTET examination conducted by the Board.

Director (Academic) responded by mentioning the resolution of CTET committee regarding not to dilute the standard of question papers and also told the house that all the question papers were direct and from the syllabus provided. There was a need to improve the quality of learning in colleges providing teacher education specially in the private colleges.

Dr. Dinesh Kumar, Addl. Commissioner, Kendriya Vidhyalaya said that the quality of teachers should improve CTET is okay.

Ms. Lata Vaidayanathan, Principal, Modern School lamented the lack of administrative reforms in school education for the last 40 years. Non-performing staff becomes liability of the school and in absence of accountability school can do nothing to reform these teachers. She proposed that there must be something like CTET for classes IX-XII based on teaching skills every five years. Teachers must be made to do some action research or developing effective lesson plans. There should be more emphasis on the development standardized assessment tools

Director (Academic) added that CAER may chip in developing a series of compendiums of rubrics for various classes covering all major subjects.

Prof. Hukum Singh, NCERT informed the house that the NCERT has published textbooks on pedagogy; however, none of the teacher training colleges use these for actual class-room teaching. This is the main reason behind falling standards of teachers' education in the country. Activity based learning is missing in schools

Prof. B.K.Tripathi, NCERT informed the house that the NCERT has developed and sent to MHRD the manuals on CCE for classes VI-VIII. Chairman CBSE ensured that the Board will take the work done by the council further. He further added that since the Board was the implementing agency, it should be a part of not just policy formulation but also manual development on CCE.

Details of teacher training programmes June 2012 onwards

Fifts new programmes have been conducted since June, 2012 in which 7350 teachers have been trained.

To streamline the work related to Mentoring and Monitoring and to make the Mentoring process a transparent, user friendly and more effective the Board has developed a microsite within the academic website (www.cbseacademic.in) of the Board.

2. Empowerment programmes for Principals

- 44 Principals underwent the training organized in collaboration with NUEPA under the 14th Management Development Programme on Leadership in Educational Administration for Heads of Institutes of Independent Schools affiliated with CBSE which was scheduled from 8th to 12 October 2012.
- II. A 5-day workshop on Management Development Program on Leadership for 18 School leaders for its affiliated schools was conducted by CBSE for its affiliated schoolfrom 29 Oct to 2 Nov 2012 at FDRC, Delhi.

3. Academic Calendar for January 2013 – March 2014

The academic unit of CBSE is involved in many areas of work which include curriculum planning and updation, revisiting the assessment pattern for grades IX to XII, taking feedback on the existing syllabus and text books, developing question banks in different subjects, conducting teacher training programmes principals, empowerment programmes, development of newly inducted principals of new school affiliated to CBSE, conduct of enrichment activities such as National Heritage, Values Education, Evidence of Assessment, National Education Day, Life Skills Programmes, Physical Education Cards, Health and Wellness Programmes and Waves and Change etc. An annual calendar in this regard has been prepared so that systems are put into place as there will be many new appointments under the Academic Cadre.

4. 19th Annual National conference of Sahodaya School Complexes

The 19th National Annual Conference of Sahodaya Conference was held from 22-24 December, 2012 at University Auditorium, Devi Ahilya University, Khandwa Road, Indore (MP) on the theme of "New pedagogies and enabling technologies for teaching and learning". The theme also included sub themes such as Teacher effectiveness, Education quality and economic growth, Twenty first century learning, Edecation 3.0, Transformational pedagogies, Leveraging technology for Jearning. Nearly 470 delegates participated in the above said conference.

5. Observation of Vigilance Awareness Week

The theme of the Vigilance Awareness Week for the year 2012 was "Transparency in Public Procurement" and it was observed from 29th October to 3rd November, 2012. An advisory to schools in this regard was issued (Circular no- Acad - 84/2012). The schools were directed to organize various activities. Few suggested activities quoted in the circular were Banners or posters with slogans related to 'Consumer Awareness', Essay writing on 'Food Adulteration and Awareness', Lectures by eminent personalities on 'Consumer Rights and its importance', Essay writing on 'Role of media in bringing Public Awareness', Debate on 'Is e-Payment an effective tool in reducing corruption', Seminar on 'RTI and Transparency in Public Procurement' were also held.

6. Teri Quiz

CBSE and TERI conducted the Green Olympiad and TERRA Quiz on 25th Aug and 29th Sep, 2012 on the theme 'Me and My Environment'. The quiz was open to students of classes VIII-X. The top 32 schools, seven from each zone and four from the international group - were selected to take part in this national environment quiz. The questions were drawn from topics of daily concern, both local and global; attractive audiovisuals imparted a unique favour to this quiz. This quiz programme was an interesting pedagogical tool for students. Being an extremely effective medium to convey crisp messages in a short period of time, it contained an inherent element of knowledge and competition.

7. Revision of Formative Assessment Teacher's Manual for classes IX and X.

The Formative Assessment Manuals for Teachers are in process of revision. The Manuals are being revised as per the feedback received from the teachers of different schools across the country. The revised manuals will be available in the beginning of the new session 2013-14 for the teachers

8. Conduct of the Summative Assessment – I September-2012.

CBSE supported the schools by providing the question papers and marking schemes in major subjects to all the schools willing to take SA-I for classes IX & X in the month of September- 2012.

70-80 sets of question papers in 08 subjects (Hindi-A, Hindi-B, Eng. (Com.), Eng. (Lang &Lit), Sanskrit, Social Studies, Science and Mathematics) were prepared by the Board for SA-I for class IX and X each which were administered to all the affiliated schools.

9. Group Mathematics Olympiad

CBSE conducts Group Mathematical Olympiad in association with Homi Bhabha Centre for Science Education. This year it was conducted on 2nd December, 2012 at 28 centers located in different parts of India and abroad. Around 4000 students appeared for the test and the evaluation of the answer sheets was got done by CBSE. The result was declared in the second week of January, 2013. Top students from CBSE group will now participate in Indian National Mathematical Olympiad (INMO) conducted by National Board of Higher Mathematics (NBHM) to be held on 3 Feb, 2013.

10.∞ Japan-East Asia Metwork of Exchange for Students and •Youth Programme (JENESYS)

As part of the Japan-East Asia Network of Exchange for Students and Youth Programme (JENESYS) started in the year 2007, a group of around 250 students and 16 teachersfrom the schools affiliated to CBSE from all over India visit Japan annually.

The programme consists of 'Inviting East Asian youths to Japan' and 'sending Japanese youths to East Asia and other exchange programmes'.

The schools affiliated to the Board were asked to send entries from the students for the said programme to be sent to Japan by MHRD,Govt.of India. A huge response was received from all the parts of the country. A total number of 227 students (boys and girls) and 19 teachers were nominated by CBSE and total 88 students and 3 teachers made it to the final selection done by MHRD,Govt of India.

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11. Organization of Zonal Informatics Olympiad (ZIO) and INOI 2013

To promote the use of computers effectively in students, CBSE in collaboration with Indian association for Research in Computing Science organizes ZIO (first round) and NIO (final round) every year. This year first round i.e ZIO was organized on 3rd November 2012, 6589 students from CBSE affiliated schools from India and abroad participated at first level. ZIO was a written test of 3 hours and was conducted at 40 different venues in India and abroad.

NIO (National Informatics Olympiad) is an online test. All qualifiers of first round are eligible to appear for online exam i.e NIO (second round). 314 students qualified this year ZIO and will be appearing for NIO on 19th January, 2013.

