The Chairman, CBSE extended a warm welcome to all the Members at the 2nd Meeting of the year 2013. Thereafter, the Chairman expressed his gratitude to the following outgoing members of the Governing Body for their valuable contribution to the Board:

Presentation by the Chairman: 2.

The Chairman made an elaborate presentation on the progress of various activities undertaken the Board since the last meeting of the Governing Body. Important issues covered in the presentation of the Chairman were as follows:

2.1 Affiliation

The number of Schools affiliated with the Board as on 22.01.2013 was 13,578 and this number has increased to 14,255 as on 20.06.2013; as such 677 new schools were added to the list of affiliated schools with the Board during said period.

2.2 Senior Secondary Examination- 2013:

The Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination, 2013 (Class XIIth) was conducted from 1st March, 2013 to 17th April, 2013. 9,44,721 candidates were registered from 7,927 Schools. The results were declared on 27th May, 2013. Overall pass percentage was 82.10% as against 80.19%

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in 2012. Gompartmental examination is scheduled to be held on 16th July, 2013. The number of chances for compartment for class XII has been reduced to 3 from 5. However, for candidates who have appeared for the 2012 examination or before and are placed in the COMPARTMENT shall continue getting 5 chances.

2.3 Secondary School Examination- 2013

Secondary School Examination (Class X) was conducted from 1st March, 2013 to 30th March, 2013. 12,57,893 candidates were registered from 11,864 schools. The results of Chennai Region were declared on 26th May, 2013 and of all other Regions on 30th May, 2013. Overall pass percentage was 98.76% as against 98.19% in 2012. Improvement of performance Examination will be held from 16th to 23rd of July 2013 under two schemes i.e. Scheme 1 and Scheme 2. Number of attempts for improvement of performance in class X has been reduced to 1 from 5. However, for candidates who have appeared for the 2012 examination or before and placed in the category of 'IMPROVEMENT OF PERFORMANCE' shall get 5 chances.

2.4 The Board has started an online generation of Question paper through Integrated Test Management System (ITMS) to all the schools. Except from some procedural and formatting errors found in the papers generated online, the assessment went on well. The Board is in the process of revising the process of tagging the questions and improvising the system to preclude font and formatting errors in future.

Verification of marks/grades has been processed as under:

 For urgent verification, Fee: Rs. 300/-per subject. Applications are received online within 05 days from the date of declaration of results.



- Rs.200/- per subject and applications will be received either off-line or on-line within 21 days of the date of declaration of results.
- 2.5 Provision of providing photocopy of evaluated answer books to the candidates has been continued.
 - The photocopy will be provided to the candidates on their request submitted along with requisite fee.
 - Applications can be made from the 31st to 38th day of declaration of result on the website.
 - Detailed modalities are available on Board's website.

2.6 Value Education:

- a. Introduction of Value Based Questions in all major subjects for classes X and XII up to 3-5 marks. The Board follows an interdisciplinary approach in value education where values are intermingled with the content of all the major subjects in classes X and XII.
- b. CLASS XII: Modified syllabus-2013 and SQP with Sample Questions based on values in all the major subject (Circular No. Acad-47/2012).
- c. CLASS X: Modified syllabus-2013, Design of assessment and sample questions including questions based on values in all the major subjects (Circular No. Acad-46/2012 and Circular No. Acad-64/2012).

2.7 Joint Entrance Examination (JEE)- 2013

This year, offline Examination was held on 7th April, 2013 and online Exams on 9th, 22nd, 23rd and 25th April, 2013. To find out the top 1.5 lac candidates eligible for appearing in JEE-ADVANCED, the scores of the candidates appeared in Paper 1 of JEE-MAIN were declared on 7th May, 2013. The ranks/result of JEE-MAIN by adding 40% weightage of class 12th Board marks normalized on percentile basis to 60 % weightage of performance in JEE-MAIN will be declared on or before 7th July, 2013.

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2.8 National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (UG) - 2013

The National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test, 2013 was conducted by the Board on 5th May, 2013, 18th May, 2013 and 26th May, 2013. It was also for the first time that the test was conducted in 7 other languages i.e. Gujarati, Bengali, Tamil, Telugu, Marathi, Assamese and Urdu in addition to English and Hindi. A total of 7,17,127 candidates were registered and 6,58,040 appeared in this Examination. 3,66,317 candidates qualified the NEET(UG)-2013 Examination.

2.9 Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET) - 2013

Third Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET) was held on 18th November, 2012 throughout the country & abroad (except Mumbai). The CTET was held in Mumbai at the four Centres on 2nd December, 2012. Next CTET is scheduled to be held on 28th July, 2013 at 94 centres within the country and 2 centres abroad. As per NCTE notification, the time duration for the examination has been increased from 1.30 hrs to 2.30 hrs in both the papers.

2.10 JNVST Entrance Examination 2013

The JNVST Entrance Examination for admission in Class VI for summer bound Schools was held on 10th Feb., 2013. As per the directions of Ministry of HRD, GOI, a revised MOU has been signed by the Board and the NVS which stipulates that the Board will depute its own Officials as Observers in the States of Bihar, Jharkhand & Andhra Pradesh. The Board will send the confidential material for the JNVST Examination to the Custodian Banks throughout the country.



2.11 Proficiency Test 2013

Proficiency Test is an optional test for the students who appeared for secondary school examination in March 2013. It was conducted in 5 main subjects. The Examination was conducted from 8th -12th April, 2013. 19,118 candidates were registered from 1083 schools for this examination. The answer keys and question papers were put up on CBSE website for information and seeking opinion.

2.12 Problem Solving Assessment (PSA)- 2013

PSA was successfully conducted for all the students in classes IX and XI in all affiliated schools on 16th February, 2013. There were 13,83,436 students of Class IX and 10,69,013 students of Class XI registered for PSA. PSA assessed the Qualitative Reasoning, Quantitative Reasoning and Language Conventions.

2.13 Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills (ASL)

The ASL 'Pilot Project' was delivered to 112 schools in Delhi and surrounding areas from February 18th - March 8th, 2013 by 64 oral examiners (OEs) who assessed the speaking and communication skills of approximately 25,000 candidates from Classes IX and XI. There were a total of 104 oral examiners trained by the Trinity College, London.

The listening skills of candidates were also assessed by way of a pen and paper exam administered by teachers and using a digital recording of the texts.

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2.14 New Electives introduced for Classes XI and XII (2013-14)

The Board has introduced the following new elective subjects in Class XI and XII (2013-14):

- Human Rights and Gender Studies
- Legal Studies
- NCC
- Theatre Studies

2.15 Revision of Courses/Manuals

CBSE has revised the Courses/Manuals in the following subjects:

- a. Functional English Course (Class XI)
- b. Computer Science (Class XI/XII) Choice between Python and C++
- c. Entrepreneurship
- d. Fine Arts
- e. Fashion Studies
- f. Philosophy
- g. Formative Assessment Manuals (All 14 manuals)
- h. Guidelines for Project Work in History

Now, Python has also been allowed to be offered in addition to C++.

2.16 Training

The Board has planned a nation-wide training calendar for the workshops in CCE and FA for the year 2013-14. The Calendar has been uploaded on the CBSE Academic website.

2.17 Assessment Training Programme by CAER (ATP):

The Centre has formulated the first of a series of professional development programmes for teachers and principals and launched Assessment Training Programme (ATP) w.e.f. February 2013.

The ATP comprises of the following four modules:

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- Constructing quality multiple choice items to assess the scholastic skills of the curriculum.
- Constructing quality constructed-response items to assess the scholastic skills of the curriculum.
- Formative Assessment and the use of performance standards for assessing scholastic and co-scholastic skills.
- Classroom based research.

Participation in all four modules and the fulfilment of the required follow up activity will allow teachers to submit evidence for a qualification.

Successful participation will create a pool of assessment experts in the country as well as build assessment capacity of teachers.

2.18 Annual Conference of Sahodaya School Complexes - 2013

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20th Annual Conference of Sahodaya School Complexes- 2013 is scheduled to be held at Amritsar from 6th to 8th November, 2013. The theme of this Conference is Future Ready Schools.

2.19 CBSE on You Tube

CBSE now have a channel on You Tube. There are more than 200 videos including short films, role plays, talks, discussions, debates, presentations or other such activities sent by the affiliated schools on the CBSE Channel on the following themes:

- Health & Wellness
- Gender Sensitivity
- Community Outreach
- Life Skills
- Values Education
- Heritage

- Disaster Management
- Social Issues
- Environmental Issues & Concerns
- Innovative Teaching Learning Methodologies

2.20 Online Labs of CBSE (OLabs)

CBSE recommended Online Labs for School Experiments (OLabs) to all the schools affiliated to the Board. OLabs is a novel e-Learning project developed by CDAC, Mumbai and Amrita University, Kerala and based on the concept of virtual learning environment. OLabs work on web environment and provide experience in online practical science experiments. It has been developed for the students of classes IX and X to enhance their understanding of experimentation concepts. The content is mapped and aligned to the CBSE curriculum for classes IX and X. OLabs will help overcome the limitations faced by some students in a few schools in India due to either insufficient time or instruments in laboratories. These virtual experiments will stimulate students interest and learning and will give them the experience of doing real lab work, by graphically resembling with Laboratory equipment and simulating a virtual medium. Teachers may specially find it very useful while demonstrating the experiments in class or in Laboratory as it will provide minute details with complete clarity.

2.21 Value Education Kit

CBSE has prepared a Value Education Kit for schools based on the framework of `Education for Values in schools' brought out by NCERT.

The Value Education Kit comprises of:

A Value Education - A Handbook for Teachers

Values Card and

A CD of compilation of songs highlighting contemporary social issues and concerns .

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2.22 Gender Sensitivity:

Educator's Manual on Gender Receptive Pedagogy has been developed for the following purposes:

- To equip educators with knowledge, skills and attitudes for Gender Receptive pedagogy.
- To enable educators to develop and use gender Receptive methodologies those ensure equal participation of both girls and boys in teaching and learning processes.
- To assist school management to mainstream gender issues at the school level.

Vocational Education: 2.23

CBSE is offering 32 Vocational courses consisting of 97 subjects in 313 affiliated schools in India and 11 schools in 5 countries, with a coverage of approx. 37,095 students.

In the light of NVEQF, CBSE has initiated a process of reframing its existing vocational courses to ensure a cross mobility of students and their absorption in industry. Curriculum of following vocational courses has been revised with new scheme of studies:

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Various new courses have been introduced like Medical diagnostics, Foundry Technology, Retail (under NVEQF), Health Care Sciences, ITES, Front Office Management.

2.24 Public Relations Unit:

679 cases under RTI Act- 2005 have been received upto 31st May, 2013. 86 first appeals and 19 second appeals have also been received.

2.25 Student Global Aptitude Index (SGAI)~ 2013

The third edition of CBSE SGAI was conducted on 20th January, 2013. Approximately 70,000 students appeared from 1063 schools.

2.26 CBSE-i

- a. The CBSE-i curriculum has been extended to Classes IV, V, VIII and XII from the academic year 2013-14.
- b. It was extended to the classes III, VII and XI for session 2012-13 and to Classes II, VI and X in the academic year 2011-12 in continuation to classes I and IX in the academic year 2010-11.
- c. CBSE-i is being offered on pilot basis to 30 schools in India in Primary (I/II/III) classes.
- d. Inspection is going on for the rest for the schools.
- The Chairman concluded the presentation and invited comments of the House on the presentation as well as current agenda items. The Chairman also asked specific comments about Accreditation process of the Board through private agencies and maximum period available to a school for accreditation before it loses affiliation.

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Sh. Ashok Kumar, Principal, Indian High School, Dubai wanted to know if a school does not get accredited for 5-6 years then what it should do.

The Chairman, CBSE informed that if the School has been accredited then this accreditation shall be valid for 5 years. If School is not able to get its accreditation then currently there is a provision that it may get accreditation in the next 3 years. Thus, if a School is not able to get accreditation, it will again apply and get accreditation within next 3 years. So, the maximum period a School can delay the accreditation without being accredited and without getting disaffiliated is 6 years. The Chairman wanted specific comments of the House on this period of 6 years.

Shri K. P. Gopalkrishna, Chairman & Principal, National Public School, Bangalore expressed his concern regarding schools located in rural areas with regard to availability of quality teachers and wanted to know how accreditation would be successful in case of such schools.

Chairman informed that accreditation will ensure quality in ongoing process of the school. Chairman also informed that the accreditation does not differentiate between rural and cosmopolitan cities. It relates to the following domains of schools:-

- 1. Scholastic Processes & Outcomes.
- Co-Scholastic Processes & Outcomes.
- Infrastructure
- 4. Human Resources
- 5. Management and Administration
- 6. Leadership
- 7. Beneficiary Satisfaction etc.

The quality requirement does not discriminate between the Government and non-government schools.

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Shri J. Alam, Joint Secretary (SE), MHRD wanted to know if CBSE has affiliated the school and later on it is accredited, then how the accreditation would be different from affiliation.

The Chairman informed that accreditation would ensure quality as an ongoing process in above 7 domains of the school. A school is given accreditation only if it gets a minimum 50% in all the domains and 75% in each separately.

Smt. Ameeta Mullah Wattal, Principal, Springdales School, Delhi expressed her satisfaction over the quality work being undertaken by the Board in the field of academics and examination. However, she wanted clarification regarding accreditation about the schools affiliated to National Progressive School Council (NPSC). Do they need to go for accreditation again from CBSE. She said that accreditation shall help in improving the quality in comparison to other schools, as the schools are not Islands. She also suggested to increase the pool of accreditation examiners and a time frame for conducting inspection for accreditation. She further emphasized that this step is itself a very huge step for accrediting the Schools and she thinks that the time element for accrediting the School is very important. She further emphasized that it may be a three year process and in the end the entire School machinery comes to play. The agency should not inform the School well in advance about the date and time of the visit of School otherwise the seriousness of the purpose shall be diluted. The agency will have to use the manual which is provided to them by the CBSE for the purpose. The agency shall also have to monitor certain other ways. Some of the people who come for the accreditation process, are neither aware nor serious about the quality. The school should judge its own level before applying for accreditation. The schools should have passed the basic referral points.

Dr. Sadhana Parashar, Director (ART&I) opined that the accreditation process was initiated in the year 2010. It is only now that it has been finalized. Smt. Wattal pointed out that they have just piloted one school each. Dr.

Parashar stated about many points related to accreditation and the need to provide quality education in the existing schools. She further stated that the members should go through the manual carefully about the accreditation process and know how they can score for accreditation.

Dr. Shvama Chona, Former Principal, DPS, R.K. Puram, New Delhi applauded the efforts of CBSE and expressed that the country is going through the golden period of CBSE for which she would like to compliment all those who are working towards it. She placed three models before the House on the issue of accreditation. They assess schools and tell what is the conflict of the interest. Further she stated that we have a Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation of the students and accreditation is also Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation of the schools. So we cannot have one time assessment and this assessment has to be continuous. The Schools should send the quarterly reports. The Board should read their quarterly reports and analyse whether there is any improvement from their last visit. She further opined that the institutions don't comply with the directions of the Board and complete the deficiencies once they get affiliated from the Board. Sometime we read in newspaper that such schools do not even have toilets and other infrastructure. She opined that there should be a continuous process for removing of deficiencies not after two years or three years.

Chairman, CBSE replied that this process is being done continuously. The Board keeps on receiving reports and verifying them continuously but trained manpower is a big challenge for the Board. In fact, this is one of the reasons that the Board is not able to do periodic inspection of the affiliated schools. Regular people who can go and do the inspection are not available.

Ms. Atreyee Talapatra, Director (CII), mentioned that School Managing Committee is a legal entity as per the RTE Act and she felt that the SMC could be made an important component of accreditation process. The School

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Managing Committee takes care of educationists, social activists in its composition. The SMC should be made mandatory part of this process.

