Empowering Women through Social Equity Programme at Laxman Public School, New Delhi

As a part of social responsibility and a step towards social equity, the Laxman Public school works towards the betterment of fellow human beings by conducting various programmes Under Each one teach one Programme. Class VII to XI are involved in this. Neo –literacy and post-literacy classes are held twice a week. i .e. Tuesday and Thursday from 10.00 a.m. to 11.00 a.m. Learners come from the adopted communities like Navjeevan Camp, Nehrucamp,

Delhi school Literacy Project supports out community outreach programme by providing mobile van for one learner on every Tuesday. Vocational Training is conducted for young women folk and the youth of the community in the afternoon from 3.00 p.m. thrice a week—Tuesday, Thursday and Friday in collaboration with Jan Shiksha Sansthan , Ministry of HRD. The vocational training taking place at present is given below.

- a. Stitching and tailoring for women folk
- b. Beauty culture for young girls
- c. House wiring for Boys
- d. Embroidery
- e. Computer application

Community out reach programme

- Six nodal centers started within the adopted communities.
- To continue with the adult literacy programme, the community volunteers have undergone training from state Resource Centre and working as `preraks`
- Community volunteers are constantly laisoning between the school and the community.

Legal and Medical Aid Center

- Since 2004 Legal aid center is running successfully in the communities.
- At present the school has a center at Bhoomiheen Camp and counselor and doctor render their services to the Community people.



 Free medical check-up and some common ailments medicines are also provided by this center.

Inclusive Schooling

- As a part of inclusion programme the school has 42 students in the mainstream from these adopted communities.
- Apart from free education, they are also provided with free uniforms, books, bags etc.
- Remedial teaching for English subject is provided by the school teachers voluntarily to these first generation learners.

Rs.75/- for scheduled Caste and Rs.150/- for others and get medical reimbursement up to Rs. 15,000/- for themselves and their three family members. About 150 women/ girls applied for insurance.