12. CENTRE FOR ASSESSMENT EVALUATION AND RESEARCH

(a) Establishment of the Centre, including physical setup and staffing

The Centre is now located on the 4th Floor of the CBSE building, Rouse Avenue, Delhi. The first full time member of staff and an office executive joined the center in November, 2012. The Interim Director and her HR colleagues from Pearson are now working on the induction/orientation programme for the in-coming staff to take effect in early January.

(b) Setting up the Society

CAER has been registered as Society on 29th December, 2013.

(c) Development of the website and creating a Centre identity

The Centre website is now in phase 2 of its development

(d) Operational Objectives

(i) Develop the Centre's Professional Development Programme

A major programme of Professional Development focusing on development of capacity of assessment technical expertise is in the final stages of development with CBSE schools being the first target cohort and will be launched in the first quarter of 2013. The first two workshops for potential MasterTrainers have been held in Delhi and Chennai where participants have embraced with fervor and enthusiasm to bring about a fundamental change in the approach to assessment in the classroom.

The Centre will measure the effectiveness and impact of this programme with the findings used in Centre's publications and research, as appropriate.

(ii) Implementation of the Centre's first phase of research-based activity

The Centre has worked out a paper on standardizing examination results of various States and National Boards. As the workforce available with the Centre is limited, the research lead is being taken by senior experts in the field, with the staff working alongside.

(iii) Identify and make contact with Indian universities and organizations/institutes of interest and relevant expertise

A range of stakeholders with a direct interest in supporting, guiding and advising the Centre's strategy and its positioning within the Indian education landscape has been identified, contacts made and relationship building well underway.

13. Launch of the Heritage Portal.

Heritage Portal (heritage.cbseacademic.in), a microsite on the CBSE website was launched on 29th October, 2012 by Shrimati Anshu Vaish, former Secretary School Education and Literacy with the following objectives:-

- To create a dynamic subject which can emerge as a link program between social and natural sciences.
- 2. To provide a rich online cultural resource for teachers and young children through active learning and doing.

The Portal as of now consists of four domains- Built Heritage, Natural Heritage, Performing Arts and Arts and Crafts.

The content was researched and developed along with Sahapedia (An Online Encyclopedia on Indian Culture and Heritage) and Dr Navina Jafa (Heritage Consultant and Convener, Course Committee, Heritage Education, CBSE). Films, photographs, paintings, write ups from school children on heritage related topics were collected and uploaded. Links with various websites were shared.

The questions of the Heritage India Quiz -2011 were suggested for uploading on the portal.

Quizzes, games and worksheets are being prepared and uploaded to make it more attractive and interactive for the students. The schools who participated in National Education Day 2012 and Heritage India Quiz 2012 have been asked to volunteer for the work on the respective domains in their states. Several projects like Folk Dances of India, Lesser known Monuments of Delhi and on Flora and Fauna of Valley of Flowers have been proposed.

A documentary film making competition was proposed for the coming session.

In the course committee meeting of Heritage Education there was also discussion on developing a guidebook on Heritage Education and Pedagogy. The members have suggested that the question, 'What do you mean by the word Heritage' should be uploaded on CBSE website in the form of a circular as the first step towards the introduction of Heritage Education. The best 100 answers may be uploaded on the portal as well.

It was also discussed in the meeting that first, all the books relating to heritage and its concerned subject should be checked and content should be extracted from them for preparing activity sheets.

14. Organization of Regional Level and National Level Science Exhibition.

The IX CBSE science exhibition was organized at two different levels. Initially the exhibition was organized at Regional level and the selected / qualified exhibits from regional level participated at national level.

The main theme of this year's exhibition was - Science, Society and Environment.

The Regional Level Science Exhibition was organized in the month of August/September 2012 at 12 different venues with a record participation of **1180** students. Ten/Fifteen best exhibits were selected from each center, for participation at National Level Science Exhibition.

National level science exhibition was hosted by St. Xavier's School, New Delhi, on 30th and 31st October 2012. 166 schools participated at National Level.

This exhibition was inaugurated by Honorable Union Minister of MHRD Dr. M.M Pallam Raju and Minister of State, MHRD Mr. Jitin Prasada.

A total of 24 exhibits were selected at National level. Each winning team was given a merit certificate as well as a cash prize of Rs. 3000.

15. Selecting Media/ PR Agency to device and implement the communication/ media strategies for continuous and comprehensive evaluation advocacy

To finalize the Media/ PR Agency to carry forward to disseminate the CCE advocacy programme. The agency has so far covered total number of 147 coverage in print media and 3 coverage in electronic media related to the various aspects of CBSE activities. The details of the coverage are as follows:

16. Integration and promotion of Values Education in the schools affiliated to CBSE

In order to support integration of Values Education across major subjects in all the classes (Circular no Acad -22/2012), a kit was launched on 1st November, 2012 at India Islamic Centre. The kit contains a hand book for teachers, activity cards and a C.D of songs. The cards consisted of activities designed in four categories; Nursery to II, III to V, VI to VIII and IX to XII.

The kit was launched by Honourable Dr. M.M. Pallam Raju, Minister of Human Resource Department.

Three workshops on preparation of Values based questions for classes 9th 10th 11th and 12th were held, two by the Sahodaya group and one by the Government Schools.

An orientation for a workshop to train master trainers consisting of Principals was held on 20th December, 2012. The first master trainer workshop was held on 10th January, 2013. A four and a half hour module has been prepared where 15 principals and 5 teachers from their respective schools would be trained to be moderators and master trainers.

They would in turn train 200 + teachers and 200 + students across the country from all regions on 24 and 25th January, 2013 as part of the celebration of the 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda.

17. Orientation Programmes for teachers on Geospatial an Elective under Vocational stream

A new competency based career oriented course on Geospatial Technology has been introduced by CBSE in collaboration with leading Geospatial Solutions Company "ROLTA India Limited" on pilot basis in July 2010 for classes XI-XII. The curriculum and the content for classes XI and XII have been developed by Board in collaboration of ROLTA India Limited.

The Board has conducted three awareness programmes to sensitise school regarding the course. The Board has also conducted two teacher training programmes and plans to conduct more teacher training programme in this regard.

18. Heritage India Quiz 2012

The CBSE Heritage India Quiz, initiated in 2001, is an Inter School Quiz which has been conceptualized by the Board with the objective of creating awareness and appreciation in the student community towards the rich cultural heritage and diversity of our country.

The CBSE Heritage India Quiz has grown from a minor event into being a much awaited TV program. This year, the competition was being coordinated with **AETN 18 Media Private Ltd.**, in multiple phases (**City Chapter, Regional Chapter, National Semi Finals and National Finals**). More than 2500 students from 750 schools over 8 regions participated in the quiz vide **circular no Acad-57/2012**

The National Finals were held on 7th December, 2012 at Modern school, Barakhamaba in the presence of Mr. Rajasri Bhattacharya, Secretary, School Education and Literacy. Delhi Public School, Gurgaon was declared winners and were given a cash prize of **Rs. 21,000** and a Trophy with Delhi Public School, Duliajan was given a cash prize of **Rs. 12,000** as runner ups. Consolation prizes were given to Sacred Heart Sr. Sec. School, Chandigarh and Modern school, Vasant Vihar was given a cash prize of **Rs. 4,500**.

19. National Education Day

To celebrate this day CBSE introduced themes for schools every year and this year's theme was 'Joy of Giving'. 150 schools participated in the event vide circular no- Acad- 83/2012

Two teams (a student and a teacher in each team) were selected from each CBSE region on the basis of the details filled in the questionnaire and the digital evidences. The 14 shortlisted teams were invited to Delhi on 20th November, 2012 for the Final Round of interactions/presentations selected by the eminent panelists.