Prof. Rama Mathew, Dean, Faculty of Education, Delhi University wanted to know that if some schools have got accreditation with Quality Council of India, do they have to again apply for accreditation with CBSE. She mentioned an example that happened with NAAC for University which has less facilities. The criteria and parameters are very similar; even there is more research in the University. It is a very important parameter but how some institutions get five stars, some get four stars and how the committee is distinguishing one from other. She further stated that we should look at the quality and not talk of facilities, infrastructure and number of teachers appointed. An expert academician will be able to look at properly will have to be taken into account. She stated that we are moving in the right direction and it will lead to strengthen assessment.

Chairman, CBSE replied that accreditation is done by many agencies i.e. QCI, ISO etc. On every accreditation, there are again some policies and benchmarks. The CBSE's accreditation is based on the National Policy of Education 1986, and National Curriculum Framework 2005, the Government of India policies as well as CBSE's own policies. So naturally the schools will have advantage for undergoing another accreditation process under CBSE.

Dr. Sanjay Srivastava from MCI stated that they had identified some 12 organisations as private players. The number of agencies are interested in doing work. The system of Medical Education is that we have a pool of assessors who essentially are associated with medical profession who have experience of five years as faculty in many Leading private colleges. He said that appointing assessors and getting the assessment report is not an easy task. They have assessment cells in the councils.

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Sh. Saini, Principal, DPS, R.K. Puram, and Sh. S.S. Minhas, Principal, Guru Harikrishan Public School, Vasant Vihar applauded the Innovative efforts being made by the Board in the field of Assessment and Accreditation.

The members supported the ideas of assessment through private agencies and accreditation decision by the CBSE. However, the maximum period for accreditation after failing once should be reduced to 1 year instead of 3 years agreed earlier. Thus, the maximum period a school can delay its accreditation without getting disaffiliated would be 4 years.

Discussion on Agenda items:

ITEM I TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOARD HELD ON 22ND JANUARY, 2013.

The Chairman, CBSE apprised the members about the Minutes of the meeting of the Governing Body of the Board held on 22nd January, 2013 and after deliberations, the House confirmed the Minutes of the Governing Body Meeting held on 22nd January, 2013.

TO RECEIVE A REPORT ON THE FOLLOW UP ACTION TAKEN ON THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY HELD ON 22ND JANUARY, 2013.

The Chairman informed the House that action has been taken on all the items as per resolution passed by the Governing Body at its last meeting held on 22nd, January, 2013 and most of the action taken reports have been displayed in the presentation. The members deliberated on the action taken on the last meeting of the Governing Body Meeting held on 22nd January, 2013 in detail. The Chairman informed that the advertisement with regard to appointment of regular Director, Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research (CAER) was got published but no suitable candidate was found. The Post has been re-advertised and the process of recruitment shall be completed shortly. The Chairman informed

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that CAER has been formed by CBSE in Public Private Partnership (PPP). The members noted the follow up action taken on the minutes of the last meeting.

TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 26TH MARCH, 2013.

The Chairman, CBSE apprised the House about the recommendations of the Finance Committee held on 26.03.2013. The House was informed about the opening of 10th Regional Office of the Board at Dehradhun to cater to the needs of Uttrakhand and Western Uttar Pradesh since the Regional Office, CBSE Allahabad was having heavy burden of approx 2000 Schools. The house resolved to approve the recommendations of the Finance Committee made at its meeting held on 26th March, 2013.

TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE EXAMINATION COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 10TH APRIL, 2013

The Controller of Examination, CBSE apprised the members about the recommendations of the Examination Committee held on 10.04.2013. He particularly invited the attention of the House on the item authorizing Army Welfare Society to countersign the transfer certificates issued by the Schools run by them and to consider amendments in the format of transfer certificate.

Chairman, CBSE stated that under continuous and comprehensive evaluation, now the system of collection of evidences of assessment has been made mandatory for getting the feedback, twice a year. After every term, the Board collects the evidence of assessment from the schools and 50% school are taken in the first term and 50% schools in second term so that in a year, every school sends the evidence of assessment. Collection of assessment is made from 15 students. 5 students from the top most rankers, 5 students from the middle and 5 students from the bottom and

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then the collected assessment is verified by the team of experts who are trained by the CBSE. It is done at the level of different centers.

The House resolved to approve the recommendations of the Examination Committee held on 10th April, 2013.

ITEM V TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 24TH JUNE, 2013

The Chairman, CBSE apprised the House about the recommendations of the Finance Committee held on 24.06.2013. He informed the House with regard to the proposal for purchase of flats for the staff of the Board at Bhubaneswar. He further informed that the detailed proposal indicating financial implication in lease/ rent vis-à-vis shall be worked out. The Committee deliberated upon the other items and after detailed discussions the House approved the minutes of the Finance Committee held on 24th June, 2013.

ITEM VI TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE AFFILIATION COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 24TH JUNE, 2013

The Chairman, CBSE apprised the House about the recommendations of the Affiliation Committee held on 24.06.2013. He informed the House of the decision of the Affiliation Committee about unanimously agreeing to remove the requirement of NOC in case of all private independent Schools seeking affiliation with the Board with a view of the large requirement of Schools after implementation of RTE Act and increased mobility of population across Country.

After detailed discussions, the House approved the minutes of the Affiliation Committee held on 24th June, 2013.

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ITEM VII TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CURRICULUM COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 26TH JUNE. 2013

Director (ART&I) apprised the House about the recommendations of the Curriculum Committee held on 26th June, 2013. After detailed discussions, the House approved the minutes of the Curriculum Committee held on 26th June, 2013.

ADD. ITEM I TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE AFFILIATION COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 26TH MARCH, 2013

The Chairman, CBSE apprised the House about the recommendations of the Affiliation Committee held on 26th March, 2013. After detailed discussions the Governing Body approved the Minutes of the Affiliation Committee meeting held on 26th March, 2013..

ADD. ITEM II TO DISCUSS VARIOUS ISSUES RECEIVED FROM MRS. AVNITA BIR, PRINCIPAL, R.N PODAR SCHOOL, MUMBAI AND MEMBER OF GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOARD.

The House discussed the various issues with regard to non standardization the marks of mass media studies elective across the Country, opting 5 subjects (English and more than four elective) in class XII etc. The Chairman assured to take necessary action in this regard.

ADD. ITEM III TO DISCUSS VARIOUS ISSUES RECEIVED FROM MRS. RAMA MATHEW, DEAN, FACULTY OF EDUCATION, DELHI UNIVERSITY, DELHI AND MEMBER OF GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOARD.



- To suggest a rational recruitment policy taking into account:

 - Promotional prospects of recruits.
- To work out the rate of annual recruitment so that that gaps in the academic cadre are adequately taken care of in a phased manner and there is no excessive recruitment in particular years leading to dilution in the quality of recruits or block in promotion at a later-stage.
- Except to the extent provided for in particular recruitment rules for any cadre, cadre posts should be held by cadre officers.
- e To devise a scientific plan for the development and deployment of officers in academic cadre. This plan should spell out in detail the requirement in terms of skills/specialities, desirable experience etc. for different positions, and the attributes required for the attainment of this objective.
- To frame guidelines for the placement of officers, in and outside the academic cadre, in line with the skills/experience acquired by officers after a careful screening of eligible personnel in relation to the type of posts to be filled up.
- To recommend the tenure of deputation posts of academic cadre.
- To nominate and recommend the academic officers for various courses of training in India and abroad.
- To nominate and recommend the officers for deputation.
- To deliberate on such other matters which are forwarded by the Board for consideration.
- To suggest ways and means to improvement to functional efficiency:
- To suggest suitable action to remove the anomalies that may have crept in are part of the academic cadre system.
- To deliberate and make recommendations on any other matters with prior approval of Chairperson, SACMAC.

- To determine the rate of growth of the academic cadre, after analysing past trends and anticipating additional needs.
- To fix and rationalise the strength of the academic cadre.
- To draw up a personnel plan, for every three years indicating for each year. Planning will include CBSE offices of Delhi, all regional offices and other centres/units.
- To decide the size of the academic cadre.
- To assess the overall needs and gaps.

SACMAC will be pivotal machinery to resolve all matters related to academic cadre of the Board and submit its recommendations through the Chairman, CBSE to the Finance Committee / Governing Body of CBSE.

Composition of SACMAC shall be as follows:

- 1. The Professor & Director (ART&I), CBSE who shall be the Chairperson of the Committee. (Ex-Officio)
- 2. Two eminent educationist will be nominated as members by the Chairman, CBSE for the tenure of five years from the date of first meeting.
- 3. Two eminent educationist will be nominated by Professor & Director (ART&I), CBSE for the tenure of five years from the date of first meeting.
- 4. One Senior most Additional Director & Associate Professor or equivalent. (Ex- Officio)
- 5. One Senior most Assistant Professor & Joint Director or equivalent. (Ex-Officio)
- 6. One Senior most Assistant Professor & Deputy Director or equivalent. (Ex-Officio)
- 7. One Senior most Assistant Professor & Assistant Director or equivalent. (Ex-Officio)
- 8. One officer from Finance & Accounts Cadre of the Board nominated by the Professor & Director (ART&I), CBSE for the tenure of one year.
- 9. One officer from General Administration Cadre, CBSE posted at Academic & Training Wing or any other office at Delhi nominated by the Professor & Director (ART&I), CBSE for the tenure of one year.

2) the schools be permitted to admit the pass outs of CBSE's Class XII students to reappear as regular students with subjects under vocational subjects, provided the subjects are being taught in the particular school;
3) such students be permitted to appear only as regular students after fulfilling the requirements as stipulated in the Examination Byelaws;
4) Rule 12(ii) of the Examination Byelaws be amended
5) Statement of Marks and Certificate issued to such students shall also have the mention of the earlier document issued.

The Committee recorded the action taken by the Board.

ITEM III: TO CONSIDER APPOINTING RETIRED PRINCIPALS/VICE PRINCIPALS IN THE SECRECY TEAM FOR THE CONFIDENTIAL WORK OF THE CLASS XII & X EXAMINATIONS AND AMENDMENT IN RULE 50(ii) OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Committee was informed of the processes involved in the conversion of roll numbers from real to fictitious and the changes introduced in the processes till date for the Class XII & X examinations which is done by a team of persons consisting of Chief Secrecy Officer, Deputy Chief Secrecy Officer and Secrecy Officers. The Committee was further apprised of Rule 50(i) & (ii) of the Examination Byelaws which state as under:

(i) The Chairman shall appoint a Professor or a Principal of a College or Reader/Senior Lecturer of a College or such other person of integrity, honesty and experience as Chief Secrecy Officer for an examination of the Board at Delhi and at Regional levels. (ii) Each Chief Secrecy Officer will identify his/her own team of persons who will carry out the work under his/her guidance. Such persons shall not be below the rank of lecturer in Colleges

The Committee was informed that it had been noticed in the recent past that it sometimes becomes difficult to get Lecturers to do the work as Secrecy Officers.

After considering the problems being encountered by the Board in getting Lecturers to act as Secrecy Officers, the Committee resolved to amend Rule 50(ii) of the Examination Byelaws to read as under:

ITEM IV: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN PERMITTING ARMY WELFARE EDUCATION SOCIETY TO COUNTERSIGN THE TRANSFER CERTIFICATES ISSUED BY THE SCHOOLS RUN BY THEM AND TO CONSIDER AMENDMENT IN THE NOTE BELOW THE FORMAT OF TRANSFER CERTIFICATE GIVEN AS ANNEXURE I OF THE

EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Committee was informed that request had been received from the Army Welfare Education Society, New Delhi vide their letter No. B/45751/CBSE/AWES dated 5.11.2012 to permit them to countersign the Transfer Certificates issued by the schools run by them as approx.. 40000 students i.e. 20% of students studying in APS/AWES system move out every year from one school to another mostly due to posting of their parents and getting the Transfer Certificate countersigned from the Regional Offices of the Board is very inconvenient for the parents due to their place of posting, mostly in far flung areas/small stations. They had further stated that they have their Zonal Offices in Pune, Kolkata, Chandimandir, Lucknow, Udhampur and Jaipur headed by a Director of the rank of Colonel who looks after the AWES affairs.

The Committee was apprised that in order to facilitate the wards of the personnel, the Board has acceded to the request of the Army Welfare Education Society and had conveyed its approval vide letter No. COORD/EC/2013/495-505 dated 8.2.2013.

The Members also deliberated on the necessity of getting the Transfer Certificates countersigned especially in view of the fact that the list of affiliated schools is available on the Board's website and the incoming schools can verify the status of the school(s) issuing the Transfer Certificate on the website before admitting the student(s) from one CBSE affiliated school to another.

After deliberations the Committee resolved as under:

- i) ratified the action taken by the Board,
- ii) amended the Note below the format of the Transfer Certificate(Annexure 1 of the Examination Byelaws) to read as under:

Existing Note

Transfer Certificate should be issued only the signatures of the Principal/Vice Principal and it should be countersigned by an officer not below the rank of District Inspector of Schools/Deputy Director of Education/Education Officer of the Education Department of the State/Union Territory concerned. In case of a student migrating from one CBSE affiliated school to another CBSE affiliated school the transfer certificate of a previous school of such a student may be countersigned by the Regional Officer of the Board or the Assistant Commissioner of the Kendriya Vidyalaya Samiti or the Deputy Director, Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti in India or an officer of the Board at the Head Quarters and by the First Secretary/Attache/Cultural Attache equivalent officer of the Embassy/High Commission of India in the concerned country in respect of students studying in an affiliated school of the CBSE situated outside the country and the student shall not be admitted to a school without such a countersignature. Assistant Commissioners, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan have also been authorised to countersign the Transfer Certificates issued by the schools run by Directorate General, Border Security Force.

Amended Note

Transfer Certificate should be issued only under the signatures of the regular Principal/Vice Principal and it should be countersigned by an officer not below the rank of District Inspector of Schools/Deputy Director of Education/Education Officer of the Education Department of the State/Union Territory concerned. In case of a student migrating from one CBSE affiliated school to another CBSE affiliated school the transfer certificate of a previous school of such a student may be countersigned by the Regional Officer of the Board or the Assistant Commissioner of the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan or the Deputy Director, Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti in India or an officer of the Board at the Head Quarters and by the First Secretary/Attache/Cultural Attache or an equivalent officer of the Embassy/High Commission of India in the concerned country in respect of students studying in an affiliated school of the CBSE situated outside the country. Army Welfare Education Society has also been authorised to countersign the Transfer Certificate issued by the schools managed by them. The student shall not be admitted to a school such a countersignature. Commissioners, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan have also been authorised to countersign the Transfer Certificates issued by the schools run by Directorate General, Border Security Force.

iii) To get information from other Boards regarding the practice being followed by them relating to countersignature of Transfer Certificate in case of transfer from one school to another and refer the matter in the next meeting of the Examination Committee.

ITEM V: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN PERMITTING MASTER SUMIT SHEKHAR A STUDENT OF CLASS XI OF LAKSHIMPAT SINGHANIA ACADEMY, KOLKATA SUFFERING FROM MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY TO APPEAR FOR PRACTICAL COMPONENT IN THE SUBJECTS OF PHYSICS AND BIOLOGY MEANT FOR VISUALLY HANDICAPPED STUDENTS

The Committee was informed that Lakshimpat Singhania Academy, Kolkata vide their letter dated 1.11.2012 had stated that one of their student Master Sumit Shekhar is suffering from Muscular Dystrophy. He is wheel chair bound and can only write and operate computers. They had further informed that he is keen in opting Science stream in Class XI in the session 2013-14 as he is sharp, focused and has very clear conceptual knowledge of various science subjects and is keen to do advanced course in computers. The school requested the Board to permit either MCQ or Viva in lieu of practicals.