The chief guest of the event was Mr. Rajasri Bhattacharya, Secretary School Education and Literacy and distributed the cash prize and certificates to the winners.

The teams were awarded in the three (Outstanding, Excellent and Meritorious) for their contribution to the Society. The top three teams declared as winners are:-

- 1. PEM School of Excellence, Tripura.
- 2. Birla High school, Kolkata.
- 3. Rachana School, Ahmedabad

The schools were given a cash prize of Rs. 10,000 each. The other schools participated were given certificates of participation.

20. Institutionalization and conferring of CBSE Mentors Awards

The CBSE has institutionalized CBSE Mentors Awards to recognize the services of those principals who have been trained and appointed as Mentors to provide necessary help to other schools. Every school affiliated to board has been allotted to one of the Mentors, who provide feedback to school about the best practices and to the Board about the state of implementation of CCE in the schools.

The Board has trained about 3000 Mentors since 2010 throughout the country and abroad. The first CBSE Mentor Awards have been conferred on 15 mentors who have mentored the schools in 2010 and 2011.

General Discussion by the Chairman CBSE

Shri Vinnet Joshi, Chairman CBSE, shared with the house important decisions taken at the meetings of examination committee and finance committee on January 14, 2013. Chairman informed the house that the Board has decided to amend its examination bye-laws to make space for the students who have already passed out from schools but due to change of mind wish to pursue vocational education again at school level. Earlier the Board did not allow such students to reappear in different courses at the school level except for improvement cases.

The house applauded this decision in unison

Chairman, CBSE also informed the house that the Board will provide trained Mentors for introducing courses in vocational education to school for initial six months handholding.

Prof. B. K. Tripathi highlighted the need of a pre-assessment of students who will come back to schools to study vocational courses. He also enquired about the upper age limit of such students.

Chairman, CBSE told the Board has not yet decided on the upper age limit of such students

Prof. Om Vikas suggested mission oriented empowerment programmes for the teachers of vocational education in tune with National Occupation Standards. Skill Knowledge Providers may be used for such training. He emphasized the need of resource budgeting by the government in this regard.

Chairman, CBSE further elaborated that Skill Knowledge Providers are of two kinds; first category is constituted by those SKPs who provide the training and simply leave—In the other category come those SKPs who provide the training and also ensure that students are properly absorbed in the vocation.

Chairman, CBSE assured that proper funding will be provided.

Agenda Item: 4 - New Agenda items for consideration and approval

Agenda item - 4.1

To consider and approve major modification in the curriculum document 2015

In a meeting of conveners of all the committee of courses it was proposed to make the following modifications in the basic design of main courses for the curriculum document 2015

- 1. There will be no sample question papers for Classes IX XiI.
- 2. There will be question banks for classes IX XII.
- 3. Every year questions will be added to the question banks. There will be one unit on value based questions in question banks.
- 4. There will no blue print and no individual mark allocation for chapters as it leads to 'teaching to the rest', Unit-wise mark allocation is being proposed.
- 5. For Classes IX- XII model templates and designs have been developed.
- 6. Question papers will be generated in the online mode with help of Question Banks created for classes IX and X.
- 7. There will be broad guidelines for the practical subjects and projects for all the subjects and Assessments of speaking and listening skills in English

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.2

To consider and approve the proposal regarding Introduction of Open Book Examination in CBSE Schools from the academic session, 2013-14

In continuation of its agenda on Examination Reforms, the Board has decided to introduce Open Book Examination system as an alternative method of testing, an attempt to focus more on promoting higher level learning competencies and skills rather than testing rote learning.

With the purpose to guide the Board in conceptualizing and fine-tuning the Scheme, a Committee has been constituted which has had its preliminary meeting on 10th October, 2012 : 1

Chairman CBSE informed the house that it will be based on Case Studies. The Case studies will be provided to students beforehand (3-4 months before exam) and open ended questions based on the given case studies will be asked in the examination. This will comprise only twenty percent of the weightage in classes IX, X, XI and XII. Chairman also clarified that the case study will be same for the entire group. Case Studies will be developed in the determined units and will be notified in the curriculum 2015.

To consider and approve the extension the Pilot Project of Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills, from 120 schools to all the schools affiliated to CBSE by adopting due process

As per the resolution of the Course Committee in English and subsequent approvals in the Curriculum Committee and the Governing Body meeting, the pilot on Assessment of Speaking and Listening skills in English (ASL) in collaboration with Trinity College, London is all set to take place on in the second fortnight of February, 2013 in 120 schools of National Capital Region (NCR) in classes IX and XI.

Chairman proposed to extend the project to all the schools affiliated to the CBSE depending upon the availability of competent assessors.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.4

To consider and approve organization of a pilot on English language skills test for 2000 students of classes XI and XII by the British Council on Complementary basis

Chairman, CBSE told the house that schools need training of teachers to do assessment of Speaking and listening skills. The aim of this pilot is to benchmark the English Language proficiency of students of the 9th and 11th grade of CBSE affiliated schools. As CBSE has decided to introduce the assessment of Speaking and listening in all CBSE affiliated schools the pilot will act as a test bed to identify potential problems and hurdles and ways to resolve them.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.5

To consider and approve organization of 6 months online English language skills and English teaching course for 150 teachers from the schools affiliated to CBSE by Cengage Edu Teach-National Geographic/ Edu Teach on Complementary basis

Cengage Edu Teach-National Geographic/Edu Teach has approached CBSE to conduct a 6 months online English tanguage skills and English teaching course for 150 teachers. This will also help in training of teachers in assessing ASL.

Professor Bhairabi Prasad Sahoo stressed the need to learn English language as the major portion of literature in higher education is available in English

To consider and approve the Introduction of "NCC and NSS" as a compulsory component in the curriculum

Chairman CBSE elaborated that in order to develop spirit and training for community service, NCC which at present is one of the two activities to be chosen by students out of eight as part of Part B of Coscholastic Areas may be introduced in schools. It is proposed that students on a voluntary basis choose NCC as an option of at least once in the years from class VI to X. Similarly NSS (National Service Scheme) with the motto of 'Not Me But You' which stresses upon understanding the community and developing a sense of social and civic responsibility may also be taken up as a compulsory component for at least one year between VI to X. NCC authorities has approached the Board and the Board will contact NSS authorities in this regard. In view of suggestions received from these authorities the proposal will be suitably modified.

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The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.7

To consider and approve setting up of National institute for Continuous Professional Development at Gurgaon with Centers at Kochi, Panchkula and Kakinada

Chairman, CBSE explained the need of national institute with ancillary centers in different regions and brought into light the fact that without sustained efforts in the area of training of teachers no reform would bear any result. He informed the house that the Finance Committee of the Board has already approved the proposal. This proposal is one among the most ambitious schemes of the Board planned to upgrade the quality of school education in the country. COBSE has a building in Gurgaon which it is willing to rent out to CBSE for this purpose. Many of the house members volunteered their services for the upcoming centers. Chairman, CBSE extended a warm welcome and said that the Board will be more than happy to involve members.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.8

Proposal for the Development and Practice of Technology Augmented Learning and Education Environment Management' (TALEEM)

Chairman, CBSE briefed the house that Professor K. R. Srivathsan developed a programme to reach out to students in the remote areas of country with lesser number of resources and experts to teach in the field of higher education. The programme uses cloud technology where students would access cloud-based applications through a web browser or a light-weight desktop or mobile app while the software and user's data are stored on servers at a remote location (Say at Delhi). As CBSE found prospects in this project for reaching out to schools situated in the remote places of country, Professor Srivatsan proposed the scheme to CBSE. It is termed as 'Technology Augmented Learning and Education Environment Management', or, TALEEM. The project will be initially launched at Indore, Amritsar and Cochin centers.

This proposal is for the modernization of CBSE and all its member schools to initiate the right beginning of a transformation of the school education system through emerging contours of connectivity, content and collaboration as enabled and augmented by the fast evolving ICT scenario. TALEEM when imaginatively applied to vocational education will connect the students with employment in various development projects.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.9

To consider and approve the recycling of the paper waste generated at CBSE including regional offices with the help of an NGO working in the field and use the stationery and other items produced for office consumption and installing 'Paper Recycling Plant' at later stage.

CBSE proposes to undertake an initiative by collecting all this used/discarded paper judiciously and getting it recycled with the help of NGOs, 'Green-O-Tech India' working in the field and use the stationery and other items produced for office consumption (like note pads, file covers, and even felicitation certificates).

Chairman thanked Director (Academic) for this proposal and said it should have done long before.

The house unanimously complimented the Board and granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.10

To consider and approve Oracle free training on Alice and green foot through virtual and in- class training to in house staff and to master trainers

The Oracle academy in collaboration with CBSE proposes to offer free training programmes in CCE in virtual training model and Alice and Green foot (educational games and animations) to all subject teachers of classes VI-XII and Java Fundamentals Course for Computer Science Teachers of CBSE Schools.

Chairman, CBSE elaborated that the programme will enable teachers and students to develop their skills to use computer technology to reflect their learning. The teachers and students will develop skills in animation, storytelling, creating short animated movies and educational games and will be equipped to use new innovative methods of teaching and learning for the classroom.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.11

To consider and approve introduction of the new courses on Foundry Technology and Front Office Management for classes XI and XII from the session 2013-14.

The Board has developed drafts of the curricula for Foundry Technology and Front Office Management for classes XI and XII by involving experts from industry and Institutes of Higher Learning. Apart from skills, the curriculum also includes business entrepreneurship development and Soft skills.

The courses are proposed to start from this Academic session 2013 -14. The Chairman elaborated that Sector Skill Councils and knowledge industry partner will also be involved in these courses.

As per the Govt. of India's order No.-1-4/2011-VE dated September 3, 2012, till the time SSCs become functional in all the identified sectors for nationally common NOS's, the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) would develop them in consultation with industry associations.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.12

To consider and approve the revision of curriculum and renaming of existing vocational courses

Chairman, CBSE told the house that the vocational courses were designed by the Board in eighties; therefore, there was a dire need to modernize these courses to instill a fresh lease of life. So far the curriculum of the following courses namely Bakery and Confectionary, Dairying, Travel and Tourism, Structure and Fabrication, Accountancy and Auditing, Electronics Technology, Health Care Sciences and Horticulture has been revised into two paper package form. Members of Subject Committees suggested renaming existing courses in Dairying as Dairy Science and Technology and Structure and Fabrication as Civil Engineering.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.13

To consider and approve re-launched Auxiliary Nursing and Midwifery course from the session 2013-14

Chairman informed the house that the Board has withdrawn this subject last year as the eligibility criteria of admission to the course was changed by the Indian Nursing Council. However, with the direction of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, Indian Nursing Council has again changed the criteria now. In this context Hon'ble High Court of Punjab has also given a judgment to continue the ANM course in schools. Revised criteria of admission may be followed for continuing this course. Therefore, the Board proposes to re-launch this course.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.14

To consider and approve CBSE e-governance System for CBSE National

CBSE e-governance system: The proposed system will provide actionable information to improve the performance of both teachers and students; and provide information to parents, policy makers and the public regarding CBSE's efforts. This solution will increase data driven decision making at all levels in education.

Automated online generation Question Papers of SA II for CBSE main and CBSE-i : CBSE

has created an Integrated Test Management System (ITMS) for online generation of SA I and SA II question papers, based on a question bank. This system will be rolled out to schools nationwide in March

User Trainings

As technology becomes more pervasive it is essential for all members of an organization to get adequate training on the effective use of technology. In order to enable usage of existing technology tools by CBSE staff the following trainings are proposed.

- Officers deployed in the academic unit may be trained to use Anti Plagiarism Software.
- The subject experts in concerned subjects need to be trained on the online SA Question Paper generation system.
- 3. All the computer assistants and stenographers can be trained on office software

For CBSE International

Online exam system for PAT in CBSE-i schools: An online exam system has been created to conduct this test. This system will be rolled out to schools nationwide in March.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.15

To consider and approve the participation and/or presentation of research papers by CBSE faculty in at least 2-3 national and 1-2 international level conferences/seminars/symposiums.

Chairman illustrated the need of motivation for encouraging CBSE faculty to carry out research studies relating to issues and challenges faced by the Board.

Prof. Om Vikas emphasized the need of monetary incentives for publishing papers in journals and the scheme should be extended to school teachers also.

Chairman, CBSE responded that the Board is beginning with the CBSE faculty and the recognition of these efforts will be done post-facto. As it will require administrative support therefore, the Board will later on consider extending this programme to school teachers.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.16

To consider and approve issuing guidelines to schools for the selection of books for classes I-VIII

Chairman CBSE brought in to the notice of house the need of fixing responsibility for selecting textbooks containing anti-national, anti-society material for classes' I-VIII on school management and principal. As in most of the schools teachers are not responsible for prescribing books, the onus cannot be on poor teachers.

Prof. Hukum Singh, NCERT proposed that there should be a vetting mechanism for ensuring the quality of textbooks. He further suggested that NCERT has developed activity based textbooks and schools must ensure that the textbooks prescribed by them must meet the standard as laid down in NCERT textbooks.

Prof. B.K. Tripathi, NCERT suggested to verify the content validity of the books prescribed.

Prof. Hukum Singh, NCERT stated that the Right to Education stipulated NCERT as the academic authority

Chairman, CBSE rectified Prof. Hukum Singh by quoting the section 29 (1) of the RTE Act, 2009 which states that 'the curriculum and the evaluation procedure for elementary education shall be laid down by an academic authority to be specified by the appropriate Government, by notification'.

Chairman, CBSE further elaborated that it is the state government which notifies the academic authority till class VIII and different state governments prescribe different textbooks on the basis of NCF 2005.

Prof. R. C. Thakaran, University of Delhi wanted to know about the kind of action that would be taken against the defaulter schools.

Chairman, CBSE replied that the action will be taken in two modes i.e. civil action- by disaffiliating the defaulter school and criminal prosecution- by registering FIR for not abiding by the affidavit given at the time of affiliation. As Prof. Thakaran wanted to know whether there are schools which have been actually disaffiliated, Chairman informed the house that so far around 50 schools have been disaffiliated on different grounds.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.17

To consider and approve issuing guidelines to schools regarding integration ICT of across subjects for classes I-VIII and IX-X and introduction of an additional ICT subject for classes IX-X.

Chairman, CBSE elaborated that the Board offers Foundation of Information Technology in classes IX and X as an additional subject. The Board wishes to rename the subject and revise its curriculum in view of the growing demand and utility of IT courses.