The Committee was informed that as per the information downloaded from the Internet Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy is a recessive X-linked form of muscular dystrophy which results in muscle degeneration, difficulty walking, breathing and death. Due to progressive deterioration of muscle, loss of movement occurs eventually leading to paralysis. The average life expectancy is around 25, but this varies from individual to individual. As defined at Point No. 2(o) of THE PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES ACT, 1995 "locomotor disability means disability of the bones, joints or muscles leading to substantial restriction of the movement of the limbs or any form of cerebral palsy".

The Committee was further informed that based on above, Master Sumit Shekhar, suffering from Muscular Dystrophy had been permitted to offer the subjects Physics and Chemistry at Senior Secondary level however, in lieu of practicals he has been permitted to attempt the question papers meant for visually handicapped students containing questions of MCQ type and viva.

The Committee ratified the decision taken by the Board.

ITEM VI: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN PERMITTING DELHI PUBLIC SCHOOL, R K PURAM, NEW DELHI TO CARRY OVER THE MARKS OF SA 1 IN SA 2 IN RESPECT OF MASTER YASHODHAR GOVIL & KM. ANKUSHI ANTARDHAWNI, STUDENTS OF CLASS IX OF 2012-13 SESSION SUFFERING FROM CANCER AND MYSTERIOUS DISEASE OF BONE RESPECTIVELY

The Committee was informed that following requests had been received from Delhi Public School, R K Puram, New Delhi:

- i) request dated 25.2.2013 stating that Master YashodharGovil, a student of Class IX in the session 2012-2013 is suffering from Cancer and as he is undergoing chemotheraphy he will be unable to appear for SA 2 to be conducted in March 2013 and had requested to exempt him from appearing in SA 2.
- ii) request dated 25.3.2013 stating that Km. AnkushiAntardhawni, a student of Class IX in the session 2012-2013 is suffering from a mysterious disease of bone which has made her undergo several levels of investigations including nuclear medicine under several hospitals. In the process she has undergone surgery and also put to complete confinement and bed rest since very long and she has been unable to appear for SA 2 being conducted in March 2013 and had requested to exempt her from appearing in SA 2.

The Committee was informed that in view of the medical condition of the students, the Board had considered the requests of the school and permitted them to upload the marks obtained in SA 1 against the marks field of SA 2 also in respect of both the above students.

The Members deliberated on the decisions taken by the Board and resolved as under:

- ratified the decisions taken by the Board in respect of above two candidates. They also opined that these are special cases and not to be quoted in future; and
- for Class IX in case of such requests for circumstances beyond control, instead of permitting the school to upload the marks obtained in SA 1 for SA 2 also, the schools be directed to conduct the EIOP for SA 2 and the marks obtained in the EIOP assessment be uploaded

ITEM VII: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN PERMITTING KM AKSHITA KOHLI TO APPEAR IN SUBJECTS OF SCIENCE STREAM FOR CLASS XI EXAMINATION, 2013 AS PER THE SCHEDULE TO BE DECIDED BY S D PUBLIC SCHOOL, EAST PATEL NAGAR, NEW DELH!

The Committee was informed that Shri Deepak Kohli, father of Km. AkshitaKohli in his representation dated 21.2.2013 had stated that the corrected class X result in respect of his daughter has been declared in February, 2013 due to which she has lost one academic year. Her school S D Public School though was ready to admit her in Humanities stream. As she was interested in Science stream, she approached Salwan School who agreed to admit her in Science stream with the condition that Akshita appear or sits for the Class XI examination to commence from 23rd February, 2013 which was hard to comply with as Km. Akshita had not prepared either for Humanities or Science stream.

The Committee was informed that In order to save the career of a girl student, the Board had acceded to the request of the parent for directing S D Public School to conduct separate examination in the Science based subjects in the syllabus prescribed for Class XI.

The Committee ratified the decision taken by the Board.

ITEM VIII: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN REDECLARING THE CLASS X RESULT IN RESPECT OF MASTER RAGHAV JOSHI, A STUDENT OF CLASS X 2012-13 SESSION OF LAKSHMIPAT SINGHANIA ACADEMY, KOLKATA BEARING ROLL NO. 6121944

The Committee was informed that it had been reported by LakshimpatSinghania Academy, Kolkata as the grades being obtained by Master Raghav Joshi were not upto his expectations, he was having behavioural problems and was getting averse to studies. Due to his problems and inspite of all efforts made by the school to help him, he could not qualify the Class X even in the first EIOP due to his grade in the subject of Mathematics. In order to safeguard his career the school extended him help by conducting the 2nd EIOP in the month of December, 2012 which was otherwise to be conducted by the Board in the month of March, 2013. After conduct of the 2nd EIOP in December, 2012, the student could qualify the examination.

The Committee ratified the decision of the Board to accept the grade obtained in the subject of Mathematics at the 2nd EIOP and redeclare the result in order to save the career of Master Raghav Joshi.

He had further stated that his constant low haemoglobin level and the deadly virus have defused his spirits.

At the outset, Director (Academic) welcomed all the members to the meeting and requested to introduce them. After the introduction, Director (Academic) thanked the conveners for their support to CBSE despite of their busy schedules. Director (Academic) then, with the permission of chair, started proceedings of the house by making a presentation.

While giving an overview of CBSE, Director (Academic) outlined major decisions, activities and initiatives taken by the Board since the last Curriculum Committee meeting held on January 15, 2013.

Section I

Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting held on January 15, 2013

Agenda Item: 1

To confirm the minutes of the meeting held on January 15, 2013

The minutes of the meeting of the Curriculum Committee which was held on **January 15, 2013** were circulated among all the members of the Curriculum Committee. No comments were received. The house unanimously confirmed the minutes

Section II

Action Taken Report on the agenda items discussed in the previous meeting held on January 15, 2013

Agenda Item: 2 - Action Taken Report

The Director (Academic) elaborated on the action taken with respect to the agenda items of the last Curriculum Committee meeting as follows:

2.1 To report on major modifications in the curriculum document 2015

The curriculum documents -2015 for secondary and Senior Secondary classes have been brought out in new format from the current academic session. Several new features have been added to make these documents more comprehensive.

The Curriculum documents from this year will have five sections. Part I elaborates on principles and rationale of Curriculum. Part II describes the procedure to be adopted by the schools to start a new subject. This part also describes the minimum qualification of teachers to teach the prescribed curriculum in schools affiliated to CBSE. In addition to it, this part also specifies the instructional hours and Information on vocational courses. Part III is the core of these documents and contain detailed curriculum of various courses of studies. A special feature that has been added to this part from this year is the

details of the designs of the question papers and typology of questions of various curricular subjects. Five new subjects have been added as academic electives in this part viz. NCC, Theater Studies, Human Rights and Gender Studies, Legal Studies and Knowledge Traditions and Practices of India. Part IV of curriculum documents contains the training policy of the Board and Part V reproduces the RTE Act-2009 as a ready reckoner to schools.

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan enquired about the acceptability of new subjects at the time of admission to universities. She specifically wanted to know whether the elective 'Theatre Studies' will be included in the best of four by the University of Delhi.

Chairman, CBSE requested Professor J.M.Khurana, Dean, Students' Affair, University of Delhi to kindly respond to this query.

Professor J.M.Khurana told the house that the University has decided to consider those subjects to be included in the best of four which have some relevance to the course in which a student seeks admission. He further clarified that there is no issue as far as Science stream is concerned however, in Arts and Humanities, there is a slight disadvantage for the students having background of non-traditional subjects. Professor Khurana pointed out that if a student who has studied Physical Education as one of the electives in class XII insists on including this elective while seeking admission into B.Com (Hons.) then it cannot be justified. He provided an example of Haryana Board which issues Statement of Marks showing the marks of Physical Education separately with instructions 'not to be added' for calculating aggregate percentage.

Chairman, CBSE informed the house that the University of Delhi has already recognized all the subjects offered by CBSE for the purpose of granting admission.

The Director (ATR&I) pointed out the fact that university has included the subjects like 'Heritage Studies' and 'Mass Media Studies' in the list of the vocational subjects whereas these subjects are of academic nature. Director (ART&I) also proposed that there should be a committee comprising of the convener of the Committee of courses of the new subject with other expert members which can defend the initiation of the new subject before the Academic Council of the University.

Professor Khurana said that they send the case of every new subject introduced by the Board to its respective department in the University for their approval. However, for the latest five subjects they did not even send the syllabi of these subjects to their departments and approved the inclusion of these subjects. He also consented to the possibility of CBSE committee defending the introduction of new subjects before the Academic Council of the University.

Mr. L.V.Sehgal pointed out that NCC/NSS should be considered for an extra credit by the university.

2.2 To report on the proposal regarding Introduction of Open Text Based Assessment in CBSE Schools from the academic session, 2013-14

Details of the Open Text based Assessment (OTBA) for Classes IX and XI in March, 2014 have been conveyed to all the schools affiliated to Board vide circular number Acad-39 dated May 31,2013. It is conveyed to schools that the textual material will be in the form of an article, a case study, a diagram, a concept/ mind map, a picture or a cartoon, problem/situation based on the concepts taught to the students during second term and will have a weighting of 15-20 percent in all the main subjects in class IX and Economics, Biology and Geography only for class XI. The question based on OTBA may also

include the Value Based Questions. The circular further specifies what needs to be done on part of schools and teachers and the methodology to be adopted for assessing these questions.

The Director (ATR&I) informed the house that the decision for doing OTBA in classes IX and X has been taken to prepare students for this alternative approach and the decision for continuing this approach in classes X and XII will be taken on the basis of feedback received after the conduct of this assessment. The Case Studies will be provided to schools by the end of September, 2013.

2.3 To report on the extension the Pilot Project of Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills, from 120 schools to all the schools affiliated to CBSE by adopting due process

The Assessment in Speaking and Listening (ASL) pilot test was delivered to 112 schools in Delhi and surrounding areas between February 18th and March 8th 2013 by 64 oral examiners (OEs) who assessed the speaking and communication skills of approximately 25,000 secondary school candidates (Cs) from Classes IX and XI. There were a total of 104 oral examiners trained by Trinity. In addition, the candidates' listening skills were also assessed by way of a pen and paper exam administered by teachers and using a digital recording of the texts.

The Oral Examiners were trained to give Class IX candidates an eight minute ASL test and Class XI a ten minute test. The two tests shared a similar procedure and the same format, which involved three phases:

- Introductory Phase OE asks some friendly, scripted personal questions to relax both candidates (1 minute, un-assessed)
- II. Topic Phase Candidate 1 presents a topic, Candidate 2 asks a question and OE asks a semi-scripted question, process repeated for Candidate 2 (4 minutes, assessed).
- III. Problem Solving Phase Candidates read a task card and discuss together how to solve the problem, OE asks semi-scripted follow-up questions (3 minutes class IX and 5 minutes class XI, assessed).

Director (ATR&I) informed the house that in Speaking Section for Class IX, the pass rate was high with 91% of students achieving A+ to B grades. Almost half of the cohort achieved a B or B+ grade. In the Listening Section, the pass rates are extremely high with only 0.1% candidates achieving C grade. Their distinction grades are extremely high at 34% achieving an A+ and 77.6% achieving an A grade in general.

In Speaking Section for Class XI, the pass rate was high with 94% of students achieving A+ to B grades. In the Listening Section, the pass rates are extremely high with only 0.3% achieving a C grade. Distinction rates are extremely high at 36% achieving an A+ and 76% achieving an A grade in general.

2.4 To report on the organization of a pilot on English language skills test for 2000 students of classes XI and XII by the British Council on complementary basis

The CBSE-British Council pilot [Aptis] has been completed with 2004 students from schools situated in the Delhi/ NCR region, in March 2013. The feedback report, analysis of the data, school representatives and students' feedback have been consolidated and submitted to CBSE by British Council during the first week of June. The feedback is positive.

Director (ATR&I) informed the house that in listening score results 58% of students scored 'C' and 31% of students 'B2' on a six point scale. Speaking score results 50% of the students were at 'B1' level. The results are extremely positive for listening however, students need more practice in speaking.

2.5 To report on the organization of 6 months online English language skills and English teaching course for 150 teachers from the schools affiliated to CBSE by Cengage EduTeach-National Geographic/EduTeach on Complementary basis

The CBSE-Cengage EduTeach-National Geographic/EduTeach Project is underway with 129 teachers from schools in the Delhi/NCR Region, with 9 Co-ordinators ,also from such schools. The assessment is scheduled on the 24th & 25th June 2013. Courses are offered at following two levels:

- English for Teaching Programme (TEFT), is for building confidence in English Language use India Daily Classroom Teacher
- b. Professional Knowledge for ELT (TPK), is a English Teaching Methodology Course

2.6 To report on the Introduction of "NCC" as a compulsory component in the curriculum

As there are certain conditions laid down by the directorate of NCC regarding the eligibility of a school to offer NCC, therefore it would not be possible to make NCC as a compulsory component in the curriculum. However the Board has offered NCC to classes IX and X as an optional subject and to classes XI and XII as an optional elective w.e.f. 2013-14 with the first Board Examination at class XII in 2015. 'National Cadet Corps (NCC)' provides a platform for individual upliftment through the process of channelizing the energy of the youth in constructive pursuits. Besides giving thrill and excitement, NCC promotes camaraderie and resilience and hones cultural skills to preserve the cultural traditions and values of the society. It helps the youth to realise the intimate relationship between man and the community, between community and nature and their inter-dependability.

2.7 To report on the Setting up of National institute for Continuous Professional Development at Gurgaon with Centers at Kochi, Mohali and Kakinada

As per the approval of the Curriculum Committee and other committees of the Board, the Board approached to concerned state governments for allotting suitable piece of land for establishing National and ancillary centers of Continuous Professional Development for the teachers of schools affiliated to CBSE. Following are the details of the status in this regard

The Director (ATR&I) informed the house that in order to decentralize the capacity building of teachers, the Board has approached various State Governments for allotting land and showed the status in this regard with the house.

2.8 To report on the recycling of the paper waste generated at CBSE including regional offices with the help of an NGO working in the field and use the stationery and other items produced for office consumption and installing 'Paper Recycling Plant' at later stage

As approved, CBSE has undertaken the initiative by collecting all the used/discarded paper and got the first lot recycled with the help of NGOs, 'Green-O-Tech India'. Recycled material for the first lot has been received (Eco-pads, spiral notepads and pens) and the second lot of used/discarded paper has been collected and sent for recycling-process.

The House appreciated the effort and applauded the quality of the sample of recycled paper material provided by the CBSE.

2.9 To report on the Oracle free training on Alice and green foot through virtual and in- class training to in house staff and to master trainers

CBSE in collaboration with Oracle Academy have conducted three days Master Trainer's Workshop on Alice for teachers of the schools affiliated to CBSE under the regional offices Panchkula and Chennai.

Oracle Academy set up Computer Lab with the support of venue schools and with the help of Alice, individual teachers were guided about designing projects and assessing them with the help of laid down rubrics as a part of Formative assessment in CCE. Each teacher got an opportunity of hands on practice. Printed Alice manuals, exercise booklets, project designing worksheets and rubrics etc. were distributed to each participating teacher. Details of these workshops are given as hereunder:

2.10 To report on the CBSE e-governance System

A detailed proposal for CBSE e-Governance system was submitted to Department of Electronics and Information Technology (DeitY). DeitY has suggested some improvements in the proposal submitted by CBSE. Based on this feedback the proposal has been reworked and it now contains only three modules i.e. e-Analytics, e- Accreditation and e-Internal Governance. A basic version of e-Accreditation is being built in-house and will become operational in the near future. The proposal for e-Internal-Governance is ready and will be submitted to DeitY in the near future.

2.11 To report issuing guidelines to schools for the selection of books for classes' I-VIII

Guidelines in the form of a circular highlighting the principles of child-centered education, activity based learning, child development has been sent to all the affiliated schools. Circular particularly specifies that a textbook must draw from the tenets of Values Education, Gender Sensitivity and Inclusive Education especially in the context of disadvantaged and first generation learners wherever possible. Textbooks must not contain anything objectionable to any religion, culture, gender, class or community and free from errors of all kinds. It has also been brought in the notice of all the schools affiliated to Board that in case a book followed by any school is found to contain any content in violation of above guidelines, the school concerned will have to take responsibility of such content and appropriate action will be taken by the Board against management of such school. The circular is also available at www.cbseacademic.nic.in

2.12 To report on issuing guidelines to schools regarding integration ICT of across subjects for classes' I-VIII and IX-X and introduction of an additional ICT subject for classes IX-X.

The guidelines in this regard have been framed. However, as the integration of ICT involves training of teachers in ICT on a large scale and allotment of more time in school timetable which allows extremely limited time to many co-scholastic activities and other subjects, the Board is planning to take views of experts and various other stakeholders on these guidelines before putting it in front of curriculum committee.

2.13 To report on the collaboration between the Embassy of France in India and CBSE in the area of teaching and learning of French

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) signed a formal MoU with the Embassy of France in India on 16 April 2013. The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Embassy of France in India will facilitate training of French language teachers in India and in France. This initiative aims at acquainting teachers with current teaching methods and methodologies as well as revising the existing curriculum, introducing new programmes and tools for teaching French in India. This MoU will also enable the CBSE and Embassy to collaborate on various educational projects pertaining to the French language.

2.14 To report the introduction of Italian language in the schools affiliated to CBSE and collaboration between the Italian Embassy Cultural Centre India and CBSE in this regard

As the controlling authority of the Board is MHRD, the Board seeks approval of MHRD on major policy matters. The issue of collaboration between the Italian Embassy Cultural Centre India and CBSE has been referred to MHRD for their opinion. The Board will move ahead in this direction as and when the approval of the MHRD is granted.

2.15 To report on the syllabus of 'Human Rights and Gender Studies' as an optional Elective Form for classes XI&XII from the session 2013-2014.

Consequent upon the approval of the syllabus by the curriculum committee, the course is being offered as a pilot elective to 79 interested schools across the country for the session 2013-14. The textual material is being prepared in a phased manner for the session 2013-2014. Two units for class XI one each towards Human-Rights and Gender Studies are ready. Two more units are in the process.

2.16 To report the development of age appropriate, gender sensitivity cards from classes' I-XII and Teachers' Handbook on Gender sensitivity

Consequent upon the approval of the curriculum committee for the development of Teacher's Manual and activity cards for various levels of students in three categories –primary level (III-V), upper primary level (VI-VIII) and secondary level (IX-XII), the Manuals and Cards are almost in the final stage.

2.17 To report on the revision of CCE Manuals at Primary, Upper Primary and Secondary levels


The CCE manuals have been revised and ready for final vetting before printing. The Board has clubbed the manuals of Classes VI-VIII and IX-X in a new volume for classes VI-X for the teachers of middle and secondary schools. The Board has also developed the manual for the teachers teaching classes' I-V. On the basis of feedback received through various channels following are the highlights of the modifications incorporated in the revised version of CCE manuals to make the scheme of *School Based Assessment* under CCE more simple, easier and student as well as teacher friendly:

Classes VI-X '

Formative Assessment

Each Formative assessment should include:

- 1. One Individual Activity One Group (Worksheet, Debate)
- 2. One Group Activity (Projects, Role Plays, Group Discussion, Surveys)
- 3. Written Assessment



- Activities should be varied such as quiz, debate, projects, theatre etc. (refer to FA Manuals)
- Activities should include one group activity per assessment.
- One Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary group project should be assigned to students in each term.
- For Assessment purposes the best score of one individual activity and one group activity will be taken.
- The final FA will be calculated as the average of the best score (one individual activity or a group activity) and the score of written assessment

Co-Scholastic Areas

- The descriptors made more comprehensive and less in number for marking. Effectively reduced to half (instead of 10 only 5 towards- Life Skills, Attitudes, Co-Scholastic activities and any two out of four towards Values)
- Visual and performing arts included in 3(A) Co-Scholastics Activities. Thus offering more options and flexibility for activities selection in this area. Also reducing one component to mark in coscholastics area)
- Co-Scholastics evaluation same towards both upper primary and secondary classes.

Class I-V

- No Pass or Fail at the end of the academic year and promotion of all learners to the next class.
- No exams at the end of term or session, assessment integrated in teaching-learning process.
- Assessment through formal and informal activities, designed to achieve specific learning outcomes.
- Teacher will regularly evaluate learner's performance in these activities and maintain a term-wise record
- Evaluation based on rubrics, checklists and descriptive indicators.
- Continuous observation and documentation based on anecdotal records, leading to specific diagnosis, feedback and remediation
- No marks or grades, only smiley
 Only smiley
 Performance Profile for Classes I-II
- Grades on a 5-point scale for classes III-V
- Teachers to provide descriptive feedback on strengths and on the areas that need support/improvement (reinforcement).
- Regular reinforcement and remediation to help learners overcome the gaps in learning and understanding.
- Textbooks till Class II to be kept in school.
- Group activities (Projects) should be interdisciplinary. Project work to be done in class under the supervision of the teacher and not to be given as home-work.
- Creative home assignments to be given. (Alternatives to Homework, CBSE to be revised)
- Focus on socio-emotional development- Attitudes and Values Formation and Life-Skills.

2.18 To report on proposal of PAN-India content delivery network for e-learning on integrating ICT into the learning environment of school students by training teachers to use online content

The capacity building workshops in various Sahodaya School Complexes are being planned as a part of TALEEM. These workshops have the primary objective of training teachers to use online content. The Board has now acquired a state-of-the-art IBM Blade Centre Server with 4 Blades to commission the TALEEM services for the Chinmaya Vidyalayas in the region. The first TALEEM Workshop on 'ICT Skills for Teachers' was announced for the first batch of nearby Chinmaya Vidyalaya and a few other CBSE school teachers of Class IX Science and Mathematics subjects. The dates for the workshop were May 10-11, 2013.

Director (ATR&I) informed the house that the above project will help in analyzing the performance of various agencies empanelled by the Board and improve the process of grading the agencies.

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan wanted that there should be some more guidelines to recognize the performance of students in various sports.

Director (ATR&I) responded that the same has already been revised and incorporated in the forthcoming addition of CCE Manual.

2.19 To report on the revision of Fashion Studies curriculum for classes XI and XII

The Revised Fashion studies curriculum was approved by the committee. The book(s) for classes XI and XII have been revised with minor modifications. Fashion Design as a profession which includes the entire process of designing and producing fashion apparels from the fibre and yarn stage to the finished product. In the dynamic world of fashion, the designers need to possess creativity to produce new styles and therefore, the curriculum should be such as to give an overview of fashion design and elaborate on different aspects like elements of design, history of fashion, fabrics, understanding of the body, pattern development and garment construction. The revised curriculum also adequately emphasises on practical skills required for future fashion designers.

2.20 To report on the revision of Computer Science curriculum for classes XI and XII. The new revised curriculum will applicable in grade XI for session 2015.

The Committee of Courses in Computer Science has modified the curriculum for Computer Science (subject code 083) by replacing the language C++ with the language Python in class XI for session 2013-14. The revised curriculum is applicable in grade XI for session 2015. However for the current session teachers have been given a choice between old and new curriculum. Teachers may teach C++ as per old curriculum or may teach Python as per new curriculum. Teachers have been asked to provide feedback on choice of language. Based on feedback provided by teachers the Board will take decision to retain C++ in the next academic session if teachers give feedback in favour of C++ or may change to new programming language i.e. Python.

Mr. L.V.Sehgal enquired about the continuity of Python in place of C++ and was informed that it would depend on the electronic feedback received.

2.21 To report the recommendations of Right to Education (RTE- 2009) regarding time table, staff norms and work in the light of School Based Assessment under Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation for classes IX and X

The Board has framed the time table, staff norms and work as per the recommendations of RTE-Act-2009. The Curriculum Committee has also approved the dissemination of such norms in the last meeting on January 15, 2013. Therefore the norms have been incorporated in the all the versions of Curriculum

Document- 2015 and are available on <u>www.cbseacademic.nic.in</u>. The academic unit has also forwarded the draft to affiliation unit for the dissemination to all the schools affiliated to Board.

2.22 To report the development of text book of philosophy for class XII for the session 2014-15

A committee has been constituted for developing the support material in Philosophy for class XI for the session 2013-14. The material is going to be prepared by the end of the June, 2013. The material for class XII will be prepared by December 2013.

2.23 To report on revision of CBSE - i curriculum for classes I to V

As per decision taken the revision work will not be taken up for classes I to V. Instead schools will be educated on basket approach and will be advised to teach accordingly.

2.24 To report on CBSE-i training programme for teachers in India

CBSE *i* affiliation has been granted initially to 30 schools in India. A two day training programme was organized for teachers of these schools in Chennai and New Delhi respectively. Further training programmes will be organized as and when the schools will get affiliated to CBSE *i*.

2.25 To report on revised Computer Science Curriculum for CBSE –i for class XI for 2014 Examination and Class XII for 2015 Examination

The revised curriculum for CBSE *i* for class XI for 2014 examinations and Class XII for 2015 examination was approved by the committee and was shared with all schools concerned and uploaded on CBSE-*i* portal.

2.26 To report on revised Information Practices Curriculum for CBSE –i for class XI from session 2013-14 and Class XII from session 2014-15

The revised curriculum for CBSE *i* for class XI for 2014 examinations and Class XII for 2015 examination was approved by the committee and was circulated to all schools and uploaded on CBSE-*i* portal.

2.27 To report on revised Home Science Curriculum for CBSE – *i* for class XI from session 2013-14 and Class XII from session 2014-15

The revised Home Science curriculum for CBSE *i* for class XI for 2014 examinations and Class XII for 2015 examination was approved by the committee and was circulated to all schools and uploaded on CBSE- *i* portal. The subject was renamed as 'Human Studies' and all units for class XI are already uploaded on the portal.

Reading material for class XI 'Home Studies' (CBSE-i) is already uploaded on portal. Team is working on grade XII units. However this is to inform you that there is no child in Class XII for the above mentioned subject in this academic year.

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan suggested that nomenclature of the subject Home Science should be modified to Human Studeis for the CBSE main also.

2.28 To report on revised Engineering Graphics Curriculum for CBSE –i for class XI from session 2013-14 and Class XII from session 2014-15

The subject experts decided not to revise Engineering Graphics curriculum for CBSE i. The curriculum is well designed and may be kept as per CBSE main. Hence revision work was not undertaken in this subject.

2.29 To report on extension of CBSE-i for grades IV, V, VIII and XII in the session 2013-14 and development of study materials for the same

CBSE -i is extended to grades IV, V, VIII and XII in the session 2013-14. Study material in all the subjects has been uploaded on the portal

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Section III

Major activities conducted since the last Curriculum Committee Meeting

Agenda Item: 3

To report on major activities conducted since the last Curriculum Committee Meeting.

The period from January to March is usually associated with compilation of records for final results and in March both School Based and Board based SA-II start; therefore schools remain busy in assessment related activities. In April schools continue to be occupied in admissions, time table and annual calendar etc. Therefore CBSE plans to organize bulk of the activities in the second half of the year. The following are the highlights of the major activities conducted by the Board:

1. Update on Academic initiatives

(i) Conduct of the Summative Assessment – II March-2013

CBSE supported the schools by providing the question papers and marking schemes in major subjects to all the schools willing to take SA-II for classes IX and X in the month of March- 2013. The Board started an online generation of Question paper to all the schools affiliated to CBSE across the country.

The Board hired an agency to deliver QPs to schools. Except for some procedural and formatting errors found in the papers generated online, the assessment went on well. The Board is in the process of revising the process of tagging the questions and improvising the system to preclude font and formatting errors in future.

(ii) Conduct of Problem Solving Assessment (PSA) for classes IX and XI

The Board has successfully conducted PSA for all the students in classes IX and XI in all affiliated schools in the month of February, 2013. The PSA substituted the FA-4 in class IX and will replace FA-4 in class X as well. The score of PSA will be reflected in one Language (English or Hindi), Mathematics, Science and Social-Science w.e.f the session 2012-2013 for Class IX and 2013 – 14 for Class X. As there is no separate additional syllabus or time allotted in the time- table as the PSA assessed the generic skills. The PSA is also expected to reduce the workload of teachers as it will replace two of the Formative Assessments in classes IX and X. Around forty percent of students have been declared eligible in this test which had no specified syllabus as well as time allotted.

The Board informed the schools that a similar Problem Solving Assessment for classes IX and XI for the academic year 2013-14 will be held on 10th January, 2014.

The Board has also intimated the salient features of this test by highlighting the following:

- There is no specific syllabus for this test. It will assess life skills related to the following elements:
 Language conventions, Qualitative Reasoning and Quantitative Reasoning
- The items will incorporate assessment of 21st Century skills such as Creative Thinking, Decision-making, Critical Thinking, Problem Solving and Communication skills that lead to greater success at higher education as well as real life situations. These items will be assessing students' ability to process, interpret and use information rather than merely assessing students' prior subject knowledge.
- PSA score will be counted towards FA4 which is 10% of total assessments for class-IX. This
 score will be reflected equally in one language (English or Hindi), Mathematics, Science and
 Social Science. Class-XI students will be issued a separate certificate for the same.

(iii) Revision of Functional English Course Book for Class XI

Keeping in mind the need-based, practical-oriented approach of textual material, CBSE has revised the Functional English Language Skills Book -Class XI and Functional English language Literature Reader - Class XI for the session 2013-14. The revised Functional English books are essentially skills-based, offering students an all-round and varied opportunities to develop their four language skills-reading, writing, listening and speaking. The course materials offer a wide range of text types [literary, discursive, descriptive and factual], followed by learner-centred activities. The course focuses on enlarging students' vocabulary through word building skills, extensive practice in the sub- skills of writing in context, with emphasis on the process of writing, developing speaking and listening skills through activities that are overtly built into the material to guide students in their actualization of these skills. They are supported by the inclusion of the mechanics of speech [stress, intonation, phonetics] with grammar that supports these skills, and appreciation of literature-poetry, prose and drama.

(iv) Revision of Formative Assessment Teacher's Manual for classes IX and X.

The Formative Assessment Manuals for Teachers for classes IX and X have been revised as per the feedback received from the teachers of different schools across the country. A total of 14 manuals in all major subjects i.e. Hindi, English, Mathematics, Science and Social Sciences have been upgraded by a team of experts. The Revised Manuals are under printing and will be available in the beginning of the new session 2013-14 for the teachers.

(v) Incorporation of flexibility in the choice of Computer Language under Computer Science Subject for grade XI and XII 2013 -15

The Committee of Courses in Computer Science has modified the curriculum for Computer Science (subject code 083) by replacing the language C++ with the language Python in class XI for session 2013-14. The revised curriculum is applicable in grade XI for session 2015. However for the current session teachers have been given a choice between old and new curriculum. Teachers may teach C++ as per old curriculum or may teach Python as per new curriculum.

Teachers have been asked to provide feedback on choice of language. Based on feedback provided by teachers the Board will take decision to retain C++ in the next academic session if teachers give feedback in favour of C++ or may change to new programming language i.e. Python.