The Board also proposes to bring out guidelines for assimilating ICT in major curricular areas in classes 1-X in two volumes one for the classes I-VIII and the other for IX and X.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.18

To approve collaboration between the Embassy of France in India and CBSE in the area of teaching and learning of French

Chairman, CBSE told the house that the Embassy of France in India has approached Central Board of Secondary Education to collaborate and assist in the area of teaching and learning of French. The Board may collaborate with Embassy of France in India in the area of textbook revision, exchange of academic staff, teachers, trainees, experts, development of curricula and training packages including the introduction of the internationally recognized certification of French "DELF and DALF" and teacher training. The Embassy of France has expressed its willingness to sign a MoU with CBSE in this regard.

Professor Hukum Singh, NCERT proposed that there should be a clause in the MoU signed with other countries for promotion of Hindi in those countries by Indian teachers.

To approve introduction of Italian Language in the schools affiliated to CBSE and collaboration between the Italian Embassy Cultural Centre India and CBSE in this regard

Chairman, CBSE described that on the similar lines as stated in agenda item 4.18 Italian Embassy has also approached CBSE and indicated their willingness to assist CBSE in introducing Italian in the Schools affiliated to CBSE. The Board may collaborate with Embassy of Italy in India in the area of textbook revision, exchange of academic staff, teachers, trainees, experts, development of curricula and training packages and teacher training. The Embassy of Italy has expressed its willingness to sign a MoU with CBSE in this regard.

Professor Hukum Singh, NCERT again proposed that there should be a clause in the MoU signed with other countries for promotion of Hindi in those countries by Indian teachers.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.20

To approve the syllabus of Human Rights and Gender Studies as an optional Elective Form for classes XI&XII from the session 2013-2014.

Director (Academic) informed the house that CBSE had developed a curriculum of Human Rights and Gender Studies in the year 2006 on the directions of then Secretary of Education, Govt. of India. The same was discussed with NCERT; however, unfortunately the course did not see the light of the day. Now the CBSE has decided to go ahead and offer the course from 2013-14. The textual material will be brought out in a phased manner for the session 2013-2014. The syllabus of the Elective has been prepared.

Prof. Ujjawal K Singh, University of Delhi corroborated the Director (Academic) and said that he was there in the meeting with NCERT and had seen that curriculum. He appreciated the CBSE curriculum and said he liked the course contents very much as it had a separate focus on Gender Studies.

Prof. Hukum Singh, NCERT said that the NCERT must be involved at the time of development of content.

Prof. Zubaida Habib, Jamia Millia insisted on making this elective compulsory.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.21

To approve the development of age appropriate, gender sensitivity cards from classes I-XII and Teachers' Handbook on Gender sensitivity

Chairman, CBSE shared the agenda with the house to bring out activity cards for various levels of students in four categories – pre-primary level (Grade I & II), primary level (III-V), upper primary level (VI-VIII) and secondary level (IX-XII). Along with these gender sensitivity cards the CBSE will also develop the teachers' handbook to clarify the suggested pedagogy of transacting activities.

Strategies for sensitization of school children about gender.

- 1. Preparation of training module in consultation with MWCD, M/Law and Delhi Police
- 2. Conducting (10 hours) training programme for peer educators
- 3. Assessment of peer educators their suitability to undertake training
- Selection of 80-100 peer educators
- 5. Further training of selected peer educators
- 6. Peer educators to take workshops in schools on Saturday/ Sunday

Responsibilities:

CBSE

- 1. Preparation of Training Handbook with Gender sensitivity Cards
- Assessment of peer educators on GSC
- Co-ordination with schools and other agencies
- Financing training

MWCD, M/Law and Delhi Police

- 1. Providing material for preparation of training module
- 2. Providing resource persons for training and assessment

MCIT

- Providing community radio to the CBSE to be used by peer educators for propagating gender sensitive messages
- 2. Help in creating high quality multimedia messages for websites and mobiles.

Chairman CBSE informed the house that the schools will identify student volunteers (Peer Educators) to train their fellow peers on gender sensitivity. These around 80-100 young volunteers will be selected on the basis of assessment of their attitude towards training others and will work under the limitations of law. They will also appreciate the nuances of legal procedure. Training modules for the volunteer students will be developed jointly by Ministry of Women and Child Development, Delhi Police and the Ministry of Law. These student volunteers will be provided a sort of identity card by the Delhi Police and they will enjoy the prerogative to be treated on priority basis in the Police Stations. They may be called 'Rakshak'.

A member pointed out that the name 'Rakshak' should not be given to such volunteers as it further accentuate the weakness of women. It was opposed in University of Delhi and had a strong backlash.

The Chairman informed that the name was suggested by the Delhi Police and the Board is open to rename it. It could be 'Hitaishi' or 'Gender Ambassador' or another name could be debated.

The pilot for the time being is for Delhi and will be extended to other metros

The Chairman also informed the house that the Board has decided to launch a **Community Radio** to disseminate the messages of gender equality and respect and dignity for women. The Finance Committee of the Board has approved this project. The Ministry of Information and broadcasting has agreed to provide its support in this endeavor on complementary basis.

Prof. Hukum Singh, NCERT desired that Chairman CBSE should share this matter with other boards through COBSE.

To consider and approve revision of CCE Manuals at Primary, Upper Primary and Secondary levels

The Teachers' manual on CCE at Primary level was drafted by the Committee specially set up for this purpose based on the Scheme of CCE announced by the CBSE in 2004.

Similarly, separate committees were set up to review the Board's Manuals on CCE at Upper Primary and Secondary levels. The Manuals are being revised based on the feedback received from the teachers, students and parents and analysis reports of the Verification of Evidence of Formative and Summative Assessments conducted by the CBSE. The documents are expected to be brought out for dissemination to schools in the month of March, 2013. The Board will extend the work done by NCERT.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.23

Proposal of PAN-India content delivery network for e-learning on integrating ICT into the learning environment of school students by training teachers to use online content

Chairman, CBSE informed the house that this is basically about the virtual laboratories. In order to sort out lack of resources in remotely situated or rural schools this can be used as an alternative. Also it will cater to the pace of individual child if a child wants to re-do the practical in school.

In this reference ERNET India proposed to collaborate with the CBSE to rollout OLabs rollout project and also proposes to setup a Pan-India content delivery network for e-learning to facilitate the rollout of OLabs.

To overcome from lack of physical labs, DeitY supported the Olabs project to CDAC and Amrita to develop online laboratory/virtual lab for experiments CDAC and Amrita have developed Olabs covering experiments of Science and Chemistry of 9th and 10th classes of CBSE curriculum in 1st phase and will extend the efforts for other subjects and higher classes i.e. 11th and 12th classes in English, Hindi and other regional languages such as Marathi, Malayalam etc. CBSE needs to be associated for school Teachers training.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Prof. K P Chinda emphasized the need of publication of list of sites by CBSE from where authentic information on various subjects may be downloaded as, 90% information available on internet in untrustworthy.

Agenda Item: 4.24

To approve revision of Fashion Studies curriculum for classes XI and XII.

Meeting of Committee of courses was convened on 20th November, 2012 and 5th December 2012 respectively from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm at CBSE, Shiksha Sadan with the agenda to review, revise and update FASHION STUDIES CURRICULUM for class XI for 2015 Examination and for Class XII for 2016 Examination.

To consider and approve revision of Computer Science curriculum for classes XI and XII.