(vi) <u>Discontinuation of the use of rare/endangered species of plants and animals in laboratories of schools</u>

The Board once again reiterated strict adherence to the provisions of Wild Life Protection Act while procuring plants and animals for the use in laboratories by the school. All the schools affiliated to Board have been directed to handover any live stock or specimen available in the school lab, to the nearest Wild Life Forest Department. Storing or keeping possession of livestock or specimen for practical purposes by any school is a serious offence and besides proceeding under relevant provisions of Wild Life Act, the Board would also initiate action against such defaulter schools which may lead to withdrawal of affiliation by the Board.

The school are also encouraged to make a self-declaration that no animal is used for dissection for science practical purposes.

(vii) Guidelines for Project Work in the subject History for Classes XI and XII

The Committee of Courses in History has decided to include project work in both the classes XI and XII w. e. f. the academic session 2013-14, therefore the Board has brought out guidelines for the Project work for teachers and students. The guidelines illustrate the theme, content, process and rubrics for the assessment of the project to be allotted with the help of exemplars. Schools are directed to ensure that the project work is assigned to the students in groups and they should be supported in securing relevant resources and obtaining required permissions from museums, archaeological sites etc. for their project. Teachers should discuss the progress of project throughout the course of project and if required guide

them in drafting, reviewing and finalisation of the report. It is highlighted that the suggested exemplars in the guidelines are only for the reference of teachers and schools are expected to formulate their own original projects on the basis of given guidelines.

(iv) Annual Training Calendar for April 2013 – December 2013

The training unit of CBSE is involved in planning, taking feedback on the quality of trainings, developing training in different subjects and eventually conducting teacher training programmes, principals, empowerment programmes, orientation of newly inducted principals of new school affiliated to CBSE. An annual calendar in this regard has been prepared so that systems are put into place. The calendar is available www.cbseacademic.nic.in

3. Other Initiatives

(i) Roll out of Online Labs in the schools affiliated to CBSE across the country

CBSE recommended Online Labs for School Experiments (OLabs) to all the schools affiliated to the Board.OLabs is a novel e-Learning project developed by CDAC, Mumbai and Amrita University, Kerala and based on the concept of virtual learning environment.

O-Labs works on web environment and provides experience in online practical science experiments. It has been developed for the students of classes IX and X, to enhance their understanding of experimentation concepts. The content is mapped and aligned to the CBSE curriculum for classes IX and X.O-Labs will help overcome the limitations faced by some students in a few schools in India due to either insufficient time or instruments in laboratories. It is also capable of assessing a student's observations, procedural and reporting skills, and will allow teachers to track the student usage, thus making learning more effective.

These virtual experiments will stimulate students interest and learning and will give them the experience of doing real lab work, by graphically resembling with Laboratory equipment and simulating a virtual medium. Students can practice these experiments at their leisure and may use this for revising the concept at the comfort of their home as many times as they wish. Teachers may specially find it very useful while demonstrating the experiments in class or in Laboratory as it will provide minute details with complete clarity. This is likely to enhance the learning of the students.

(ii) The meeting of the advisory Committee on CCE

The CBSE has appointed an advisory committee on CCE to appraise School Based Assessment and suggest measures for proper implementation and further improvement of it. The third meeting of this committee was held on May 22, 2013 in the Conference Hall of the *Shiksha Sadan*, Delhi. The Committee discussed the many issues including Collection and Analysis of Evidence of Assessment, Teacher Empowerment, Combined Revised Teachers' Manual of CCE for classes VI-X, Problem Solving Assessment (PSA), Assessment of Speaking and Listening skills of students, Provision of online support mechanism to schools and students. The Committee appreciated various steps taken by the Board and took stock of various issues related to above topics. After having long deliberations the committee also suggested some measures to make these initiatives more effective.

(iii) CBSE Channel on You-Tube

CBSE has a channel on 'You Tube: www.youtube.com/cbsechannel' dedicated to the various activities conducted by the Board and its affiliated schools. The affiliated schools have been invited to send in their original videos like short films, role plays, talks, discussions, debates, presentations or other such activities on any of the following themes to be uploaded on the CBSE Channel: Health & Wellness ,Gender Sensitivity ,Community Outreach ,Life Skills, Values Education ,Heritage, Disaster Management ,Social Issues ,Environmental Issues and Concerns, Innovative Teaching Learning Methodologies

Director (ATR&I) informed the house that the lectures of Professor Kapil Kapoor are available on the You-tube channel of CBSE and requested members to send in any short film/ lecture that they might deliver at various forums.

(iv) Heritage Education Workshop for Teachers

The primary aim of the Heritage Education is to encourage awareness of the genius of the natural and cultural heritage that surrounds us in our daily lives and engage children in a direct experience of heritage, preferably outside the classroom wherever it's possible and appropriate.

To promote Heritage Education, CBSE is encouraging schools and teachers by involving them in heritage related activities such as adapting the learning modules/heritage workbooks, heritage walks and heritage clubs etc. The Board has organized a heritage education workshop free of charge on behalf of Govt of Delhi on 16th April 2013. The intention of CBSE through such workshops is to gradually develop the subject as a formal link program for cross-disciplinary study between social and natural sciences. Workshop covered the following issues:

- a) creating the methodology of organizing a club
- b) curating a heritage walk
- c) adopting a monument
- d) developing heritage activities for one academic year for different classes
- e) innovative heritage education activities.

4. CBSE-i

(i) Reading Material in ICT, Home Science, Visual and Performing Art

The Reading Material for Performing Art (CBSE i) for classes VI is already uploaded on the portal. The material for classes VII and VIII will be uploaded by last week of July. Reading Material for ICT (CBSE-i) for classes i to X is already uploaded on portal. Units for class VIII and 3 units of class V will be uploaded by end of July. Reading Material for Visual Art (CBSE i) for classes VI and VII is already uploaded on portal. Material for class VIII will be uploaded by last week of July.

(ii) CBSE i Advisory Committee

CBSE has appointed an advisory committee on CBSE-i to appraise and suggest measures for proper execution and further improvement of CBSE-i. The third meeting of this committee was held on June 14, 2013 in the Conference Hall of the *University of Delhi*, Delhi. The Committee discussed the many issues including initiation of CBSE-i Curriculum pilot project in Indian Schools, training of teachers teaching CBSE-i Curriculum in Indian Schools, coordination with 41 State Boards for acceptance of class X pass outs of CBSE-i Curriculum at par with CBSE (Main) examination, coordination with other Universities in India and abroad for facilitating admission of class XII CBSE-i Curriculum pass outs, collection of Evidence of Assessment for Formative Assessment, Summative Assessment and Co-scholastic Areas for CBSE-i Curriculum, Hubs of Excellence for CSBE I, the Examination Byelaws and Affiliation Byelaws of CBSE-i Curriculum, manual for core areas of CBSE-i Curriculum i.e. Research, SEWA, Perspectives and Life Skills, MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) to be signed by the schools getting CBSE i affiliation

The Committee appreciated various steps taken by the Board and took stock of various issues related to above topics. After having long deliberations the committee also suggested some measures to make these initiatives more effective.

(iii) SEWA, Research, Life Skills and Perspective manuals

The process of development of manual for core areas of CBSE-*i* Curriculum i.e. Research, SEWA, Perspectives and Life Skills is in process. The manuals for SEWA are ready and will be uploaded on the portal by 15th June. Manuals Perspective, research and Life skills will be uploaded by Last week of July

(iv) Coordination with 41 State Boards and Universities for CBSE i recognition

Letters were sent to all 41 state Boards in the first week of November for acceptance of class X pass outs of CBSE-i Curriculum which is at par with CBSE (Main) examination. We have received response from some Boards.

(v) Hubs of Excellence

CBSE has taken an initiative to appoint Internal and External Hubs coordinator with the following purpose.

- > For quality enhancement/excellence in various subjects.
- To create the teaching interest group initiative.

On CBSE *i* portal different groups have been created for different subjects and a link called "Discussion Group" has been provided. Each subject has an external and internal coordinator.

5. Centre for Assessment Evaluation and Research

(i) Launch of Assessment Training Programme Centre for Assessment Evaluation and Research

The Centre has formulated the first of a series of professional development programmes for teachers and principals and launched Assessment Training Programme (ATP) wie f February 2013.

The ATP comprises the following four modules:

- i. Constructing quality multiple choice items to assess the scholastic skills of the curriculum
- ii. Constructing quality constructed-response items to assess the scholastic skills of the curriculum
- iii. Formative Assessment and the use of performance standards for assessing scholastic and co-scholastic skills
- iv. Classroom based research

Participation in all four modules and the fulfilment of the required follow up activity will allow teachers to submit evidence for a qualification. Successful participation will create a pool of assessment experts in the country as well as build assessment capacity of teachers.

Agenda Item: 4 - New Agenda items for consideration and approval

Agenda item - 4.1

To consider and approve the analysis the result of schools at grade 10 which have awarded 10 of CGPA in all the five subjects based on the Evidence of Assessment received

The Board has been collecting evidences of assessments from the schools selected on stratified random basis across the country to oversee and improve the quality of school based assessment. It has been noticed in the last result declared that some of the schools are awarding Grade Point 10 in all the subjects to a large number of students. It is highly likely that these schools, in order to promote and advertise their name, may be awarding inflated grades to their students. It is therefore proposed that Board will ask schools awarding grade point 10 to more than twenty five percent of their registered candidates to send the evidence of assessment to CBSE and after analysing the evidence a team of principals from the neighbouring schools led by a CBSE officer will visit the school concerned for sharing their best practices. In a similar vein those schools which have awarded CGPA of 4.5 and less will also be a part of the field visits. If a school is found to be inflating the grades on basis of inadequate or incorrect evidence, the grades of all the students of that school will be moderated on the basis of PSA.

Director (ATR&I) informed the house that the Board has noticed that there are some 23-25 schools which have awarded more than 25% of their students full 10 CGPA in all subjects. On the other hand, there are some schools which have awarded less than 4.5 CGPA to their students as well.

Chairman, CBSE emphasised the provision of moderation on the basis of results of PSA conducted by the Board to resolve such problems.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.2

To consider and approve constitution of an Advisory Committee on trainings conducted by CBSE

In the light of the major recommendations of the National Curriculum Framework-2005 and the provisions of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009, the Central Board of Secondary Education has been strengthening examination reforms from academic session 2009 onward. The Board has been conducting numerous training programmes to supplement examination reforms with trainings to effectively implement these reforms. The trainings also aim to improve quality of school education in a larger perspective.

The Board has schematized the training programmes on various areas and published an Annual Training Calendar on its website. In order to make these training programmes more outcome based, quantifiable in terms of result and to suggest further improvements in these, the Board proposes to constitute an Advisory Committee on Trainings. It is further proposed that a senior officer from the Department of Personnel and Training, Govt. of India may head this committee.

The NCERT representative pointed out to the absence of any member from NCERT and it was decided to ensure NCERT and SCERT inclusion.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.3

To consider and approve setting up of a quality control unit at CBSE for training programmes conducted through empanelled agencies

There has been an unprecedented increase in the number of training programmes conducted and coordinated by the academic and training unit of CBSE. It is perhaps high time to establish a mechanism to monitor the outcome and quality of various training programmes undertaken specially by empanelled agencies. CBSE therefore proposes to set up a quality assurance mechanism to monitor and regulate training of teachers and Principals in the schools affiliated to CBSE by empanelled training agencies. CBSE Quality Unit will regulate training courses and training agencies to ensure that CBSE approved quality standards are met.

The main objectives of proposed unit may be the following:

- Drafting and amending (from time to time) a set of guidelines to create a quality assurance framework for training conducted by its empanelled training agencies in the CBSE affiliated schools. These will comprise of essential conditions and standards for initial and continuing registration of the Empanelled Training Agencies.
- 2. Empanelling training agencies
- 3. Accrediting Training Courses
- 4. Ensuring that agencies comply with the process laid down by CBSE for training
- 5. Collecting, analysing and publishing information on the Trainings and agencies.

Director (ATR&I) informed the house that this unit will be coordinating quality of various academic programmes and trainings being conducted by the Board. They will develop a database for all training programmes. The unit will also analyse the performance of agencies on the basis of feedback of participants, venue principals and CBSE observers as well as other parameters identified by the Committee. The unit will also quantify the impact of training programmes.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.4

To consider and approve restructuring and operationalizing the CCE unit at various Regional Offices of the Board

There has been a feedback that the schools do not comply with the directions given by Boards in many areas such as transaction of curriculum, assessment of students and dispatch of Evidence of Assessment. The staff and officers posted at Regional Offices are not able to liaise with all the schools under their jurisdiction properly and there are reports of serious anomalies. Therefore it is proposed that a structure of academic staff may be established at different Regional Offices and they may be trained at center. The academic unit at Regional Offices will be responsible for ensuring the quality of curriculum transaction and assessments done as per the standards laid down by the Board. The following structure may be established to start with:

Director (ATR&I) thanked Professor Kapil Kapoor on behalf of Academic Unit for proposing the establishment of Academic Cadre and working out the details as a Committee Member in this regard.

Director (ATR&I) informed the house that the academic staff needs to be posted at regional offices of the Board for better coordination with schools in academic matters and sought approval for this agenda.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.5

To consider and approve provision of online support mechanism to schools and students

The Board has planned a one stop portal for teachers, students and parents where they can find-resources regarding various types of assessments and audio, video material for facilitating learning. The Board has floated an RFP on Comprehensive Online (and offline) Learning Management System for Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) to further strengthen the CCE framework. It will standardise the implementation of CCE and reduce the workload of teachers. This software is intended to enable the schools affiliated with the Board with computer based learning tools, which the schools have been asking for.

Salient Features of Proposal

Objective: To provide comprehensive Online (web based) and Offline (pen drive) modes of Learning Management System for CCE for both CBSE and CBSE-i

- B. Subjects: English, Mathematics, Science, Social Science and Hindi
- C. Standard: Classes IX X initially followed with classes I- VIII
- D. Course design: Term wise
- E. Assessment Areas: Scholastic and Co -Scholastic
- F. Assessment Types: Formative and Summative Assessments. A question bank of about 10,000 questions for each of classes I to X. Auto generation of QP based on question bank.
- G. Diagnostic Assessments: Adaptive Assessment, Proficiency Test, Problem Solving Assessment (PSA), CBSE-i Performance Analysis Test (PAT), My Paper, Practice Papers and Aptitude Test.
- H. Teachers Corner: Detailed guidelines based on innovative pedagogies
- I. Feedback Corner: Continuous online feedback mechanism

J. Digital Content Design:

- Detailed e-content
- Interactive 2D and 3D animations. About 3000 animations per class for classes IX and X. About 1500 per class for classes I – VIII. Average time of animation is 3 minutes however it can vary between 1 – 10 minutes.
- Live lectures: 80 hours for classes IX and X. About 40 hours per class for classes Vi VIII.
- Lab activities: 6 + hours for classes IX and X. About 3 hours per class for classes VI VIII. (based on virtual labs and simulation)
- The content should be continuously reviewed and revised/updated as required

K. Part-II & III Co-Scholastic Areas/Activities

L. Online payment: The basic software and content will be free for all CBSE schools. For advanced content a fee may be charged from private schools. The advanced software and content will be made available for free to Government and Government aided schools affiliated to CBSE

M. School Administrator Credentials

N. Academic Tools/Assistance

O. Mobile enabled: The systems above need to be mobile enabled (at a minimum for Android mobile phones and other mobile operating systems if possible)

Status of RFP: Six agencies have been shortlisted and selected for working across all stages of schooling. The rates for classes I-VIII are Rs.2/- per child per month and for classes IX-X are Rs.10/- per child per month.

Director (ATR&I) requested RO(T) to brief the house about the salient features of initiatives.

RO (T) described the salient features and informed the house that the Board has identified six agencies. The best rate quoted for classes I-VIII is Rs.2/- per child per month and for classes IX-X is Rs.10/- per child per month.