Committee of courses revised Computer Science Curriculum for class XI for 2014 Examination and for Class XII for 2015 Examination. The revised curriculum is placed before the house for approval.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item 4.26

To consider and approve the recommendations of Right to Education (RTE 2010) regarding time table, staff norms and work in the light of School Based Assessment under Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation for classes IX and X

In continuation with the Circular No.3 dated April 8, 2011 on guidelines for implementation of the provisions under the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act (RTE), 2009, the Board further plans to inform schools regarding revised Time-table, Staffing Norms and work allocation to teachers as below:

S.No Revised Time Table, Staffing Norms and Work allocation to teachers of the schools affiliated to CBSE

- As Per the recommendations of RTE Act-2009, the teacher student ratio in Primary and Upper Primary is to be maintained as mentioned in the schedule for section 19 and 25.
- School should function for 6 hrs. 10 minutes. Teachers will be retained after school hours for additional 1 hour 20 minutes
 which can be used for planning/ preparation/ checking/ follow up work and for ensuring safe arrival and exit of students
 before and after school hours. (Forty-five teaching including preparation hours)
- Time Table having 08 periods per day will be followed in schools affiliated to CBSE with 45 minutes duration in the 1st and 5th periods and 40 minutes duration for the remaining periods
- 4. Number of periods will be 07 each for both English and Hindi for classes VI to X. However, for Primary Section, the number of periods allotted will be 8 each for English and Hindi. Periods for developing proficiency in spoken language will be carved out from periods allotted for the respective languages.
- Of the 7/8/8 periods allotted for Maths for classes VI to VIII/IX/X, 01 period is to be earmarked separately for Maths Lab activity.
- 6. Of the 6/7/7 periods allotted for Science for classes VI to VIII/IX/X, 01 period is to be earmarked separately for Lab activity. For classes XI and XII, 09 periods are allotted for all Elective Subjects with the breakup of 5 (Theory) +4(practical's) for subjects involving practical's. One batch for practical class may comprise of 20-25 students.
- 7. Two periods each for per week be allotted for Work Education and Art Education for classes I to X.
- 8. One library period for class X should be allotted by shifting 01 period from Games/ Yoga i.e. class X will have 03 periods for games/ Yoga instead of 04.
- 01 period for Work Experience will be altotted during school hours itself for classes XI and XII by altotting a period from Games/ Yoga periods.
- 10. One period is to be allotted for Co-Curricular Activities in all classes from I to X. In case 01 period is insufficient for CA activities, a zero period is to be framed to conduct the activities effectively.

11. CCE warrants more time for the teachers during class room activities. Therefore, 2 block periods per subject per week to be planned in the time table of primary and secondary classes.

A member highlighted the need of prohibition of second shift schools for girls.

Another member said that the time for the project work and co-curricular activities must also appear in the division of time

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item4.27

To consider and approve the development of text book of philosophy for class XII for the session 2014-15

Continuing with the policy of discontinuing the use of the books of private publishers, the Board has brought out supplementary material in Philosophy for class XI and is in the process of bringing out the Hindi version of it. As a sequel to it, the Board proposes to develop books in Philosophy for the session 2014-15 for class XI and for the session 2015-16 for class XII.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item 4.28

Initiation of Pilot project on strengthening core academic competencies in English Language and Mathematics at Secondary Stage for smooth transition to under graduation level

CBSE proposes to initiate a pilot project on strengthening core academic competencies in English language and Mathematics at different school stages in collaboration with TE in order to ensure smooth transition to under graduate level. The pilot project envisages diagnosing 'difficult areas' of learning in the subjects of English and Mathematics at different stages of school education and develop multi-media interactive lessons with a problem solving approach and an embedded evaluation process that students can navigate on their own with facilitation from teachers. The proposed ICT enabled pedagogy based material will have one-to-one support for slow learners and an interactive teaching as well as self-learning modules.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same

Agenda Item 4.29

To consider and approval training calendar for teachers' training in the subject Geospatial Technology

A new competency based career oriented course on Geospatial Technology has been introduced by CBSE in collaboration with leading Geospatial Solutions Company "ROLTA India Limited" on pilot basis in July 2010 for classes XI-XII. The curriculum and the content for classes XI and XII have been developed by Board in collaboration of ROLTA India Limited.

A training programmes to train teachers in this regard has been scheduled.

To approve the proposal with regard to make Agriculture based curriculum in the subject of Science and Maths for Class IX and X for the students offering vocational subjects.

The need to make Agriculture based text books in the subject of Science and Mathematics for Class IX and X was being felt for a long time so that students of rural areas are also benefitted. For writing Agriculture based text books, the issue was discussed with the Director General of ICAR and Secretary (DARE) and subsequently, the job has been awarded to Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR), New Delhi. The ICAR has been requested to get prepared the following documents:

1. Text Books; 2. Practical Manual; 3. Teacher's Manual

In addition, ICAR has also been requested to update the curriculum and also to get the text books, practical manual and Teacher's manual written in the following Vocational Courses for Class XI and XII:

Horticulture	Electives for Horticulture	Pomology	Floriculture
Olericulture	Dairying Science Technology & Management	Dairying	Dairying- Production

The Board is planning to introduce the amended Agriculture based courses from the next academic session i.e., 2013-14.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

कार्यसूची संख्या- 4.31

बोर्ड द्वारा किये त्रिभाषा सूत्र के अनुयोजन तथा हिंदी विषय कक्षा दसवीं अथवा बारहवीं तक अनिवार्य बनाने पर चर्चा

अध्यक्ष महोदय ने सदन को यह बताया कि बोर्ड ने एक राष्ट्रीय बोर्ड होने के नाते छात्रों की भाषीय विविधता से परिपूर्ण पृष्ठभूमि को ध्यान में रखते हुए त्रिभाषा सूत्र का उचित अनुयोजन करने के पश्चात इसकी मूल भावना के अनुसार ही अपने से संबद्ध विद्यालयों में लागू किया हुआ है। भाषा अध्यन के संबंध में विद्यालय छात्रों के चुनाव को ही सर्वोपिर वरीयता देते हैं। बोर्ड संबद्ध सभी स्कूलों में राजभाषा हिंदी कक्षा 1 से कक्षा आठवीं तक अनिवार्य है। इसके अतिरिक्त कक्षा छठी से कक्षा आठवीं तक त्रिभाषा सूत्र के अनुसार छात्र 23 राष्ट्रीय भाषाओं में से किसी एक भाषा का चुनाव भी कर सकते हैं।

बोर्ड को विभिन्न संस्थाओं से यह प्रतिपुष्टि प्राप्त होती रहती है कि हिंदी भाषा को कक्षा दसवीं अथवा बारहवीं तक अनिवार्य कर दिया जाये। इस संबंध में अध्यक्ष महोदय ने आगे बताया कि बोर्ड राजभाषा हिंदी का प्रसार देश के अहिंदी भाषी क्षेत्रों में भी कर रहा है तथा भाषा से संबंधित कोई भी नीति देश के सभी भागों के हितों को ध्यान में रखकर ही तय की गई है। भाषा संबंधी कोई भी कठोर नियम पूरे भारत वर्ष में समान रूप से लागू करवाना इसिलए व्यावहारिक नहीं प्रतीत होता है क्योंकि लोग इसे क्षेत्रीय अस्मिता के विरूद्ध मानते हैं जो भारतवर्ष की संघीय अखण्डता के लिए अति आवश्यक है। हिंदी को कक्षा दसवीं अथवा बारहवीं तक अनिवार्य करना कदाचित देश के अहिंदी भाषी क्षेत्रों में रहने वाले छात्रों के हितों के विरूद्ध होगा तथा इसके परिणाम बृहद स्तर पर हो सकते हैं।