The house applauded this move and many members said that the prices are extremely attractive.

Chairman, CBSE informed that there will be no charges for the government schools.

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan appreciated the cost free nature of this initiative for government schools and she also particularly acknowledged the offline pen-drive mode of this initiative as it would help rural population where there is problem of electricity and internet connectivity.

Director (ATR&I) said that multiplicity of agencies will set in an internal competition and Board will review their performance after one year for continuing their term. Director (ATR&I) sought the approval of house for this agenda.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.6

To consider and approve pilot project for Co-scholastic assessment tool with World Kids

It is universally accepted that moving pictures leave a lasting impact on impressionable minds of children. Therefore reaching out to children with a world of compelling films that engage their imagination, spark their creativity, respect their intelligence and connect them to global culture may be an alternative idea to stimulate students better.

WorldKids has developed a unique Assessment Tool in conjunction with expert educationists, counselors, and psychologists using a series of multiple-choice questions to assess students in these co-scholastic areas as per CBSE guidelines. WorldKids will provide CBSE with multiple choice questionnaires for the students. The film is uploaded on their Youtube channel. The questionnaire will be couriered to the schools by CBSE. The students will collectively watch the short film in school followed by the multiple choice questionnaire. The school then will courier the questionnaire back to WorldKids where they will evaluate and the results on hard copy for each student with grades and descriptive indicators will be sent back to the school or CBSE. The results and report cards will be also available online and are linked through the CBSE website and/or the school or parents and students.

For the pilot, results with grades and descriptive indicators will be available within two weeks of them being sent to the agency for evaluation. Post the pilot, the same results will be available to the schools and students within 24 hours

The CBSE has designated a Committee to look in to proposals of pilots by organisations which are doing good work but may not presently be empanelled with CBSE.

Director (ATR&I) informed the house that the agency WorldKids is already empanelled with the CBSE and their programme is patented with IIT Mumbai. This Pilot will help schools to explore alternative ways to assess coscholastic areas.

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan proposed if WorldKids may make a presentation before some principals about their project.

Chairman and Director (ART&I) consented to the request.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

After this agenda point **Professor Prem Singh** enquired about the progress of constitution of a committee on Inclusive Education and suggested that CBSE should conduct training programmes for teachers to sensitize them towards the needs of physically and visually disadvantaged students.

Controller of Examination, CBSE responded by stating that the Board has permitted the use of JAWS software for visually inconvenienced students. He however emphasized that only two children will use this software. He also told the house that the Board has printed the question papers of Mathematics and Science in Braille. However, there are no takers for this initiative.

Chairman, CBSE informed the house that there are two different committees in this regard. The first Committee is focusing its attention on making examination more convenient for differently abled students. The other one will be constituted as the Governing Body of the Board has approved its constitution. The second committee will focus on what changes can be done to make education in the CBSE affiliated schools more inclusive in nature. This Committee will also study numerous suggestions received by the Board in this regard and analyze their feasibility.

Mr. Kamalbir Singh, Principal, Dehradun School for the Visually Challenged and Professor Prem Singh can be included in this committee.

Chairman, CBSE further informed the house that CBSE has made various efforts and allowed visually impaired students to opt Science stream. The Board has proposed to take a multiple type question assessment for assessing the practical part for such students.

The Board has allowed a student suffering from muscular alrophy to write examination in his own school. Chairman, CBSE informed the house that the Board is consulting experts in this area and is committed to make education as disabled friendly as possible.

Agenda item - 4.7

To consider and approve the organization of 20th Annual National conference of Sahodaya School Complexes at Amritsar

In order to bring Sahodaya members on a common platform the Board conducts a National Annual Conference of Sahodaya School Complexes every year on an identified theme of current educational relevance. Besides facilitating broad interactions among practitioners, it also serves as an effective channel of interaction between schools and the CBSE and thereby helps the Board in formulating its policies in a progressive and pragmatic manner. The deliberations on the issues arising out of the conference theme trigger meaningful thought processes which are then encapsulated in the form of Recommendations and disseminated to the other members of the Sahodaya. The annual conference for the year 2013 is proposed to be hosted by Amritsar Chapter of Sahodaya Schools Complexes from 6th – 8th November, 2013 on the theme: Future Ready Schools. The subthemes for this year's conference may be: Future challenges in School Education, Preparing global Learners, Challenges for 21st Century education, Skill Based Education/ Vocationalization of Education, Inclusive Schools and innovative paradigms, Gender sensitization, Assessment for learning and Education for lifelong learning

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.8

To consider and approve the syllabus and textual material for NCC, Theatre Studies and Legal Studies, optional electives started from the current academic year 2013-14

Keeping in view the diversity of subjects in higher education the Board strives to provide as much flexibility in the selection of electives as possible at the senior secondary level, the level where specialisation in various subjects begins. From the current academic session i.e. from 2013-14, the Board has introduced three new optional electives on pilot basis to make curriculum more relevant to contemporary context. The newly introduced electives are *NCC*, *Theatre Studies and Legal Studies*. The Board believes that early exposure to these subjects will help students in making informed career choices and developing perspective on various issues. As the Board does not believe in different streams of electives, the electives introduced can be combined with any prevailing combination of subjects. This may allow flexibility so students can take up a variety of subject combinations, giving them expertise across fields.

The elective *NCC* aims to prepare students for a career in the armed forces similarly the elective *Theatre Studies* would be useful for students interested in creative arts as it will teach theatre forms, production work and skills such performing, directing and designing.

Mr. Sandeep Sethi, Education Officer, CBSE informed the house that some universities in South India are giving credit to 'B' certificate holders in their admissions.

Director (ART&I) informed that there are 60 seats reserved for the 'C' certificate holders in IMA

Professor J.M.Khurana emphasized the need for sensitization of Directorate of NCC for properly executing their activities in schools and colleges.

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan praised the initiative and said that this will improve the self-defense training and life-skills of students which are crucially important. The house unanimously appreciated this move.

Chairman, CBSE informed the house that the Board has received a reference from the Ministry of Sports to offer NSS like NCC. However, he was of the view that it may be done in a controlled manner.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.9

To consider and approve omission of long reading text / novel 'Lord of Flies' by William Golding prescribed for class XII English Core subject in the CBSE Curriculum 2014 and 2015

It has come to the notice of the Board that the long reading text / novel — 'Lord of Flies' by William Golding prescribed for class XII English Core subject in the CBSE Curriculum 2014 and 2015 is not available in the market easily. As the schools affiliated to CBSE are situated across the country and not confined to

metropolitan cities, the non-availability of this novel may affect students adversely. Moreover CBSE is also answerable for the shortage of any prescribed book. Therefore the Committee of Courses of English has decided to drop this novel from the session 2013-14 onward. The Committee of Courses further decided that there will be two questions from the other long reading text/ novel 'The Hound of Baskervilles' by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle - on plot, theme or incidences and characterization in the final examination of March 2014.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.10

To consider and approve issuing advisory to schools for celebrating "World Ozone Day"

Recognizing the importance of Ozone, United Nations General Assembly designated September 16th as the International Day for the preservation of the Ozone layer. This day may be observed as "World Ozone Day" in schools to create awareness among students. It marks the importance of Ozone layer and its role in the environment. India acceded to the Montreal Protocol on 17.9.92. There are numerous activities and programs organized to spread awareness about the global phenomenon of Ozone layer depletion. All member nations of the Montreal protocol take this opportunity to take some concrete steps at their national level in accordance with the aims and objectives of Montreal protocol. Schools affiliated to the Board may be advised to observe this day to disseminate the awareness about this important issue.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.11

To consider and approve combined training calendar of the Board.

In order to implement various schemes introduced by the Board in an effective manner and to empower teachers in a continuous manner, the Board conducts numerous training programmes for the continuous professional development of teachers on regular basis. Presently the important areas covered under continuous professional development of teachers are, Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation, Formative Assessments, Assessment of Speaking and Learning Skills, Gender Sensitivity, Values Education, Life Skills etc. Earlier the Board was publishing the schedule of trainings under different heads and it has been observed that schools were not finding easy to find out the details of a particular programme. Therefore, to facilitate the availability of information at one place, the Board has developed a comprehensive calendar which includes the details of all kinds of trainings programmes offered by the Board.

Director (ART&I) requested the members if they could visit some of the training programmes conducted by the Board and provide their feedback on these programmes. The members may indicate their place of visit from the calendar provided.

Ms. Ramandeep Kaur, Education Officer, CBSE will send a formal request in this regard to all the members present.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.12

To consider and approve development of question banks of questions appearing in last ten years' question papers of JEE (AIEEE) and NEET-UG(AIPMT) Examinations conducted by CBSE under Resources for students

The Board has been conducting JEE (AIEEE) and NEET-UG (AIPMT) Examinations for the last many years. Every year lakhs of candidates appear in these examinations and are in need of good practice material to prepare for the examinations. Many schools have demanded that CBSE should come out with a Question Bank of past years question papers in these examinations.

With the purpose to provide resource material to school students aspiring to appear in these examinations, it is proposed to develop Question Banks for these examinations.

In this connection, a Committee of Subject experts has been formed by the CBSE to compile questions to categorize them Unit wise to develop Question Banks.

Chairman, CBSE shared with the house that the idea behind this initiative is to help those students who are willing to appear in these examination but cannot buy expensive books. He further told the house that this will also help students to practice.

Director (ATR&I) requested the members to contribute to this initiative by providing additional questions for the help of needy students.

Professor Neelima Gupta pointed out that there is a great divide between the standards of CBSE Board question papers and question papers of JEE and NEET. The question papers of professional examinations are much more application oriented and focused on higher order thinking skills and demand excessive practice. Whereas, the CBSE Board examination papers are still traditional and book based and therefore, do not converge with the standard of professional examinations conducted by the CBSE. She also made it a point that the normalization of the marks obtained in different Boards for the purpose of JEE should be done before JEE (Main) and not after the examination. It may adversely affect those students who have done exceedingly well in their Board Examination but are on the border of the bracket for the eligibility for JEE (Advance).

Professor Om Vikas shared with the house that DST has done a normalization exercise for the school boards in India and CBSE may be benefited by their experience.

Chairman, CBSE assured the house that as this was the first time Board did such a massive exercise. As the Board now has data, it will be used for further simplification of the process.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.13

To consider and approve the training of peer assessors and their certification after assessment for Accreditation

The assessment of schools in the pilot phase of accreditation is over and the reviewing of the reports for the same is in the final stage. The Board plans to make the criteria of accreditation mandatory for all of the schools affiliated to it, and therefore there will be a need of qualified and competent peer assessors to carry out the mammoth task of accreditation for all the 14,500 schools.

In order to develop a pool of competent peer assessors, the Board proposes to conduct a three day training programme in which assessors will be trained on the basis of Accreditation Manual and after an assessment, the successful assessors will be provided a status of certified assessor. The programme is proposed to be held after July 2013. After the training and testing of the Peer Assessors, the SQAA may be carried out on a full-fledged scale.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.14

To consider and approve incorporation of the checklist of gender sensitive parameters to promote gender sensitivity in classroom transaction and school extra-curricular activities in in the accreditation parameters and Affiliation byelaws

There is an awareness deficit about gender and diversity related issues in schools. In many schools gender issues are perceived as issues related to women only. In contemporary context it becomes all the more important to emphasise the sine qua non of making a school gender sensitive and how a school can preclude itself from being non gender friendly. The Board has been promoting gender sensitivity in schools through various programmes and in this process has also developed a checklist for gender sensitivity in schools As Board has developed comprehensive parameters for accrediting a school on the basis of all the important domains related to the quality of education, it is proposed that the checklist for gender sensitivity in schools may be included in the parameters of accreditation to be awarded.

Agenda item - 4.15

To consider and approve online 'Authentic Interactive Video Course on CCE' based on video modules in collaboration with Educational Technology and Management Academy (ETMA), Gurgaon.

Authentic Interactive Video Course on CCE is proposed to be developed in collaboration with Educational Technology and Management Academy, Gurgaon, to fill in the void of uniformity and quality assurance in training on CCE. The Board had also consulted ETMA at time of development of first edition of the CCE manual for teachers in 2009. In tune with the Teachers' Manual on CCE by CBSE, a team of interdisciplinary experts of educational scientists, instructional designers, producers, and media specialists have been invited by ETMA to produce this online Authentic Interactive Video Course.

Besides other benefits, with this technology enabled training modules, all teachers can be oriented and trained in CCE in a time bound manner. It is school-based; so training can run simultaneously in all 14300 schools.

The AIVCC will be accompanied by a detailed Printed Training Manual that will contain (a) texts on each video, (b) exercises and assignments for FA; (c) End of Module Brief for Discussion, (d) structure of training sessions.

Video course has several incidental advantages. These are: (a) any teacher who has undergone training earlier she will have the chance also to do the refresher training without any problem; (b) newly recruited teachers can be oriented and trained immediately and/ or at their convenience; (c) parents and students can be oriented in CCE so that they too get access to authentic messages; (d) schools will have freedom to decide their training calendar and do not have to depend upon the convenience of the training agency

NCERT representative enquired about the modality of providing feedback to students as the above initiative is based on CCE and Formative Assessments are important part of CCE. She said that there are too many agencies involved in the trainings related to CCE.

Director (ART&I) clarified that CBSE has taken adequate steps and there is a standard manual, regular monitoring of the work of agencies and frequent meetings with these agencies. The Board also has a mechanism to review the performance of agencies and if it is not found to be of satisfactory nature, the agency will be barred.

Chairman, CBSE told the house that it is possible at some places that schools are not using Formative Assessments in the way they are supposed to use it and that is why the Board is exploring alternative ways to train teachers on CCE. The schools affiliated to CBSE are situated across the breadth and length of the country and many of them are in the remotest part. Therefore, it is a challenge to reach to such schools and the alternative ways such as onlinef offline interactive training modules are initiated to address this issue.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.16

To consider and approve the organisation *Katha* for the conduct of the programme *I Love Reading' aimed at promoting reading, creative writing and translation in students of the schools affiliated to CBSE

The Project 'I Love Reading' seeks to nurture creativity of students by giving them a platform to share their writing, thereby inspiring generations of future writers. The CBSE proposes to partner with 'Katha', a nonprofit organization working with storytelling for 22 years, with more than 300 published titles, including quality translations of fiction for adults and children; 21 Indian languages in the voices of over 600 writers and translators. "I Love Reading" is a programme to promote creative writing and translation in children ages 8-17 who currently attend more than 14,000 CBSE schools across India. The organisation 'Katha' puts the child at the center of all learning and makes learning fun, creative, holistic experience and also relevant to the world outside the classroom. 'Katha' also trains teachers to creatively engage students using Katha's Story Pedagogy© and to design classroom activities that make learning interactive and fun.

The programme is proposed to be organised in three stages. Stage I would be organised in the schools affiliated to CBSE followed by stage II which would be held in the cities where the Regional Offices of the Board are situated. The stage III would be organised at New Delhi.

As the programme aims to develop and promote important skills of reading, creative writing and translation skills of children, the Board may collaborate with 'Katha' to start this programme.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.17

To consider and approve launch of the innovative forum termed CBSE Student- Lokpal to address concerns of the student community

In its effort to have greater transparency in the working of the schools and also to allow students to understand their responsibility towards the institution in which they are studying, the Board proposes to start an innovative forum called the CBSE Student-Lokpal.

Objectives of CBSE Student Lokpal:

- To provide quick justice to the students.
- · To acknowledge student voice and provide a platform for redressal
- To create a sense of responsibility among students community.
- To address issues of bullying and ragging
- To create awareness regarding ban on tuition by school teacher
- To address issues of teacher bias
- To address counseling issues concerning adolescence issues and subject choice etc.

Features of CBSE Student Lokpal:

- CBSE Student Lokpal will be completely independent of Student Council and other posts in the school.
- No Principal/teacher will be able to influence their investigations.
- Investigations in any case will have to be completed in two-three months.
- Members of the CBSE Student Lokpal will be selected by a committee through a completely transparent and participatory process.
- It will be the duty of the CBSE Student Lokpal to provide protection to those who are being victimized for raising their voice against discrimination.
- The CBSE Student Lokpal should take up the responsibility of safeguarding the identity and providing relevant security through the designated authorities.

It was decided that a general template for student conduct may also be prepared which will act as a guideline for student responsibilities in the school. Based on the same, the student Lokpal will decided their own operational procedure.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.18

To consider and approve affiliation bye-laws of CBSE international curriculum (CBSE-i) and allotment of affiliation number to schools found eligible for running CBSE-i curriculum

The CBSE has operationalized an alternative Curriculum or CBSE-i in a group of 23 schools initially in the session 2010-2011. This curriculum has been implemented in these schools in Middle East and South-Asia as a Pilot Project for Classes I to XII. The Board has now offered CBSE-i to 30 schools in India from 2013-14.

Highlights of the CBSE-i affiliation Byelaws:

In view of growing interest of the schools for CBSE-I, the Board has compiled affiliation bye-laws for CBSE-i .The major government acts and policies and a compulsory requirement of NOC from the state government are adhered to as it is done in CBSE-Main.

Affiliation under following categories are to be provided:

- a) Approval for Primary curriculum (I to V)
- a) Approval for Middle curriculum (VI to VIII)
- c) Provisional affiliation of secondary school (IX and X)
- d) Upgradation or provisional affiliation of senior secondary school (XI and XII)

The elaboration related to infrastructural facilities, qualification of staff, incorporation of RTEAct-2009, difference in affiliation fee etc. are the main highlights of these bye laws.

As there are few special provisions given to the schools situated in NCT of Delhi in the Affiliation Byelaws for the CBSE main, similarly, for CBSE-i, the following provision have been incorporated:

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.19

To consider and approve examination bye-laws of CBSE-i

The CBSE has operationalized an alternative Curriculum or CBSE-i in a group of 23 schools initially in the session 2010-2011. This curriculum has been implemented in these schools in Middle East and South-Asia as a Pilot Project for Classes I to XII. The Board has now offered CBSE-i to 30 schools in India from 2013-14.

Highlights of the CBSE-i examination Byelaws:

The Board has completed the pilot phase successfully and in view of growing interest of the schools in CBSE-i curriculum, the Board has framed Examination Bye-laws for the CBSE-i.

Core Areas

- (a) Perspectives
- (b) SEWA (Social Empowerment through Work and Actions)
- (c) Research
- (d) Learner's Sketch : My Goal, Strengths, My Interests and Hobbies, Sports / Games, Responsibilities Discharged / Exceptional Achievements

Classes XI-XII

In class XI out of term-I, a total weightage of 5 percent will be carried forward and out of term-II a total weightage of 15 percent will be carried forward towards the result of class XII. The Board examination will be conducted out of a total of 100 marks. Out of these 100 marks, division of theory component and practical component in every subject will be decided by the subject committees. A total weightage of 80 percent out of these 100 marks will be carried forward towards the result of class XII.

Performance Analysis Test (PAT)

W. 9

CBSE-i has incorporated Performance Analysis Test aimed at measuring a student's scholastic achievement in different subjects. This Performance Analysis Test is applicable in all the main subjects such as English, Science, Mathematics and Social Science at the end of Class-X. The CBSE-i PAT is a non-qualifying test which may be used as a quality control device which must necessarily be carried out in order to make CBSE-i, achieve international standards. This test is in addition to the School Based Assessment (SBA) being conducted by the respective schools and would be compulsory for all the learners.

Apart from other regular features relaxation in attendance to students for SEWA work is also incorporated in these bye laws.

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan appreciated the inclusion of SEWA and suggested that a very limited, doable part of this may also be included in CBSE (Main). She also suggested that CBSE may start a programme similar to International Programme for Young People, which is an empowerment programme based on issues and challenges associated with Youth. Due to wider acceptability of CBSE as a premier national Board; this will benefit students as many institutions/universities may provide credit to such a certification. This will further motivate our students.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research

The Director (ATR&I) requested Ms. Kshipra Verma, Interim Director, CAER to take up the agenda for the center.

Agenda item - 4.20

To consider and approve the Item analysis and comparison of the Question Papers of two schemes i.e. Board Based and School Based Summative Assessment –II (of ten schools from each of the regional offices) held in March-2013 by the Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research (CAER)

In order to have an objective view of the quality of question papers used by the schools for their school based assessments, it is proposed that a comparative study of question papers of School Based Assessment with question papers of Board based assessment of summative assessment-II held in March-2013 may be undertaken.

Prof. Om Vikas proposed that there should be some different strata (categories) formed on the basis of average and standard deviation and Boards should be placed in their respective category after analysis. Ms Kshipra Verma, EO, informed the house that the Centre is following exactly similar process.

Joint Director, KVS, wanted to know which scheme out of the two viz, School Based Assessment and Board Based Assessment, is better for students.

Chairman CBSE clarified that options were provided to facilitate administrative feasibility as some of the boards were not willing to consider the grades awarded by schools. Both the schemes are exactly similar. In fact the certificate provided by CBSE does not mention whether a student has appeared in SBA or BBA. However people, after seeing options, tend to think if there are options let us choose the better one.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.21

To consider and approve Qualitative and Quantitative evaluation of class XII question papers in case of following subjects of English, Math, Economics, History and Physics

The board has been making efforts to improve upon the quality of the question papers to make assessments more reliable, valid, objective, comprehensive, discriminating and practical. The error of assessments needs to be studied in a scientific manner to ensure the error free assessments in future. It is evident from analysis of most of the assessments that the scale of measurement in an assessment varies and assessments often tend to differentiate in a better manner between the students at best and moderate level however when high and low level students need comparison, most of the assessments do so in an inferior manner. The Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research proposes to do a study to analyze question papers of class XII of English, Math, Economics, History and Physics on Qualitative as well as Quantitative basis.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.22

To consider and approve analysis of CTET examination paper with respect to performance of candidates

The Board is going to conduct Central Teachers Eligibility Test for the fifth time in July 2013. The quality of the question papers of CTET has wider implications as this test and tests like this conducted by various state governments are the only quality control measure for the elementary education in the country. As the country is nearing to almost cent percent enrollment in elementary education, the quality of education that is being delivered in our schools assumes paramount significance. Many things could be done to improve upon the quality of education, however as Board is associated with CTET, which is also an important tool for ensuring quality teachers, it becomes imperative to analyze of the question papers for this test. The feedback obtained can be used to further improve the quality of question papers for selecting the more appropriate teachers for the task. The Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research proposes to do a study to analyze the question papers of this test so as enable the Board to prepare more reliable, objective and valid question papers for the future such tests.

The Director (ATR&I) explained that the software being used to carry out an item analysis of each question. This would help in providing feedback to paper setters for the next time.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.23

To consider and approve Qualitative analysis of question papers of 25 state boards

Responding to the current global economic changes which are necessitating higher levels of educational attainment, the government of India started schemes to increase the access and improve the quality of education throughout the country. The growth of education in the school sector during the last decade has been unprecedented. The important challenge before the country is to make the quality of the educational attainments comparable across the country. In order to achieve this target, comparative studies of the tools of assessments used across the country and data and insights drawn from the practices and situation in all the states are indispensable. Many important educational questions can be best examined from a comparative perspective. For example, in the state of UP there is no school based assessment in place at the secondary level. This requires the comparison of the quality of assessments and of the results as well to measure advantages and disadvantages of both the systems. The Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research proposes to do a study on qualitative analysis of question papers of 25 state boards.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Additional Agenda Item - I

Proposal to make one /two vocational courses mandatory for Senior Secondary level

A recent report by McKinsey pointed towards an existing gap in skill training provided by educational institutes. At educational level, there is dis-connect between the education imparted and the skill-sets that employers look for. Linkages between academia and industry are critical through innovative measures such as internships, sabbaticals from academia to industry and vice versa, joint research, joint development of curriculum, etc. These bridges would enable a smooth transition of students equipped with the requisite skills into meaningful, sustainable jobs. NSDC has carried out Skill Gap study in different states of the country and it was found that different states have different job market and skill requirement. The studies for state of Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Sikkim have been quoted below to highlight the skill gap present in the states.

S 	States	Priority Sector(For period 2012-22)
1.	Madhya Pradesh	Construction, Mining, Textiles and Apparel, Power, Healthcare, Education and Agri-allied industries such as Dairy, Poultry Farming and Horticulture,
2.	Rajasthan	handloom and handicrafts, gems and jewelry, construction, and stone polishing/workers
3.	Sikkim	Hospitality and tourism and agriculture(Growing different types of fruits, vegetables, spices and exotic flowers)

To meet the skill gap in the country and to increase employment potential of the population it is imperative to make at least one or two vocational courses as mandatory in the schools. Accordingly, Schools are free to choose any one/two courses out of existing 40 skill courses keeping in mind the market demand and industry potential of that specific area.

Chairman CBSE was of the opinion that out of 1000 hours in school, there could be some, say 100 hours, which must be devoted compulsorily to a vocational course. The syllabi of XI and XII have become heavy and voluminous due to downward extension of knowledge. The selective portions which are required to be studied in higher education may be deleted to make space for a hundred hour course based on generic vocational skills. This will develop a sense of respect towards manual labour and will be a great social equalizer. This will be in the interest of the country. Chairman wanted to know whether the idea is worthwhile or not. He asked the house if this can be approved in principle.

The opinion of the house on this agenda was divided as most of the members were of the view that it should not be made compulsory. However the house appreciated the intent of this agenda.

Mr L. V Sehgal cited constraints in the way of making it compulsory such as non-willingness of parents, students, non-availability of teachers, financial burden on schools, and availability of many trades.

Chairman CBSE told the house the CBSE is doing vocational education since 1986 and government expects that at least 25% of students must come out of class XII with vocational subjects. Making it compulsory encourage more schools to offer full-fledged vocational courses. Idea behind this move is to prepare child to appreciate the nature of different but essential vocational trades in society and to appreciate people associated with them.

Prof C K Saluja shared with the house that there are serious inconsistencies in National Curriculum Framework-2005 and Right to Education Act-2009. He stated that though the provision of Play for Children in NCF-2005 is compulsory; RTE Act-2009, on the contrary, does not pay much attention to the need of a permanent Physical Education and sports teacher and stipulate that there could be a part-time teacher for this activity. He drew the attention of the house to the proportionate number of teachers per students as laid down in the Act and said that it is incompatible with actual situation in schools as there are problems of discipline, counseling etc. and this require more teachers.

Professor Saluja went on to state that this is perhaps the high time to revise NCF as the educational scenario has been completely changed specially after the implementation of Reforms by many Boards. He said that NCF-2005, at the best, can be described as a sort of compendium of the modern theories and principles of education. It does not provide a pragmatic operational procedure for implementing it. It does not provide any concrete way how to organize curriculum in schools rather focus on criticizing the practices prevalent before 2005.

Professor Saluja concluded that we need to concretize the reforms in terms of their actual implementation in all the schools specially the government schools. He was of the opinion that the situation in schools presently is not conducive for making a vocational subject compulsory.

Dr. S.K. Yadav, School of Agriculture, IGNOU, emphasized the need of revival of the academic elective Agriculture and making it popular among students.

Chairman, CBSE informed the house that the CBSE has signed an MoU with Indian Council of Agricultural Research in this regard. The Council will help CBSE in arresting the declining trend in this subject.

Professor Om Vikas suggested that CBSE may rename this compulsory vocational subject as there is a social stigma attached with Vocational Education. People think Vocational Education is meant for those students who are not able to do well in academic subjects. The application based generic compulsory vocational component of 100 hours may be called Practice Course or some other suitable name. He was in favour of this compulsory vocational component for all schools.

Professor Kapil Kapoor was not in favour of making this vocational component compulsory.

Professor Neelima Gupta said that industry does not need separate vocational course rather it prefers academic subjects which are skill based. This is a good idea but we need to integrate vocational subjects with academic subjects.

Chairman, CBSE assured that modalities and operational feasibility may be worked on and CBSE would like to present it before the esteemed house after reworking it.

Proposal is deferred by the Curriculum Committee.

Additional Agenda Item - II

Inclusion of engineering based vocational courses in JEE examination.

The Board is currently offering eight engineering based courses at Sr. Secondary Level namely:-

- 1. Electrical Technology
- 2. Automobile Technology
- 3. Civil Engineering Technology
- 4. Air Conditioning and Refrigeration Technology
- 5. Electronics Technology
- 6. Geospatial Technology
- 7. Foundry Technology
- 8. IT Application

In this connection it is to record here that AICTE in its approval process Handbook of Engineering College has already considered the 10+2 pass outs with technical vocational subjects eligible for direct admission 1st Yr. engineering course at par with PCM. In the instance case, Physics, Mathematics and technical vocational subject are considered eligible.

It was understood from the guidelines of JEE (Mains) 2013, that only 10+2 pass outs with PCM are considered eligible for appearing the entrance test.

To encourage the students of Engineering based courses stream, it would be better if such category of students with Physics and Mathematics are considered eligible for JEE (Mains). In such situation JEE (Mains) may like to include an extra paper on General Engineering instead of Chemistry. Proposal may be considered for JEE (Main) -2014.

Proposal is deferred by the Curriculum Committee.

At the outset, Director (Vocational & Edusat) welcomed all the Members to the meeting and requested Members to introduced themselves. After the introduction, Director (Vocational & Edusat) outlined major activities and initiatives taken by the Board regarding the promotion of Vocational Education.

Agenda Item: 1

To consider and approve Skill Certification for the drop outs/10+2 pass out students

The vocationalisation of Secondary and Higher secondary programme aims to develop skilled manpower through diversified courses to meet the requirements of various sectors and to prepare people for the world of work in general through a large number of self-employment oriented courses. To cater the gap of skilled manpower the Board has devised an educational programme through which we can impart our current and future generations' necessary skills. The Board has integrated academic and vocational education into a single programme to provide the best curricular and pedagogical practices for students that have perfect linkages between study with world of work. The Board may offer the skill certification through following schemes:

- a) School may offer only Vocational courses(L1 to 4) or vocational courses together with academic courses in 2nd Shift, for the dropouts and Skill programme may also offered to 10+2 pass-out students, who are interested to acquire skills. Besides schools, infrastructure of SKP or other professional agencies may be utilized to provide suchqualification. To ensure quality, initially the Board will empanel only 5-10 organizations to offer such courses in 3-5 states and in the pilot phase.
- b) Skill courses may be offered in distance and online mode to the students of CBSE and other Boards, who wish to take Vocational courses along with their regular academic subjects in their schools. They may study self-learning module to be provided by the Board and for the practical skill training, Students should attend classes in designated schools (who wished to provide training) on Saturdays and Sundays. The model will be based on IGNOU distance learning framework.

All members agreed that vocational education for drop outs/ school levers should be introduced and also an age limit should be decided, the programme may be carried out in partnership with other institutes/organizations, which are currently carrying out such programmes.

Mr. N.S Bhui (NCHMCT) and Mr. G.C. Sharma (NSE) agreed to extend the required support needed to run these types of programme as they have already developed such programmes for related industry. But all the members emphasized that all the courses offered for school learners should have a definitive learning outcome and should be job oriented.

Dr. C. G. Naidu, Director, Vocational Education, said that the need analysis should be carried out and also the schools should be evaluated for infrastructure and facilities, to see if they are well equipped to impart education in such a mode. Also, Dr. Mehrotra suggested that the Board could study the model for NGO called Lending a hand to India that is involved in conducting skill based programmes for the drop outs/ school learners.