कक्षा दसवीं तक हिंदी अनिवार्य करने से विद्यार्थियों को तीन भाषाएँ पढ़नी पढ़ेगी तथा इससे अन्य भारतीय भाषाएँ पढ़ने के इच्छुक छात्रों पर कदाचित अतिरिक्त बोझ पड़ेगा। इसके अतिरिक्त छात्रों की भिन्न योग्यता के अनुसार उन्हें प्रत्येक क्षेत्र में अधिक-से-अधिक विषयों में चुनाव करने की सुविधा होनी चाहिए।

यह विदित है कि शिक्षा संविधान की समवर्ती सूची में सम्मिलित है; अतैव राज्य सरकारों द्वारा चलाए जा रहे विद्यालयों में हिंदी अनिवार्य रूप से पढ़ाने का निर्णय लेने हेतु संबंधित राज्य सरकारें स्वतंत्र हैं।

अध्यक्ष महोदय द्वारा यह भी सदन के ध्यान में लाया गया कि बोर्ड द्वारा हिंदी के प्रचार व प्रसार हेतु किये गये कार्यों के फलस्वरूप हिंदी पढ़ने वाले विद्यार्थियों की संख्या में उत्तरोत्तर वृद्धि हो रही है।

सदन ने पूर्ण सहमति से बोर्ड द्वारा लागू भाषा नीति की प्रशंसा की और यह दर्ज करवाया कि यह नीति वर्तमान स्थिति में भारत की अखण्डता एवं एकता की दृष्टि से सर्वथा उचित है तथा इसमें किसी संशोधन की आवश्यकता नहीं है।

बोर्ड द्वारा लागू भाषा नीति गरिमापूर्ण सदन द्वारा पुनः अनुमोदन किया गया।

Agenda Item: 4.32

To approve revision of CBSE - i curriculum for classes f to V

It is essential to revise CSBE – *i* curriculum for classes I to V. In subjects like English and EVS a minor modification is required. Also the number of units in each class may be reduced.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.33

To consider and approve CBSE-i training programme for teachers in India

CBSE proposes to organize two days Training programmes for all the teachers of the schools getting associated with CBSE -i in the month of March to update teachers on CBSE-i and familiarize them with activity based teaching and how to guide children in core areas. They will also be trained to use CBSE-i portal comfortably.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.34

To approve revised Computer Science Curriculum for CBSE -i for class XI for 2014 Examination and Class XII for 2015 Examination.

The Board felt the need to revise Computer Science curriculum for CBSE *i* to meet the requirements of CBSE *i*. Hence, computer science curriculum was revised by replacing C++ programming tanguage with Python.

To approve revised Information Practices Curriculum for CBSE — for class XI from session 2013-14 and Class XII from session 2014-15.

The Board proposes to prepare a curriculum of **Information Practices Curriculum** (CBSE *i*) which could meet international standards and requirements. Hence, Information practices curriculum was revised.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.36

To approve revised Home Science Curriculum for CBŞE – *i* for class XI from session 2013-14 and Class XII from session 2014-15.

The revision of Home Science curriculum was taken up. While revising the curriculum, the committee referred several international curricula to make this at par with other international curriculum. This has been prepared after lot of research and brain storming.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.37

To approve revised Engineering Graphics Curriculum for CBSE —i for class XI from session 2013-14 and Class XII from session 2014-15.

Engineering Graphics is largely a practical oriented subject. The curriculum of Engineering Graphics for CBSE *i* was redesigned keeping in mind the international standards and requirements.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

To approve the design of Merit Certificate for CBSE-i

To recognize the outstanding performance of students in CBSE-i merit certificates may be awarded to the students a.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.39

To consider and approve extension of CBSE-i for grades IV, V, VIII and XII in the session 2013-14 and development of study materials for the same.

CBSE –i will be extended to grades IV, V, VIII and XII in the session 2013-14. Study material in all the subjects will be uploaded by first week of March 2013. The status of units for classes IV, V, VIII and XII respectively is given in the Annexure – 2.20as on 31st December, 2012.

Agenda Item: 4.40

To consider and approve the Curriculum Revision, Content Development and Teachers' Training Programmes of the Banking, Finance and Insurance sector courses.

By integrating financial literacy into everyday learning, students emerge better prepared for college and the workforce. In order to meet the challenge of growing need of knowledge and awareness of the financial world, Vocational Education Cell has taken the initiative to revise the curriculum and content of Banking, Finance and Insurance sector courses.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

To consider the proposal of Research study to identify the Regional Level Skill gap for the purpose of promoting Vocational Education

The Vocational Education Cell, proposes to conduct a Research study to identify the Regional Level Skill gap for the purpose of promoting Vocational Education

Primarily, this project aims to:

- To meet the priority skills needs of Industry and narrow the gap between demand and supply.
- To study and develop sufficient capacity within early school leavers and other disadvantaged groups to find and create employment.
- To equip young adults and out-of-school youth, who have the potential or inclination to contribute
 to their own welfare and quality of life, with the necessary skills that will enable them to initiate,
 organise, manage and control productive enterprises;
- 4. To provide training that will upgrade management, administrative, selling and marketing of skills of workers in the formal and informal sectors of the economy.

Suggested Course of Action

- Organising Consultative Meets of various sectors of the industry for analysing skill needs of the industry.
- 2. Identify region specific industries for imparting relevant vocational education in those regions.
- Forming Vocational Counselling Centres for students and young adults for identification of career paths in accordance to their aptitude, attitude and available resources.
- 4. Organising Interactive Programs with participation of students and parents at Regional Levels.
- Organising Surveys for feedback from stakeholders- including schools, students, parents and industry.
- 6. Forming policies for continuous upgrading of skills of the workforce
- 7. Encouraging private sector training.
- 8. Empowerment of instructor qualifications through Teachers Training Programs.
- 9. Active Industry partnerships.
- 10. Develop an online system to track students' progress and to be able to report accurately on issues like enrolment numbers, dropouts by gender, etc.

To consider the Proposal for recruitment of Mentors for the NVEQF Pilot Phase Implementation in CBSE schools.

Under the pilot phase of NVEQF, CBSE (in collaboration with Sector skills council) has introduced four courses in **I.T.**, **Retail**, **Security and Automobile** from Class IX onwards. The Board has also prepared curriculum and content for the aforesaid courses.

In this regard, in order to successfully implement the NVEQF scheme, as well as to encourage the schools to offer these courses from current academic session 2012-13 itself, the Board through its Vocational Education Cell has facilitated the arrangement of Mentors for an initial period of 6 months by conducting the interviews for recruitment of 160 Mentors of the four courses i.e. Retail, I.T., Security and Automobile for the schools covered under the pilot phase of NVEQF implementation. The aforementioned positions would be on contract basis for a period of 6 months and the honorarium for this period would be borne by the Board.

The above expenditure may be incurred as a one-time cost for initial hands holding and motivating the schools to participate in the pilot phase of NVEQF implementation, as well as to provide support to the schools by way of reducing their burden of finding suitable candidates for teaching these courses in the schools, thus facilitating a focused approach on the core implementation areas. Such support in the initial launch of the above scheme would facilitate a group of pioneer schools, acting as model schools for others, exemplifying the whole structure under the scheme, thus creating further steps in the promotion and wider coverage of NVEQF.

An approximate budget of Rs. 1,72,80,000/- may be required for the recruitment of 160 Mentors under the aforementioned NVEQF pilot.

Honorarium for the mentors recruited in the pilot phase of NVEQF would be electronically transferred to their respective bank accounts based on their attendance reports received from the schools.

Proposal of developing Digital and Multimedia content for Vocational Courses

The Board has invited an EOI from Digital Content providers to develop Digital Content and provides other resources for these courses based on the Board curriculum. In this regard, Boards has received the proposals from 44 different organizations out of which 22 organizations have been shortlisted in the first phase of screening on the basis of their Annual turnover of the company, number of Govt. Projects executed, number of years in Digital Content development & Content developed for K-12 etc.

It has been observed that most of the organization has quoted around 1 lakh for 1 hour. For class IX and class X, it is proposed to prepare a content of five hours per subject for each year for two courses and similarly for class XI & class XII ten hours per subject may be prepared for three courses initially making a total digital content of eighty hours.

Therefore an amount of around Rs. Eighty to Ninety Lakhs may be required for this purpose.

Discontinuation of MoU between CBSE and WWI Mumbai from 1st April 2013

A memorandum of understanding was signed between Whistling International, Mumbai and CBSE to promote the academic and vocational courses on Mass Media & Media Production at senior secondary level. As there are some issues between the Management of WWI and state government, WWI has now not in a position to support this project. Board has alternatively started working with MassCo Media, Noida for providing exposure visit/on-job-training to students. Therefore it is proposed to have separate collaboration with the MassCo Media and other leading media industries for effectively promoting the course discontinuing the existing formal collaboration with WWI may be from 1st April 2013 after clearing the due for the content preparations (six text books).

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

To consider teacher training in collaboration with CIT Australia

As per terms of agreement so far CIT, Australia has prepared the curriculum and content for three vocational courses namely Design, Beauty, Music & Technical Production. The Board has constituted three subject committee consisting of experts from industry and academia for customisations of those content considering the Indian perspective delivered by the CIT, Australia.

For effective delivery of curriculum Board will sent ten (10) participants (including two Board representatives) for Master Training to CIT, Australia w.e.f February 25 to March 15, 2013. Thereafter, in country training workshops will be organised for the faculty members of respective domain with the help of Master Trainers and faculty from CIT, Australia.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

To consider the pilot implementation of four vocational courses under NVEQF from class IX

The MHRD, during the pilot phase of NVEQF, has entrusted the responsibility to NCERT and CBSE to develop the curriculum for equivalent General Education in Language, science and Numeracy under National Vocational Education Qualification Framework (NVEQF) for Levels I to IV corresponding to classes IX -XII in general. In this regard CBSE has undertaken a responsibility to identify content areas from the existing syllabi in the subjects of Science, Social Sciences and Mathematics for secondary and senior secondary classes with an objective of creating room to introduce vocational skill modules.

Under the pilot phase of NVEQF, CBSE (in collaboration with Sector skills council) has also been entrusted with the responsibilities of developing the qualifications packs for one skill area each in four sectors; Framing the creditization system for equivalent general education (along with Haryana State Board of Secondary Education) and accreditation of institutions in association with National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and various other SSCs'.

- 1. Development of Curriculum and Content for various Vocational Courses on the emerging sectors in consultation with NSDC, PSSCIVE, and Industry.
- 2. Curriculum of Level -1 to IV and content for Level -1 of Automobile and IT Sector.
- 3. Curriculum and Content for Retail Sector (Level I to IV)
- 4. "Training the Trainers" programme at regular intervals to ensure quality of delivery and consistency.
- Coordination for the acceptance of Board's certificate by university and other Higher Education provide.
- 6. Identification of Higher Education Institutes / Industry of national or international repute for collaboration to meaningfully promote the Vocational Education under NVEQF across the nation.
- 7. Survey and developing the regional Vocational Education requirements/ needs of the industry
- 8. Board will help schools to strategically incorporate it in timetable without over burdening the students
- Reductions in academic subjects have been suggested to introduce these courses as compulsory/ elective for current session, so that academic courses are not impacted
- Board will recruit teachers and provide training to impart curriculum effectively in short duration of time
- Board will tie up suitable Skill Knowledge Provider to facilitate and enhance the skill building among students.

Courses to be introduced

The following programmes under various domains have been identified for implementation in schools starting from Level I i.e. from class IX onwards from the Session 2013-2014.

- 1. Retail
- 2. Security
- 3. Information Technology
- 4. Automobile Technology

All these courses of 200 hours each may be offered as an additional compulsory subject by rationalising the existing content for classes IX and X on pilot basis. Also, as a pilot programme these courses have already been introduced in 42 schools affiliated to the Board from the academic session 2012-13. The competency based curriculum package would consist of syllabus, student manual, trainers guide, training manual, teacher qualifications and multimedia packages and e-material to facilitate the successful implementation of the courses.

Proposed Plan of Action for NVEQF for implementation of courses:

- Introduction of one or more subject under NVEQF as compulsory subject by rationalising the existing content of classes IX and X.
- In order to accommodate vocational subject as compulsory, syllabus of all subjects may be revised and updated accordingly.
- The marks of the vocational subjects will be added to CGPA, therefore necessary changes in calculation for CGPA may be done.
- 4. Necessary changes in software for registration process, marks and result calculation would be required.
 - 5. To develop assessment strategy based on CCE for vocational courses to be introduced in class IX and X would be developed.

To consider and approve the proposal of popularising Medical Diagnostic course with the participation of Multiple Hospitals/ nursing homes

Medical diagnostics is the study of the procedures that provide information to aid the screening, detection, diagnosis and monitoring of disease. Therefore, to minimize the skill gap in the field of diagnosis and medical the course has been introduced to equip students with working knowledge of various processes and procedures carried out in field of medical diagnostics.

Proposed Steps for generating awareness for the course of Medical Diagnostics:

in schools:

- 1. By providing information brochures and pamphlets, leaflets highlighting the course objective and identifying potential jobs.
- 2. Through various regional offices awareness programmes can be launched in form of orientation programmes for teachers, students and parents
- 3. Schools can popularise a course by organising research labs/ diagnostics labs/ hospital visits if possible considering other safety parameters.
- 4. Also, tie ups and associations with various hospitals, research labs can help in generating curiosity among students.
- Organising seminars with speaker as experts from various areas healthcare domain will generate awareness among students about various jobs.
- To Board can provide and send brochures highlighting various courses along with the books, teaching material and mark sheets.
- As annexure, list of vocational courses can be provided in all books and curriculum so that both students and teachers both are aware of the new and existing courses.
- 8. Board can help schools in organising career counselling for the students where various course details can be shared with students and parents.

Proposed Plan of action:

- 1. The cell will invite EOt from various medical universities, hospitals and nursing home to facilitate this course and provide training for the basic skills required.
- 2. To tie up with a number of hospitals, pharmaceuticals and nursing homes to train the students with the skills required
- To tie up various universities and institutions to formally recognise the course to ensure the vertical mobility
- To development skill assessment strategy in conjunction with the partnered hospitals and nursing homes
- To develop certification in collaboration with partner organisation

To consider and approve the proposal of separate assessment strategy and credit framework for vocational courses

The major differences between the competency-based, written testing done in vocational education and the standardized testing done in academic education is that in vocational education the tests are constructed to measure whether students have the skills needed to perform particular jobs, rather than how their performance compares with other students taking the same test.

- 1. Proposed Plan of action for Development of Assessment Strategy
- 2. Recognition of Prior Learning at entry level stages through a standardized test
- 3. To develop credit system across the education system to ensure vertical mobility
- 4. Development of Levels of certification
- 5. To propose acceptance of various courses at university level to ensure vertical mobility
- 6. To develop standardized testing for vocational courses along with academic course to ensure vertical and horizontal mobility along with multiple entry and exit points

- 2. To develop credit system across the education system to ensure vertical mobility