Also, it was informed by Mr. Rajendra Kumar, Director AICTE that AICTE has mapped the Modular Employability Skills with NVEQF and also will form regulatory framework for imparting distance and online education, which can be adapted the Board in due course of time.

Chairman, CBSE also informed the house that activities under the consideration will be implemented on pilot basis in few schools.

Also online mode will be first taken on a pilot basis as approved by the Finance and Affiliation Committee of the Board earlier.

The Vocational Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item 2:

To consider and approve the development of modules for providing skill education training in online/ distance mode.

The use of e-learning in the new models can lead to improvements in education and training through bridging theory and practice. However, this is achieved in different ways, depending on the particular VET as this model meets different needs and emphasizes different aspects of teaching and learning. In this relation, it is also stressed that in practice aspects from different models can influence learning and teaching.

The integration of e-learning to facilitate problem based learning in vocational education will give students some sort of support to comfortably take part into learning activities, gives them an opportunity to work independently and developed new ideas on the problem at hand. Strategies for the effective integration of e-learning in problem based learning for Vocational Education are as follows:-

- The use of online assignment tool;
- (2) The use of both synchronous communication tools (such as chatting) and asynchronous communications tools (such as forum and journal);
- (3) lecturer-initiated communication for the PBL case on the e-learning platform,
- (4) Frequent availability of lecturers online for facilitation, and
- (5) The use of online journal for reflection and assessment.

The Board may invite a RFP from various digital learning companies or learning management system companies to support this activity.

Dr. Om Vikas, Ex Director, IIIT, Gwalior suggested that the concept of innovation assessment should be introduced to further motivate the teacher and students.

Ms. Bani Jha, Dean, NIFT, highlighted that all the skills component cannot be taught through online medium or ICT and also, the instruction model and learning material should designed in collaboration with industry so that it can address the current jobs requirement based on industry requirements.

Dr. C.G. Naidu, Director, Vocational Education, IGNOU elaborated that some basic skills can be imparted through animation and simulation. And also, it should be noted and kept in consideration that an elearning management is cost intensive and requires adequate bands width.

Dr. R.C. Gaur suggested that we should keep the learning management system as an open access system for providing maximum benefit to the students

The members of the house agreed that the online education mode should be introduced along with the providing hands on skill in a traditional class room.

The Vocational Curriculum Committee granted the approval for the same.

Agenda Item 3:

To consider and approve the proposal of making one /two vocational courses mandatory for Senior Secondary level

A recent report by McKinsey pointed towards an existing gap in skill training provided by educational institutes. At educational level, there is a disconnect between the education imparted and the skill-sets that employers look for. Linkages between academia and industry are critical through innovative measures such as internships, sabbaticals from academia to industry and vice versa, joint research, joint development of curriculum, etc. These bridges would enable a smooth transition of students equipped with the requisite skills into meaningful, sustainable jobs. NSDC has carried out Skill Gap study in different states of the country and it was found that different states have different job market and skill requirement. The studies for state of Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Sikkim have been quoted below to highlight the skill gap present in the states.

S. No	States	Priority Sector(For period 2012-22)
1.	Madhya Pradesh	Construction, Mining, Textiles and Apparel, Power, Healthcare, Education and Agri-allied industries such as Dairy, Poultry Farming and Horticulture,
2.	Rajasthan	handloom and handicrafts, gems and jewelry, construction, and stone polishing/workers
3.	Sikkim	Hospitality and tourism and agriculture(Growing different types of fruits, vegetables, spices and exotic flowers)

To meet the skill gap in the country and to increase employment potential of the population it is imperative to make at least one or two vocational courses as mandatory in the schools. Accordingly, Schools are free to choose any one/two courses out of existing 40 skill courses keeping in mind the market demand and industry potential of that specific area.

Most of the meeting members agreed that at least one vocational subject should be made mandatory inclusive of academic subjects.

Director, Vocational Education, CBSE further explained that there can be an option that they can provide the specific oriented state issues or can make it mandatory for overall curriculum.

Shri Sunil Kr. Bedi, Subject Expert, Education Department, Chandigarh informed the house that schools can float tenders for companies to provide skilled education for specific time slot (60 days) with assured placement to the students by the companies itself, as done in Chandigarh. The expenses of conducting training would be handled by the school on an agreement that the companies will create job opportunity for students depending upon their skilled assessment management.

Ms. Sangeeta Jain, Sr. Lecturer, Meera Bai Polytechnic, New Delhi suggested that the Lateral entry scheme as followed in various engineering based courses must be promoted by school in other vocational and skill based courses. This will further motivate the students to pursue vocational education on higher level.

Mr. G.C. Sharma, Head Education Initiatives, NSE suggested that Board can implement one course as mandatory for 3-4 yrs and subsequently, more than one course can be made mandatory.

Dr. C. G. Naidu suggested that to promote the vocational courses awareness program for various stakeholders may be conducted and Board may explore the scope of the education after completing Vocational course to create a positive outlook towards Vocational Education.

The Vocational Curriculum Committee approved that one vocational Committee can be made compulsory at classes XI level.

Agenda Item 4:

To consider and approve the Research and development on vocational pedagogy and development of relevant curriculum

The Board can oversee changes in course and curriculum structure; introduce short term courses to train unskilled manpower into semi-skilled / skilled manpower, assist in establishing "Centers for Skill Development" and trainers around various cities/ towns depending on manpower requirements in the areas and co-ordinate with other government agencies and institutions to implement changes.

The Vocational Education Cell may carry out the following activities:

- 1. Conduct Research: to prepare relevant curriculum and meet the industry demands. The research should be done to:
 - a. Develop database for skills
 - b. Identifying the popular skills
 - c. Developing the suitable curriculum
 - d. Research and Identify pedagogical methods ideal for imparting vocational courses
 - e. Develop & update existing course modules

The Vocational Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item 5:

To consider and approve the Signing of Memorandum of Understanding between CBSE and ICAR, New Delhi for offering Agriculture based courses in the affiliated schools of CBSE.

CBSE, Delhi has requested the ICAR to collaborate in offering Agriculture based courses in the affiliated schools wherein ICAR will design and develop the curriculum for the said courses and also provide teachers training.

Considering the huge requirement of Agriculture related manpower the Board has convened five meetings with the Professional/ Scientists and representative of ICAR. The merit of the proposals has been duly agreed by the experts and accordingly detail curriculum for three agriculture based courses has been prepared along with its content.

A strategy for Joint Certifications with the ICAR will be framed.

Final Memorandum of Understanding, (MOU) between CBSE and ICAR was placed.

The Vocational curriculum committee granted approval for the same.

AGENDA Item 6:-

To consider and approve the proposal for constituting Sectorial Committee for Vocational courses.

For proper operationalization and monitoring the implementation of vocational courses through affiliated schools specially for inter-alia laying down broad policy guidelines for the revamped vocational education, reviewing progress of programme at various level, cross sectorial work and industry participation etc. It is proposed to constitute six Sectorial Committee for vocational courses.

Chairman, CBSE further elaborated that the Sector Skills Councils, University Professors and research institutions and organizations will be an integral part of these committees.

The curriculum committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item: 7:

To consider and approve for printing of Curriculum Document for Secondary and Senior Secondary School for the year 2015 and printing of Books for various vocational courses

Curriculum for various vocational courses offered at secondary and senior secondary level has been revised/ developed by involving experts from industry and academic institutions for the academic year 2015, the same needs to be printed for the reference purposes of schools and teachers. Similarly, books for imparting the curriculum are being developed and are under constant development and improvisation. Currently, books for the following courses for classes XI and XII are print ready:

- Civil Engineering
- Health and Beauty Studies
- Medical Diagnostics
- Fashion Design and Garment Technology
- Textile Design
- Transportation System & Logistic Management
- Library Science
- Horticulture
- Dairy Science and Technology
- Bakery & Confectionary
- Travel & Tourism
- Front Office Operation

Therefore, to pay the honorarium to various experts (@ Rs. 55,000/- per book) and amount Rs. 40 lakh may be approved. Additionally, to meet the printing cost of at least 1000 copies per book an additional amount of Rs. 30 lakh may be approved.

The Vocational Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item 8:

Global Conference on "Skilling in Schools" in collaboration with PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry

As the Board is offering 40 Vocational Courses in different sectors at Senior Secondary Level and 4 vocational courses at secondary level; many of these courses are offered in collaboration with the professional organizations to create skilled manpower for the industry, in order to upgrade the skills and proficiency of the younger generation and also to provide knowledge and awareness about various career options Board has collaborated with PHDCCI to conduct workshops and awareness programmes. One such workshop was conducted by PHDCCI at Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh on 6th May 2013, for which entire cost was borne by PHDCCI. Also, Board and PHDCCI will conduct such awareness programmes for Parents and other stakeholder at regional level in various parts of India in future. One such awareness programme namely **One day global Conference on Skilling Schools** will be conducted by **CBSE** in collaboration with **PHD Chamber on 18th July, 2013 in Delhi at PHD House, 4/2 Siri Institutional Area to create awareness and understand the perspective from both the supply and demand side and come out with practical solutions.**

Objectives of the Conference:

- Career guidance and definition for students who have an aptitude for Vocational Education
- Stress on the procurement of proper staff for imparting Vocational Education in schools.
- Schools' perspective on Vocational Education and their inputs would be taken.
- Understand the International system of Vocational Education in Schools and the feasibility of applying the same in market
- Understand the Industry perspective

To organize this workshop an expenditure of Rs. 4 lakh may incur which will be on sharing basis with PHDCCI (where half will be shared by PHDCCI and other half will be borned by the Board). Therefore, to successfully conduct this programme, an amount of Rs. 2 lakh may be sanctioned for payment to PHDCCI, subject to approval of Finance Committee

The Vocational Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item 9:

To consider and approve Implementation of German Model (DUAL SYSTEM) of Vocational Education on pilot basis in schools of Delhi-NCR, Chennai and 5 schools in Bangalore.

To meet the skill gap faced by the industry and to further popularize vocational education among the school students, the Board is exploring various models/best practices of certification on vocational education of other country, which can be implemented here on pilot basis.

One such model under consideration for introduction at school levels is the German model of Vocational Education, which is a dual system of education.

The German vocational training system, with its combination of classroom and business, theory and practice, learning and working, is recognized worldwide as a basic and highly effective model for vocational training. The essential characteristic of the dual system is the cooperation between largely private companies, on the one hand, and public vocational schools, on the other. This cooperation is regulated by law. The term "dual" also denotes a specific constitutional situation in Germany, where the federal government is responsible for vocational training in the companies, and the federal states for the vocational schools. Thus, the German dual system of vocational training combines theory and practice, knowledge and skills, learning and working in a efficient manner.

The Board may introduce such a dual system on pilot basis in 20 schools, 10 each from Delhi-NCR and Chennai. To implement this dual system at school level, the Board will develop curriculum and quality content for at least two Technology based subjects in collaboration with two German Organisation namely Goethe Institute and I-Move.

German Industries present in India will also support this programme. An amount of Rs. 18.00 lakh may be required for the development of curriculum and content. In addition, Board will organize Teachers Training by involving experts from Germany organizations/ institutions.

Dr. Om Vikas, suggested that CBSE should set up few model schools on pilot basis and should seek financial support from MHRD.

The VocationalCurriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item 10:

To consider and approve the proposal to Increase remuneration/ honorarium for authors and acquiring ISBN for every publication of Vocational Cell, CBSE.

To develop quality learning materials for students and teachers for various vocational courses; the Board takes the assistance from researchers, academicians and industry experts. Time and again various experts have raised the issue that current honorarium (Rs. 55,000/- per book, in which 15,000/- is given to convener and 10,000/- per author for maximum of 4 authors) is not at par with current industry standards and it does not justify the time and effort required for quality content writing.

Therefore, it is proposed to raise the honorarium for convener from Rs.15,000/ to Rs.25,000/- and author ship honorarium may be raised from Rs.10,000/- to Rs.20,000/-. As per the suggested changes the total honorarium for preparing one book will cost (One Lakh five thousand).

To attract good authors, It is also proposed to have ISBN for every publication (specially students Handbook and Teachers Manual) of Vocational Education Cell.

The Chairman CBSE, informed the house that it is subject to approval from the finance committee.

The VocationalCurriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

AGENDA ITEM: 11

To confirm the winner of logo competition

Logo competition was envisaged to provide Vocational Education Cell with a unique identity. The competition was started in February 2013 and was closed on 5th May 2013. The shortlisting committee meeting was convened on 15th and 16th May 2013. The winning entry was shortlisted on the basis of theme, colour, print worthiness, aesthetics and design. Accordingly,Ms.ShrutiGarg, Student of class IX from Rukmani Devi Public School, Delhi was selected as winner of logo competition and she may be awarded with cash prized of Rs.25,000 and a letter of commendation from the Hon. Chairman. It is also proposed to use the logo in all publication of vocational cell.

The Vocational curriculum committee granted approval for the same.

AGENDA ITEM: 12

To consider and approve the inclusion of engineering based vocational courses in JEE examination.

The Board is currently offering eight engineering based courses at Sr. Secondary Level namely:-

- 9. Electrical Technology
- 10. Automobile Technology
- 11. Civil Engineering Technology
- 12. Air Conditioning and Refrigeration Technology
- 13. Electronics Technology
- 14. Geospatial Technology
- 15. Foundry Technology
- 16. IT Application

In this connection it is to record here that AICTE in its approval process Handbook of Engineering College has already considered the 10+2 pass outs with technical vocational subjects eligible for direct admission 1st Yr. engineering course at par with PCM. In the instance case, Physics, Mathematics and technical vocational subject are considered eligible.

It was understood from the guidelines of JEE (Mains) 2013, that only 10+2 pass outs with PCM are considered eligible for appearing the entrance test.

To encourage the students of Engineering based courses, it would be better if such category of students with Physics and Mathematics are considered eligible for JEE (Mains). In such situation JEE (Mains) may like to include an extra paper on General Engineering instead of Chemistry. Proposal may be considered for JEE (Main) -2014.

Chairman, CBSE, informed the house that the same can be included in the JEE (Main) exam and Board can include vocational subjects in JEE eligibility as per AICTE guidelines. For inclusion of other subjects for testing on JEE (Main)a further larger deliberation is required.

The Vocational curriculum committee recommended the same.

AGENDA ITEM: 13

To consider and approve the proposal for enabling virtual classroom and multiparty web-conferencing across offices of CBSE.

To address the myriad challenges facing our education system, particularly in rural areas, modern IT & Communication technology offers a viable option. Apart from the very real "hard" infrastructure related issues such as proper school buildings, power, lighting, clean drinking water, toilets etc., there is also a sizeable challenge in delivering the "soft" and possible the most critical component of a school- i.e. "quality teachers" in adequate numbers. These teachers need to be well versed with the subjects and the quality teaching concepts to be able to ignite the students, particularly from rural areas-so that the process of nation building can begin from the grassroots and can be broad based.

In this regard the Board is planning to create multi-party web-conferencing system between its all Regional Offices with the support of CISCO to cater the dual needs:-

- i) Virtual classrooms solutions and
- ii) Interactive web based conferencing between the official and stake holder of CBSE to conduct Administrative review, meetings and broad cast.

To install such systems in eight Regional offices including Head Quarter an amount of Rs. 30.21 lakhs may be required, in addition a charge of 11.5 lakhs per year may be required for meeting the recurring expenditure.

The benefit of this deployment are to a) overcome the shortage of quality trainers/ experts, b) enable a master teacher to reach out to a large number of students across different locations, c) prevent dilution of instruction quality and d) offer a greater flexibility & choice of courses to the students.

The Chairman, CBSE, elaborated that for acquiring and developing such system Board will follow appropriate financial rules.

The Vocational Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.
